award in the year.



The following points may be of interest to Rally competitors, they are included within the recently agreed A.N.C.C. Rally Code - should anyone require a complete copy of the 'code' please contact the Secretary.

- 4. To ensure that information is received about damage caused during the event, the following procedures should be followed:
- a) Scrutineering as per C93 will include in addition, the receipt by the scrutineers of the scrutineering card showing existing damage.
- b) Further scrutineering for damage will take place at the end of the events.

c) A 'Damage Declaration Form' will be issued to all competitors.

d) To be classified as a finisher, competitors must complete the Damage Declaration Form and have it agreed by the Scrutineer at final scrutineering.

f) This does not absolve the competitor from his responsibilities to report damage under the Road Traffic Act.

5. Noise checks as per SSR S34b will be established on Closed as well as Restricted events.

A noise Meter check will be instituted at the start of each event. Cars exceeding 78 dBA will not be allowed to start.

The Association suggest that noise checks at points on the route should not be conducted solely by a noise meter. Noise marshalls shall be named Judges of Fact.

- 12. No auxiliary lights shall be used in neutral sections.
- 15. A number of 'standing' Give Way signs should be marshalled by Judges of Fact. Competitors failing to stop will automatically retire at that point.
