ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Over sixty members attended this, our fifth A.G.M. thich proved to be a quiet, by previous years affairs, but constructive evening, after the minutes from the previous meeting had been circulated and approved, the retireing treasurer, Richard Ashcroft, gave his report. A balance sheet for the period 22.8.73. to 28.8.74. was circulated, but as this balance sheet did not take into account the Club's premier event, the Costa di Plenti, the report was taken as a statement only, and a new, full balance sheet will be printed when the Rally's accounts have been finalized. It is unlikely that the club will be able to recover the £30.32 from K.B. Marr, although efforts are being made to this effect by the R.A.C.

Part two of the report dealt with the Membership Fees. It was recommended that with the caravan almost falling apart in front of our eyer, that membership be increased to £2.00 per annum, 50p of which to go into a caravan fund to enable us to replace the caravan in the near future. This resolution was voted on and passed, to take effect from January 1st 1974.

The Chairmans report followed. Richard gave an interesting, end at times amusing summing up of the years activities, once again relating the story on last years' Tour of Mull, when although the 'milk waggon' may roll, he still arrived with the milk!

It was resolved that if a venue had to be changed at the last moment, a notice or similar would be left at the original venue to tell members where to go.

Ther being no other business the meeting closed at approx. 10.15, and with time for a last pint, the very constructive evening came to a close.

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COST, Di PLENTI RALLY

The first Trackrod Closed Joint Hally was successfully organised on the 25/26th august. The start being on Full sutton Airfield at 11.01. Scrutingering was the most efficient that I have seen for some time, and consequently came across a few problems. One competitor was turned away with an out of date excise license, three weeks out to be precise. One well known member of our club spent quite some time trying to bolt back the driving seat when it came adrift during checking! Scrutingering certainly earned its keep that night.

The first of 79 starters away, and the first retirement was Cleary/Stern, who couldn't find the exit off the airfield and subsequently retired. The route began with a series of time controls through Flaxton and Stillington where all the crews lost time at TO3. The route then headed North to Brandsby via the whites of Crayke Lodge and Holly Hill. The left 30 at Bogg Hell caught out the Escort Tank of Lawton and Gill, which, although built like a tank, did not have the necessary 'Tracks' to extracate them

from the shrubbery for some considerable time.

The next section was a neutral through Yearsley to selective 1 over Yearsley Moor. Jones/Roebuck were fastest on 25 with the next four crows within 8 secs behind. Selective 2 used the infamous Caydale Pord, which had had the treatment by the local gremlins, and had "grown" somewhat by the time we got there. Jackson/Longstaff launched the Spy, much to the disgust of the engine, and refused to continue for some minutes. Due to braking problems, a certain VW shot into the ford at approx. 50mph. and though the spectators tried to get out of the way of the spray, many had the rattire dampened if not their spirits. However the ford did not turn out to be the worst section on this selective as 12 cars attacked the rather solid 1 of on the downhill, adverse cambered, righthander at542½891. The damage was considerable, including Denny Churchill's 240z, which had its nose altered to the hoxer style. Five of the damaged cars were still there at 10mm the following morning! Jones/Roebuck were fastest on 12, with Goodall/Tempest on 35 and Beecroft/Millington on47. The penalties on this section graduated from 12 secs to 736!

Selective 3 & 4 was the Cockayne Loop, which saw the unfortunate demise of Carr/Collins, who collided with a drunk Moskovitch

Selective 5 saw the retirement of Jackson/Longstaff after a

WD at the finish control.

Selective 6 over Danby used the nigh impossible hairpin at Ivy Hall. Apparently this was a good apactator point, with dozens of diff event ways employed of trying to get round in one. Jones/Roebuck was fastest, this time clean, with Mathew/Mathew on 8 and Goodall/Tempest on 14. Selective 7 led to halfway halt at Scaling Dam. Beefcroft/

Millington had a spot of bother here when the throttle linkage came adrift, so they idled into the halfway, passing Beresford/viles in their TC Cortina perked in the bushes, and unable to continue with battery damage.

The next two selectives, ower Lealholm moor and Glaisdale Moor, was where the 'Flying Butcher' really put on a sourt and

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and demolished Jones lead, and put himself into the lead by 9 secs. The langerous crossroads at 808038 was cautioned, but the kini of Harness/
Needham decided enough was enough, and promptly parked himself in the wall!

The route proceeded via Egton Bridge Ford and on to the last selective over Pickering moor which unfortunately had to be scrubbed due to a few timing discrepancies. The final time controls through Nunnington, Hovingham and Castle Howard, led to the Finish at the Four alls Inn.

The route proved to be demanding for both driver and navigator with the timing being spot on. Congratulations to the organisers, and everyone else connected with the rally in producing a first class event worthy of the restricted status given for next year.
