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R.A.C. RALLY 1979

I spent this season competing in the Group One section of the Castrol Autosport National Rally Championship in Madett GTE after a 6 year lay off!! This was the first time I had ever tackled a rally championship seriously and also been prepared to drive on the pace without actually approaching 'the brains out' attitude required to win, the seaons finished with the winning of the Opel Goodyear Trade Awards and fifth place, (also worth a cash award) — secured and could not be improved upon before the last round the Bovis. Unfortunately it is disappointing to admit that the first round the Gwynedd was the most satisfying result! We beat all those that finished ahead of us in the Championship excet Ivor Clark - beginners luck!!

There was no point in risking the Bovis with nothing to be gained or lost so the entry was withdrawn to concentrate on the k.A.C.

A.G.J. Meters for Opel had a trade team of three entries. Group I Opel Kadetts for John Cill at 112 myself and Dave Orrick at 124 and a group 2 car for the Managing Director of Tong Park Automotive (home of Dealer Opel Team) John Handley (A video film of these exploits is available by popular request produced by Vintage T.V. at Halifax).

The tactics were to get the three team cara to the finish in respectable time without taking silly chances. Unfortunately John Gill, whilst travelling at a competitive speed left the road in Keilder and was unable to regain the track before going OTL. A pity really as the only other team, Withers of Winsford, although more competitive lost George Hill with a serious mechanical failure. (this trade team award had been there for the taking)!

I had tackled the 'Stately Homes' and Yorkshire stages perhaps a little too slowly, Keilder came up in the early day light hours of Monday and it was again a question of taking it steady. I was selecting as higher gear as possible to avoid the wash boarding effect, in fact speeds of 40 and 50 mph were being driven in 5th gear. I would liked to have been on 'Hackers' for the batch of ice and snow Keilder stages, but we tried them on the Southern Scottish stages and did we see any snow?

The Lake district came up next and unfortunately it took 22 minutes to go through the 3 minute stage of Comb. The car had spluttered to a halt 400 yezds from the stage start line from what was originally throught to be a broken throttle cable, next a terminal for injection fault, till finally I found a loose wire which turned out to be the earth lead on the fuel injection. It wasn't until later that we realised there were no stage maximum times and as a result of a slow special staff road penalties could also be incurred. The R.A.C. promised to provide maximum times to the National Press after the event but these failed to materialise.

The foggy run back to the overnight halt at Chester was not improved by the fact that our exhaust was breaking by the join with the manifold. There was no chance of fixing this in the dark, so it was scheduled to be fixed straight after the restant.

An escent through Chester town centre to the local Opel Dealers S.G. Love was planned and despite ideal facilities in a workshop it took one hour and ten minutes to do a job which should have taken twenty minutes, the specially made down ripowould not fit! We must have been nearly OTL but some driving through fog at speeds not far short of the car's maximum meant we arrived at Weston Park only 20 minutes late, with ten in hand before penalties.


We got within ½ a mile of Ceri to find the route blocked by cars parked on the left and spectators attempting to leave against rally traffic, all on a single track road. But for the help of Chris Moss (formerly of Rally Sport) controlling this traffic we may never have got through. Certainly some unpredictable words were shouted by me at the spectators attempting to leave. The Tuesday night through Wales was a rally in itself. The road sections being extremely icy and visibility considerably impaired by fog. A delay in excess of 15 minutes caused by a mistake in the road book added to the excitement, culminating in an AutoBianchi leaving the road on a tight 90 left and nearly rolling down a bank just in front of us. He was obviously going too quickly as I felt we were just safe with Dave reading the bends off the O.S. map. According to Brian Culcheth a Toyota had actually rolled at the same spot. Incidentally the only damage Brian's car sustained was a result of having to brake on a road section and to quote him:-

"Graham Elsmore travelling behind with his brain in neutral ran into the back"

On the opposite side to the Devils Staircase the road was blocked by the spectators cars, the only route being through a lay-by and along a grass verge. The road was almost all sheet ice and once again despite the early hours of Wednesday spectators cars were once again holding up proceedings.

