RALLY & SPEED SHOP RIDINGS RALLY.

The weekend of April 25/26th saw most of the Leeds area under about one foot of snow, but elsewhere it was clear, and Alwoodley Motor Club's Ridings Rally was preparing to get underway at Leeming Bar start & finish venue. Trackrod were well represented with 6 crews, these being Roy and Allan Sutcliffe at No 9 in an Escort 1600, Dereck Marshall & John McNichol in an Avenger 1500 at No 14, at No 27 was the Twin Cam 1600 of Cerl Gomersall & Craig Thorley followed at 37 by John Brogden & Ronnia Moore in a bg standard straight off the forecourt Mini 1000, due to John having writted off his rally car a couple of months before and not having finished building his new one. In the Novices there were two entries, these being Paul Lindley & Mick Hudson in a Mini at No 70 (But did not start) and at 71 was the Avenger of M.Brown & J.Carr.

There was a run out from Leeming bar to the start of the first competative section just to the East of Northallerton, through 3 controls to finish just short of the A 19 at North Kilnington. Then there was a long neutral run to selective 1 on map 100 just to the south of Sutton under Whitestonecliffe. At the start of ss1 there was a re-route and ss2 was cancelled due to a local going off on White Horse Bank & blocking it. So ss1 was only about 2 miles long, then a neutral from Sutton Bank to the re-start at Wass Moor. This ran through a lot of Targa Sections and neutrals to finish to the north of Amotherly. There was a neutral to the re-start of the rally proper at Hovingham. This ran through 6 controls to finish at Newburgh Priory, on this section Carl Gomersall had trouble with his alternator and had to run on dipped lights to the finish. \$53 ran from Coxwold to finish east of Carlton Husthwaite and SS 4 started to the west of the same village & finished just short of the A19 at Stackhall Green.

Then it was back onto map 99 and SS 5. From the start of this selective it was dead straight to the not as map junction at 445752. Brogden/Moore got the mini wound up down the straight and had trouble getting round the junction but makinged it with the help of the grass verge. SSS started at Topcliffe and finished just short of Baldersby St.James.

There was a short run up the A1 to the final string of controls to the finish. These started at Middleton Quernhow and wound its way up the yellows and across the B6267 to finish at Carthorpe. Just 1 control from the finish was sited on the junction with the B road at 290803. This is where Carl & Craig picked up a fail by driving straight through the control without seeing it. There was a short run up the A1 to finish at Leeming Bar & results. These showed the winner to be Dave Fox with John Millington at the maps in his ex-Malcolm Wilson RS 2000

Hunters Trophy Treasure Hunt Championship 1981

Due to my involvement with the Costa-Di-Plenti Rally, the 1981 programme for the above trophy got off to a very dodgy start. In fact, I must confess it got totally forgotten. I do most humbly apologise to all members who turned up on April 7th at the Square & Compass expecting a treasure hunt that was not even organised. The consequent result was that round I was rapidly reorganised for Tuesday May 5th, one week before round 2 on May 12th. The "Outdoor-Indoor Rally" scheduled for May 5th had to be cancelled to make way for round 1 which replaced it (it didn't actually, it just had one hell of a lot more questions in it).

So away we go.

Round 1. May 5th, Square & Compass (OR The Outdoor-Indoor Rally modified)

After a beautiful sunny day, 7 crews assembled at the Square & Compass to participate in the opening round of the Hunters Trophy. Unfortunately, as the competitors started, so did the rain. The route was divided into 4 sections, all spreading out away from the start. Each section used a different navigational technique, and when all were plotted they could, as the organiser said, "be done in any order and any direction". Indeed, the route formed a four leaf clover which could be tackled in either of 2 circular directions or either direction of a figure 8 vertical and horizontal — CLEVER! Team "Crabs" found another way that was definitely not intended. Oue to the "rush" and foul night the results and prize presentation was postponed until the following week on round 2. One point that did show up on this round was of importance to you egotistical rally drivers. Our goodly editor John Bean did the event on his tod, thus proving that a good navigator CAN manage without his driver. NOW THERE'S A THOUGHT.

Round 2, May 12th, Peacock Hotel Yeadon

9/10th MAY MOTORING NEWS ROUND 5.

This took the shape of Otley Motor Club's (Barratt Oak) but now known as the Coleman Tyres Rally. There were all the top names of the Road Rally world at the start at Otley Cattle Market, with a few Trackrod crews out to see how they fared against the big boys.

First in the entry list at No 30 should have been Ian Gurnett and Jack Coulthardbut the car was not ready on time so they non-started, next was Ronnie Moore navigating for Ilkley's John Brogden in his new Mini 1275 GT at No 43. The next four entries were in the Semi-Expert Class, at No 62 Gez Waters/ Vince Fletcher, at 63 Roy Fox/ John Bean, at 65 Dave Kelsall and John Bowness, all in RS 2000's, and at 68 Carl Gomersall /Craig Thorley in their Twin Cam. The last entry of all at No 90 was Dave Harrison and Nigel Latimer in Dave's 1300 Escort.

With 2 hours to plot there was plenty of time to plot the route and then discuss it with fellow navigators. One feature of this dicussion was PC 16, which plotted on the latest maps between two roads at Berden Bridge, but on the older editions, well, more of that later.

First car away at 2315 was the RS 2000 of Roger Moran/Garest Jones, who made their way to the competative start at Huby. The fog also started here, which was with the rally for 90% of the route. First Trackrod crew in trouble was Dave Harrison/ Nigel Latimer at the very first bend of note when they slid off at the 90 left at 265492, and got stuck in the mud for 20 minutes. They decided to retire there and then. Also in trouble was Brogden/Moore who slid across the road into the ditch at the 90 left at 236495, but kept the car going and eventually it jumped out again 20 yards further on, so not much time was lost.

