THE LOOKOUT RALLY

Firstly let me apologise for the lateness of this report which was due to circumstances beyond my control.

On 17th May Trackrod M.C. and Postel M.C. ran their annual novice event on maps 105 and 111 and a very good route was the result. The route used sections from the 1978 and 79 routes.

A large number of Trackrod crews turned out, some 11 in all for what promised (and turned out to be) a dry clear night and some fast and furious driving.

A short run out took crews to the first string of controls at Allerton Bywater thus using the yellows via Ledsham with a string of 6 controls to Sherburn in Elmet. After a short respite the action started again north of Sherburn winding back to the B road, then using the yellows down towards Selby then heading north rount the back of Wistow to Cawood and home ground for some of us; with a string of 7 controls. By this time most crews had dropped about 7 minutes and P. Halstead and M. Callaghan started to collect a string of fails which was to drop them right down the field.

The first selective start north of Cawood using the B road up to Stilling Fleet with most crews dropping a minute. Selective 2 started north of Stilling Fleet and turning right at Naburn down a very twisty road to Deighton. The next

string of time controls started on the yellow east of Crockey Hill towards.

Wheldrake, Eskrick and down to Skipwith. TC16 saw G. Tumber and myself drop
a minute when the door jammed open and the lower hinge broke. A very long
relaxed section took us through Selby to start competitive again east of Selby with
loops each side of the main road finishing at Camblesforth. The Sutcliffes

Selective 3 started at Camblesforth and ran round to Drax. Gremlins again struck us with the door jamming open again, but was very quickly fixed (must get a safety strap put on) losing us very little time. Selective 4 took us round the yellows to Carlton, where a short run in to halfway and a rest.

A short run out took crews to the start of the second half just south of Rawcliffe on the yellow and with a string of 16 time controls to the finish it promised to be a fast second half. This took us south on Map 111 on the yellows to Fishlake then east to Askern and a short rest. A diversion road closed sign had a few crews guessing and with daylight fast approaching a bit more care was going to be needed. Also by this time the police were out in force and a number of crews dropped time due to being kept to a 30 mph maximum. The route continued to head east towards the A1 then north towards Darrington on map 105. By this time there was 2 of us running on the same minute and due to be joined by another two crews west of Darrington.

The route then crossed from map 105-111 and heading east took us to the last control at Pollington, and with 4 crews running on the same minute the marshals were kept very busy. A quiet run in took us to breakfast at Gyme Country Club, where in due course the results were posted.

Final positions showed that the event had been won by D. Moore/L. Walker Car 22 who dropped a total of 21m 49 sec. 2nd and a member of the team award were the Trackrod crew of R. Jackson/R. Close at 5 on 23m 34 sec.

A.N.C.C. AUTOTEST CHAMPIONSHIP ROUND 4 LANCS & CHESHIRE CAR CLUB, 8th June, 1980

Birch Services on the M62 was the venue for this event, perhaps not as bleak as Hartshead Moor but fortunately the sun was shining a lot of the time and it did not rain.

39 competitors took part in the event which was Lancs. and Cheshire's first attempt at a restricted event and they were under observation from both the BTRDA and RAC for inclusion in their respective Championships in 1981, so the organisation had to be fairly slick to keep things on the boil.

Trackrod were represented by Ron Mackinnon (Midget) and your Editor (1275GT) who were up against a lot of the Championship regulars and things looked like being set for a day long battle for class and overall honours. The tests, 16 in all, were run in pairs, two runs at each pair counting for the awards.

Things got underway bang on time and the anticipated tussles bagan. After the first pair of tests Alan Forrest (Lotus 7) led overall on 60.46 followed by Paul Adelman (Midget) on 61.15 and Ed (1275GT) on 61.35 and Chris Gowthorpe (Mini 1000) on 62.28. Ron Mack, by this stage had already been pylon bashing for a 10 sec. deficit. After the second runs at the first pair of tests the totals showed the same people in a different order — Ed 121.46, Paul Adelman 122.42, Alan Forrest 122.88 and Chris Gowthorpe 125.23.

The pressure became intense and it showed on the next pair. Alan Forest collected a washout which effectively dropped him down and brought Ron up to 2nd in class (4th overall) but again Ed and Paul Adelman switched positions, Paul just leading by 0.71 secs. Still lurking not too far away were David Sowman (1275GT), Chris Gowthorpe (Mini1000) and Ron Mackinnon (Midget). Another regular contender, Gerald Taylor (1275GT) fell foul of the test diagram on test 6 and collected a washout just before the lunch break which gave him a little time to think about it before battle re-commenced.

After lunch the battle became a two sided affair between Ed and Paul Adelman, Ed just having the advantage by 3 secs. after 8 tests - Chris Gowthorpe was still there but the Mini 1000 was gasping for breath in the wake of the 1275 Mini and Midget.

Amidst the battle for FTD there was a very close class struggle in the larger saloon class. The only two large Escorts of Mike Elliott (Ron's old RS2000) and Alan Carvell were merged with the smaller engined varieties, but because the classes were based on overall vehicle length John North's VW Polo was also in this class - Now Mike Elliott collected a couple of slow times early on and John North (Remember him in the Beetle last year) was making him work Very hard to make up the deficit, which Mike eventually did in a cliff hanging finish by just 0.94 secs.!!

Meanwhile Ed was slowly building up a cushion at the head of the field and after 12 tests it was 14 secs. (only 1½ pylons) and amid much 'psyching' the pressure, increased by Ron Mack trying to get rid of both Paul and Ed, finally told and Paul collected a fateful washout on test 14 which gave Ron the class lead he had been seeking, but Alan Forest was only 10 secs. behind - could Ron keep away from the pylons on the last pair of tests???? He did, and Alan collected his second washout of the day on the penultimate test - all very tense.

A super event - only sorry more of our members weren't on hand to have a go.