The last day was spent driving at 7 tenths but concentrating on reading the bends for future reference when they are tackled at 10 tenths. The remainder of the route was undertaken without incident and it was a great relief to get back to Chester having completed another RAC Rally.

Champagne was ordered by the Service Crew and my Tea total stint since 13th July 1978 was aptly broken.

P.C.T. Trophy

Donor Mr. & Mrs. Dickinson

Only Trackrod events to count for this trophy.

Scoring same as Rally & Speed Autotest trophy system.

Marshals Trophy

Every event you marshal on, rallies, autotests, P.C.T.'s etc. you score 5 points.

Service Crew Award

Servicing on any rally scores 5 points for each rally whether restricted, national or international.

Trackrod Trophy All Round Club Member Donor Mr. J. Wilson

Only Trackrod Motor Club organised events to count for this award.

These score as follows:

Autotests Driver 5 points for every event.

P.C.T. Driver and passenger 5 points for each event

<u>Marshal ng</u> 5 points every event for allincluding Clerk of the Course, Secretary of the Meeting and Chief Marshal.

Organising events 15 points for all events.

Rallies Just Trackrod events to count. Scoring the same as F.B.B. Trophy system.

Other Events. i.e. Sportonoggins, Economy Run, Treasure Hunts and Indoor Rallies, driver and passenger both score 5 points each and all non finishers of any event 3 points.

F.S.B. Rally Driver Donor Frank Stuart-Brown F.S.B. Rally Navigator

Both score equal points within their relevant sections. All road and stage rallies score for these trophies, the best 8 scores to count which may include maximum of 2 nationals or 1 international.

Eligibility

To claim points competitors must enter under Trackrod Motor Club or entrant Team Trackrod.

Closed/Joint or Restricted Rallies

Scores as follows:

Overall position if in top 5
1st overall 20 points
down to 5th overall 16 points
After this scores go on class position.
1st in class 15 points
down to 10th in class 6 points

National Rallies

Scores as follows:

1st overall 25 points down to 5th overall 21 points 1st inclass 20 points down to 10th in class 11 points. all other finishers 10 points all none finishers 5 points.

International Rallies

Scores as follows:

1st overall 35 points down to 5th overall 31 points 1st in class 30 points down to 10th in class 16 points all other finishers 15 points all none finishers 10 points

Both score equal points within their relevant sections, only ANCC Rally Championship events to count, best 6 scores to go forward for relevant trophy.

Classes will be stated i.e. Expert/Semi Expert or Novice and not capacity unless CC classes are stated.

Eligibility To claim points competitors must enter under Trackrod Motor Club or Team Trackrod.

Scoring will be as follows: As a percentage of the number of competitors you have beaten in your individual class e.g. 4th in class and 30 starters in class, therefore you have beaten 26 competitors, so your score is

All none finishers score 3 points.

Shell League Trophy

All Shell League events to count, scoring is the same system as ANCC rallies on percentage in class.

OFF Road Events Trophy

Events to count for this trophy are autotests, PCT's, Hill Climbs, Sprints and Rally Cross. These events have to be organised by clubs other than Trackrod M.C.

Scoring same system as ANCC Rallies on percentage in class.

Lloys Special Stage Rally Trophy Donor Mr. & Mrs. S. Lloyd

Only Special Stage Rally events to count.

Awarded to the driver who scores highest number of points on special stage events.

Best 8 events to count. Points score same as ANCC Rallies system.

SPY 44 Trophy Donor Mr. & Mrs. C. R. Jackson

All round competitor.

Eligibility: Competitors must be entered under Trackrod M.C. or Team Trackrod. All events to count except ones organised by Trackrod M.C.

Events to count: Autotest (Driver) Rally Cross (Driver) Sprints (Driver) P.C.T. (Driver) Hill Climbs (Driver) Rallies (Driver/Navigator).

Best 5 events to count with minimum of 3 types of motorsport (as above). Competitions to be organised by blubs other than Trackrod.

Scores based on ANCC Rallies system.


