Hunters Trophy Treasure Hunt Championship 1981

Round 5. August 18th

Tuesday, 18th August saw the 5th and final round of the 1981 Hunters Trophy Treasure Hunt Chempionship. This round was organised by Mike Robson with assistance from Gerald Tumber, the event starting and finishing at the "Crowin Hotel" Boston Spa. The event was contested by the average number of seven crews, consisting of the top four crews trying to better their positions, two crews out to cause trouble among the top four and one crew out for the first time.

The method of finding the route was a new and very interesting system, photographs of road junctions (not necessarily taken from the direction you were travelling). This method proved very enjoyable and was liked by all the competitors except for one problem, it got dark half way round the route. The view of a road junction at night by headlamps bears no resemblance to a daylight photo of the same spot. Local knowledge of the area by three crews paid dividends, as they readily admitted that many of the junctions photographed they recognised instantly and could plot the route remaining in the pitch dark, as the results will verify. Hed this event been held in June/July, it would have been better for all the crews giving all an equal chance. Nevertheless, the event was original and well organised, passing through a very historical part of Yorkshire. Well done Mike and a special pat on the head for Garald, who spent most of the evening at the side of the road at Askham Richard to hand out lists of treasure to be collected. I personally, would like to see this system of route finding used again, but under more favourable conditions daylightwise.

Devil's Cwn Rally - 8/9th August 1981

This Kirby Lonsdale organised event has a reputation for toughness, and this year added to that reputation, to some tune !! Three hopeful Trackrod crews met at the excellent start vanue in an illuminated, covered, multi-storey car park (and nearby hotel). They were Tony Mitchell/ Jack Coulthard, Jez Waters/John Bean, and Dave Kelsall/John Bowness. A short run-out led the first of 13 selectives, with 2 petrol halts.

At \$\$1, John and Jez were waiting for their minute when Jack Coulthard tapped on their window!! Jack assured Jez and John that he was alright—and told them to take it easy—the roads were treacherous. 200 yards down the road Tony had lost it in a big way, with the car a sorry sight. Jez headed the warning, but 3 minutes later come Dave Kelsall. Dave came across a 'T' junction some 200 yards after Tony's off—and didn't quite make it, badly damaging his front inside corner!! Trackrod's misfortunes continued on the 2nd solective which used the infamous Sandbads white. This road is bad in damp weather—and it had rained for the previous 24 hours. Not only that, but you can't drive around the rocks if they are submerged and you can't see them! Jez/John not only damaged their exhaust here, but ripped off an anti-tramp bar from the rear axle.

The first petrol halt saw a lot of hectic repair work, with Jez/John also re-starting with a big time loss.

Heavy fog in the second section of the rally saw navigators having to make a decision. John Bownass opted for cutting and completing their rally with a finish, but 30-odd fails. Still - they finished and weren't last!! John Bean took Jez all the way around this middle section, including a fog-bound Tan Hill and muddy white. This was done in the hope that OTL would be extended (as on the Coleman Tyres) - but to no avail. After getting stuck in ruts on a white, only I mile from the second petrol, they were out of the event.

This demanding event saw only 12 out of 50 experts classed as finishers, plus a handful of semis and novices
