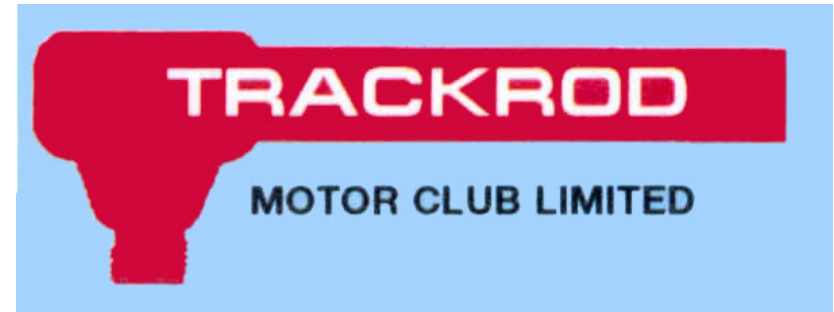

ALL claims to be made within 1 month from the date of the event and must include a copy of entry list and final results sheet.

The Day Leg Tests will be on airfields, farm tracks and other areas of private land. These will be a mixture of tarmac and gravel surfaces. The road sections will be untimed and the route will be in the form of a tulip road book. The Night Leg will start after the evening rest halt.

In keeping with the title of the event it will be based this year in York at Askham Bryan Agricultural College on the outskirts of the city adjacent to the A64.

RETROSPECTIVE

30 YEARS AGO - SEPTEMBER 1979 - Our 107th issue. Vince Fletcher reported on the Calderford Trophy Rally which he did alongside Gez Waters. Crews started from Garforth and meandered around the Wolds; Sutton Bank; Rievaulx; Caydale etc with a brief petrol halt before the final 7 time controls. These proved to be a bit of a road race to the finish at Barton Hall where Beecroft/Millington were declared winners from Birkett/Fellows with our own Mick Watkin/Nick Leuchars in a very creditable 4th. Steve Wood/Bob Spensley were 2nd in class and out of the 50 finishers, Gez and Vince were a resounding 50th!!

12 crews tackled the 3rd round of the Hunters Trophy treasure hunt and with only 1 round left it was very close with only 2 points separating the 1st two teams.

20 YEARS AGO - SEPTEMBER 1989 - The 1st issue from Becky Kemp/Susanne Stanhope, and an excellent effort it was too!

Thanks were preferred to Richard Simpson who stood down as Chairman after 2 years and was replaced by Peter Stanhope who, via the Chairman's Chat column kept us up to speed with the broader issues, including a bit of his personal background for the benefit of those who hadn't a clue who he was!!! Vince Fletcher reported on the Three Swans Rally which he did with Tom Whittaker, the only other TMC crew being Alan Powell/Andrew Hobman. Bit of a less than spectacular event what with delays, cancellations and mediocre stages around Driffield.

Tom's car was suffering from a lack of top end grunt on the long straights but managed a 14th o/a and 2nd in class whilst Alan/Andrew did a good bit better and finished 5th o/a and 2nd in class - all very good for Shell League points.

10 YEARS AGO - SEPTEMBER 1999 - Jim Plevy told us about his outing on the Armstrong Massey Tour in the Escort of Craig Dykes, from whose premises the event started. MSA Academy launched

The MSA has created the MSA Academy – a new structure for the MSA’s investment in the training and development of young drivers – and a new TEAM UK identity which will encompass the country’s best up and coming motor sport talent.

The MSA Academy creates a development pathway which will take competitors from the entry level at just eight years of age, through to Elite and post-Elite levels, with a view to the most promising emerging onto the world stage.

The academy is the brainchild of MSA Performance Director, Robert Reid. The 2001 WRC champion has been working with the MSA for the past four years and is delighted that a recognisable structure has now emerged.

Until the age of 16, all British children must legally remain within the education system, so the academy will ensure that young competitors are supported and encouraged in their mainstream studies. With some 1,600 licence holders under 16 years of age in the UK, the MSA takes its responsibilities to these children and their education extremely seriously.

The MSA is considering the introduction of new regulations to ensure that competitors are fully engaged with their schools and to encourage organisers to provide study facilities for their competitors. It is anticipated that ultimately all drivers under 16 wishing to enter any of the UK’s national championships will be required to enter into a signed ‘contract’ with their school to keep up to date with their work. The message is simple: no education, no racing.

The MSA has looked carefully at the examples of other sports and has recognised the need to identify the best British talent as a team of individuals under a collective banner. Consequently, members of the MSA Academy at Elite and post-Elite levels will become known as TEAM UK and will be able to carry this designation to identify them as the best emerging talent in British motor sport.

The final element in the MSA Academy will be the creation of a recognised coaching structure within UK motor sport, although this may take a little longer to deliver.