The route went around the Leathley triangle to pick up a secret check at 226489 and carried on to Norwood and looped around Jack Hill and down through Fewston to a passage contol at 169576, in a lay by. Roy Fox/John Bean and Jez and Vince both recieved Fails here when Roy and John missed the entrance to the lay-by in the fog, and Gez and Vince followed, within inches of the rear of Roy's car. There must be a moral to learn there!! These were not the only crews to recieve Fails at this location, a total of 13 crews falling foul, including some Experts.

The route then ran onto map 99 down Yorks Folly. There was a neutral through Glasshouses to restart at Brimham Rocks, looping around Sawley and Fountains Abbey. Dave Kelsall/John Bownass's rally came to an end here when a wheel fell off their car. The route then crossed the B 6265 and skirted Grantly, crossing Skelding Moor. This is where Mick Watkins/ Nick Leuchars fell into a bog on the 45 left at 215701 and were stuck for some 20 to 30 minutes needing 20 to 30 spectators and a tow rope to get them out. The route continued on over Greygarth and onto Fountains Earth, where the trouble started for a few cars, one being Brogden/Moore. They had passed some cars when they caught another which threw up a large rock which hit the Mihi's front near-side tyre causing it to puncture, so they had to stop and change it, which caused them to drop some 6 minutes on this section. Carl Gomersall and Craig Thorley were also held up on Fountains Earth by Gez and Vince, taking this section very carefully. The route then went by way of the very wet and rough Grewelthorpe White to finish outside the village at TC 18. Gez/Vince & Carl/Craig both recieved fails here, being OTL.

The first Selective started outside Grewelthorpe and ran round Swinton Green finishing just to the south of Masham. Fastest on this selective was Watkins/Smith in an Opel, on 2.37 from Brogden/Moore in the Mini on 2.56. One or two craws were in trouble at the not as map junction st 205776, including Roy Fox/John Bean, who went off, over a ditch and into the banking. It took them about 15 minutes to get clear, after a lot of 'huffing and puffing' from the numerous spectators, including several very amused Trackrod members. Unfortunately this loss put them BTL at the end of this selective, but at the start of the next, East of Masham they were back in time thanks to a time recovery section. This second selective ran to the south east of Bedale, and was cleanable by all but a handful of novices. Petrol was then taken at John Gill's garage at Bedale(but no sign of his fan club). At petrol Maximum lateness was extended to one hour. There was a run up the A1 to the start of the third selective which ran south west to finish just short of Patrick Brompton, fastest here being Beecroft/Millington on 1.02. Selective 4 ran west of Patrick Brompton around Allathorne and across the Ranges (Those Kerbs!!) finishing at Halfpenny House. Fastest was Beecroft/Millington on 2.28.

Selective 5 ran from Malburn Hall down the yellow onto the 8 6270 and finished on map 98 just before Grinton. Quickest again was Seccroft/Millington on 1.10. Selective 6 ran over Summer Lodge Moor and Askrigg Pastures, over Oxnop Moor to finish on the brown before Muker. Brogden/Moore passed 4 cars on this selective (these Mini's are closer to the ground so you can see the road in the fog). Fastest here were Beecroft/Millington on 2.52 from Smith/Matthew on 3.11. Selective 7 ran over Buttertubs to finish at High Shaw. Brogden/Moore had a heart stopping moment just after the hairpin & 90 right when the car decided to take a look at the long drop down, but they managed to keep it on the road. Quickest again was Beecroft/Millington on 1.34, from Swires/schofield on 1.56.

Selective 8 ran from Hawes to Oughtershaw, fastest being car 63 Roy FoX/ John Bean. YES! they really got it wound up over this road which Roy knows well, and needless to say the fog had lifted slightly with the first glimmer of daylight. Next was car 78 Sykes/Sharp, on 0.37, and Beecroft/Millington on 0.39. Selective 9 from Cush Rigg to Buckden saw Beecroft/Millington on 1.16 from car 66 Jackson/Webster on 1.17. A time recovery section followed, with the 10th Selective running down the 8 road from Kettlewell past Kilnsey Cragg to finish 1 mile from Threshfield. Very fast with little fog. Beecroft cleaned it with Bill Gwynne/Watkins just one second over. After a neutral through Grassington Selective 11 started near Dibbles Bridge and ran down through Whithill over Barden Bridge to take in the short, steep white at Barden Towers. Some crews had trouble seeing this on their maps, including Gez/Vince, who missed the P.C. and recieved a fail. The selective finished near Bolton Abbey, again it was Beecroft on 0.50 from car 26, Short/Starkey on 0.54.

The last Selective ran from Kex Gill off the A 59, round and through Blubberhouses crossing the A 59, past Timble, over Snowden Moor, to end the rally just outside Otley. Brogden/Moore had another moment here when they left the road at the 90 right at 155569, running up the banking and onto 2 wheels, coming back down onto all four, and being able to reverse back onto the road, carrying on to catch the car in front, which held them up before allowing them past. They managed a time of 0.20. The fog kept lifting and returning, shown in the times as Beecroft made 0.13, but cars 25 & 26 lost 0.08 & cleaned it respectively.

The finish at the Post House Bramhope saw a lot of bent cars and redeyed crows from straining to see through the fog. Results showed Beccroft the clear winner from Smith/Metthews sccond. ($26.12 \div 34.55$)
