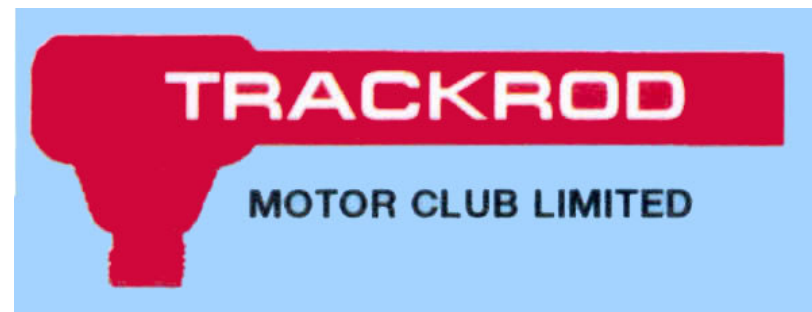

News from the Trackrod Rally Yorkshire '09

Press release date: Friday 15 May 2009

2009 Trackrod Rally Yorkshire is unveiled

"Something for everyone" is the strap-line for the 2009 Trackrod Rally Yorkshire, which will be a round of no less than 15 championships when it runs in the Yorkshire forests on Saturday 26 September.

In taking the wraps off Trackrod Motor Club's 2009 event, clerk of the course Rod Parkin revealed a range of events within the overall rally to cater for all needs and tastes, ranging from the crews contesting the final round of the MSA British Rally Championship to clubman competitors in rounds of four regional stage rally championships.

"We are delighted to have such a great line-up of championships coming to Yorkshire," said Parkin, who has been chairman of the organising committee since the first running of the event, which was known as the Crest Stages when it was first run in 1977.

As well as the final round of the BRC, the rally will also form the final round of the Pirelli MSA Gravel Championship and the final round of the Dunlop/Gambia MSA British Historic Rally Championship. The range of individual events will range from 45-stage mile rallies for the historic and clubmans contenders, to over 90 miles of action for the BRC competitors.

All of the competitive action will be on Saturday, after scrutineering and documentation on Friday 25 September. As before, the event will be based at the Pickering Showground, which will also be the venue for a spectator stage and central servicing during the rally.

e-Wheels April 2009 included a reminder to all concerned about the Code of Conduct which the MSA has brought out. One or two clubs used the opportunity to remind their members through their own magazines that everyone involved in the sport acts as an ambassador for the sport in whatever they do – not just on-track or off-road activity.

This is particularly true of clubs who have a clubhouse or regularly use the same premises (often in residential areas) for meetings – for whom the importance of being accepted by their local community is of prime importance.

Of course, this also extends to club events, where proper driving manners and behaviour when using local roads helps to give a positive public image of responsible motor sport.

Extract from MSA SCRUTINEERS E-BULLETIN #42

Cross Country Fire Extinguishers

We have had a lot of queries in the last couple of weeks regarding fire extinguishers for Cross Country vehicles, and in particular 2009 MSA Competitors' and Officials' Yearbook regulation F 301. To clarify, where the regulation states, "not plumbed in", this indicates that a 1.75-litre hand-held fire extinguisher is acceptable. This interpretation is helped by looking back to the 2007 yearbook, which is a little bit clearer, and to our awareness there has not been a regulation change in the meantime that would require anything more than this.

e-Wheels May 2009

The three central considerations will be:

- The MSA's governance and regulation of karting – to create a more timely and efficient system of governance for the sport
- The structure and quantity of karting championships and defined classes, with a view to introducing a clear structure of progression from entry at club level through to CIK level
- The cost of karting at entry level and proposals to reduce the cost of competition in order to bring more people into the sport.

"For a number of reasons, it is clear that we have not got very far in trying to restructure karting from within," said Colin Hilton, MSA Chief Executive, "so we have gone outside the existing system to get an objective view of the way forward. George Robinson is hugely experienced and highly respected and he was the logical choice to undertake this review. It is vital to the future of the sport that we get this right, so we will take our time to address all the issues and will not be implementing anything before 2012 at the earliest."

Robinson brings a wealth of experience to the project, having been involved in karting for 40 years as a competitor, circuit operator, driver trainer and engine builder. He runs a successful engineering company.

"It is a fairly sweeping statement to talk about the restructure of karting but it's vital for the future health and well being of the sport," Robinson confirmed. "I am delighted that the MSA has asked me to lead this project but it will not be a solo task. I will draw on the valuable knowledge and intellect of many people in the sport and I very much hope that they will support me in this important role."

Apprenticeships – more

As mentioned in e-Wheels April 2009, the MSA Advanced Apprenticeship in Sporting Excellence (AASE) was launched recently to identify the first intake of 50 drivers and co-drivers aged between 16 and 24 years who have demonstrated the potential to progress to the Elite level of the sport. Applications are still invited.

The AASE in Motor Sport is funded by the Learning and Skills Council and similar programmes are well established in many other sports.

RETROSPECTIVE

30 YEARS AGO - JUNE 1979 - Results of the indoor rally championship were announced and Ronnie Moore/Derek Lee were 1st with Brian Wainwright/Neil Masterman 2nd: and M. Robson/G. Turner 3rd.

Vince Fletcher reported on the recent Barratt Oak Rally of Otley M.C. Winners were Ron Beecroft/John Millington ahead of Charlie Payne/Jeff Dealtry. Alan Larkin/Graham Whittaker were 2nd semi-experts and 15th o/a. 3rd semis were John Brogden/Ronnie Moore at 17th o/a. John Bean was looking for a capable navigator and an LSD for his Mexico. Shell League Round 3 was reported by Ronnie Moore - A PCT by Sheffield & Hallamshire M.C. Alas only 3 trackrod entries, each turning in only average results - TMC could and should do better!! Sadly it didn't get better!! The Alwoodley Ridings Rally saw 7 crews out and all contrived to worsen our League position!! Results reflected tight timing and some dubious control locations and our best were M. Kent/D. Carnforth at 10th o/a. Gez Waters/Vince Fletcher were 25th o/a; Ray and Alan Sutcliffe 27th; Tom Whitaker/ Peter Crouch (obviously disillusioned and took up football!!!)30th. Jake Tate/Jeff Dealtry and Richard Jackson/Tony Ginn both had to retire.

20 YEARS AGO - JUNE 1989 - John Renny gave us the first instalment of his epic trip to compete on the 100 Lakes with John Millington along with a motley crew of TMC supporters/service crew/and general dogsbodies - 13 in total . John gave a brief insight into the planning that such an undertaking involves for the private entry e.g. borrowing a trailer and a van ; prepping the Escort and the van !!; and chasing whatever sponsorship they could get. Finally (does this man ever stop writing!!), a piece on the latest Ford rally car, the Focus and how it reminded him of the Blue Oval's rallying heritage. He used to compete in his venerable Anglia to good effect (yes some of us still remember it!!). Earlier than that he had competed in his dad's Zephyr - no spot lights; map light etc - it even sported hubcaps, but it was ok for what turned out to be a cruise round the south Cotswolds!! All good stuff of which we could do with more!!
