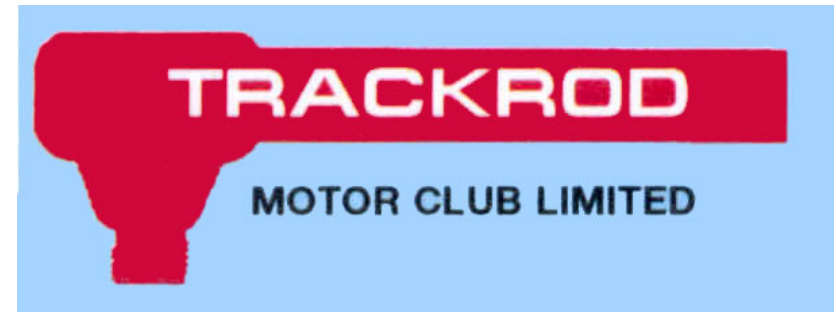

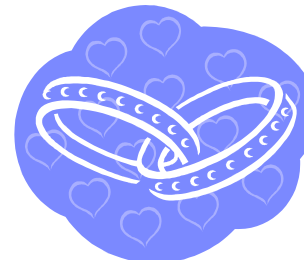
A special congrats goes out to Rob Buchan who made it up the hill the whole day without making a big boo boo like the last attempt. Well done Rob!!!

RETROSPECTIVE

30 YEARS AGO - AUGUST 1975 Photos this month depicted Beecroft / Millington on the 1975 Costa DI Plenti; winners of the event Ron Ship/ D.Davidson; Ken Goodall/Mike Tempest on the 74 Costa and the SPY44 Datsun 240Z of Richard Jackson/? On an unspecified event - it was airborne though!

Ian Gurnett was complaining that there were no club nights local to him - we're still waiting for his suggested venues!! (Seems much like 2005!). Steve Lloyd reported on what had been a hyperactive weekend for him. Preparing the Club float for the Lord Mayor of Leeds's parade on Saturday morning/afternoon THEN dashing off to compete on the Costa Rally, THEN clearing up afterwards, THEN bringing the caravan home!! Such industry! Ron Mackinnon/Lindsay Sutton (later to become Mackinnon) organised a club night autotest at Tockwith. UK suspends speed camera deployment

There will be no new speed cameras deployed in the UK for several months pending a report into their effectiveness, the Department for Transport (DfT) has announced. The University College London probe is not expected to be completed until the end of the year, and all applications for new cameras are duly suspended.

A DfT spokeswoman told AP: "Every year, those in the camera partnership scheme submit applications to us for new camera sites. This year we are waiting for this independent review to be completed before approving any new sites. The review has been delayed.

"There should have been a report out in June, but it's taking longer than expected. We are not blocking the use of new cameras. It's important that we get everything right in relation to the whole issue of cameras," she concluded.
