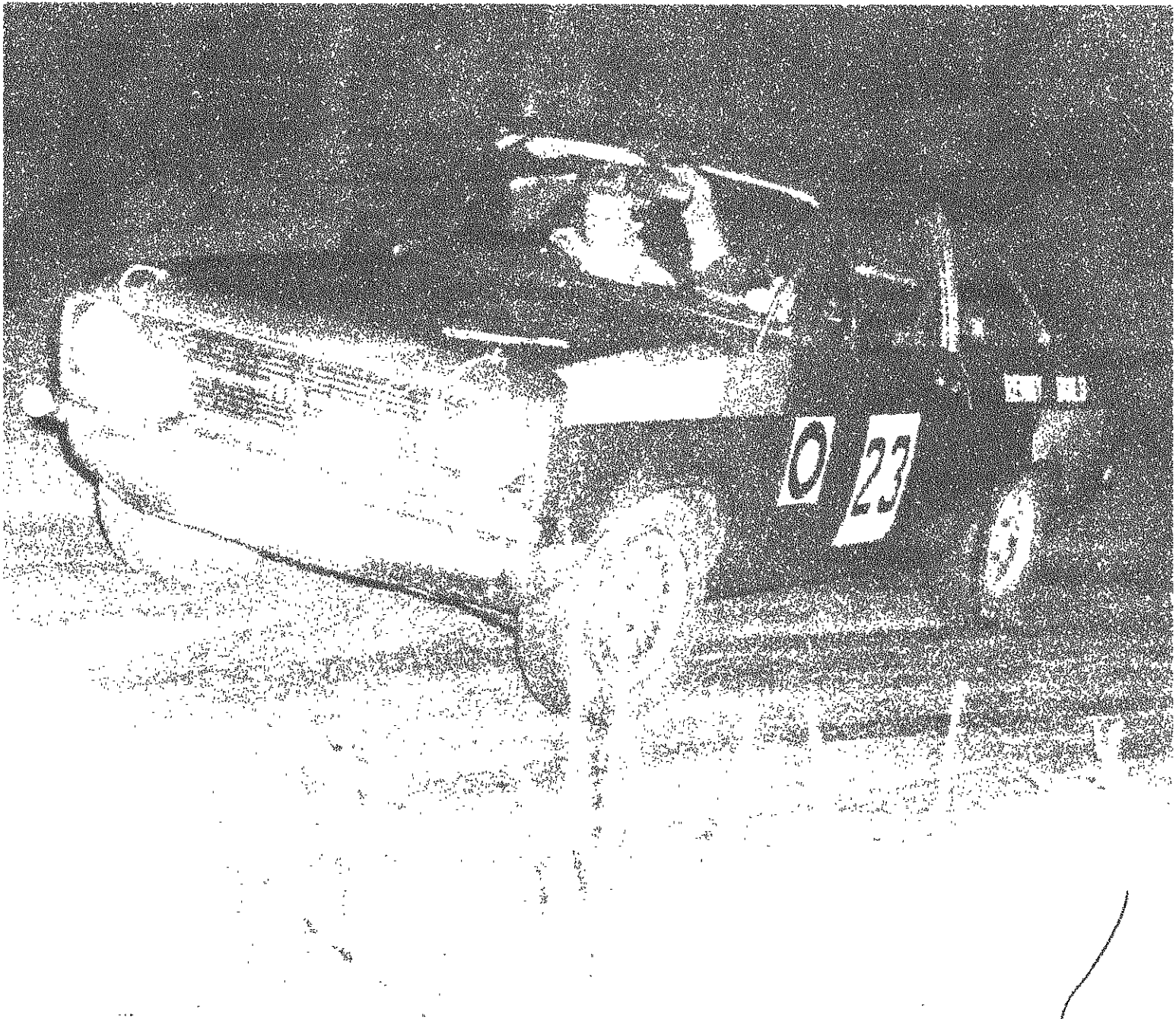

Round 4, March 8th "The Oscar Tango Fandango"

This round, held as is now usual at the Horsforth Club, was organised

by the "elderly" gentleman of Team Oscar Tango.90. The round was contested by 7 crews and threw up a surprise.

Before going further, I would like to say how good the Horsforth Club is for these indoor activities. With the large room upstairs, and the small room for overflow downstairs, the contestants can get on with the job in peace and quiet, whilst other members can partake of the ale and jollification in the main bar. This caused the reigning champions no end of trouble as they cursed and swore over it for 20 minutes before they were given the necessary simple clue that got them going. Bearing in mind my previous paragraph, all the novices saw the trap immediately and were well into the second section before the champs got going. To make up for lost time, the champs decided to go over into penalty time, working with speed to gain more points than they were losing, but gave it best after 15 minutes. All other teams finished on the hour, but with no one completing the full route.

There is always one team which battles against all odds, this time it was team Bird Brains, whose map was so old that not only were half the roads missing, but so were the ROMAN ANTIQUITIES. They really did live up to their name!! It was indeed excessively hard work for them and consequently they finished last. Despite these comments, it was a close battle with only 28 points separating Bird Brains at the end, and winners Team Goodall/Tempest.

Now we come to surprise winners, Ken Goodall and Mike Tempest. Whilst, experienced rally men, indoor rallying is a different ball game altogether, and on previous rounds Ken and Mike were having a tough time. But now they appear to have cracked it with a new system I have never seen used before. Mike, the map man in the car, set about plotting the route solo. A few minutes later, Ken, the one who is supposed to look where he is going, sorry Ken, followed on answering the route questions on his own. For them the system worked and brought them home no. 1, I am tempted to try this system myself, next season perhaps.

To all of you who took part, very well done. It was a tough route, it was intended to be, so my thanks to you for not complaining, although I think you were too busy to do so.

Reflections of Trackrod Motor Club Ltd's
Progress through 150 Editions of the Club Magazine

Trackrod began in October 1969 and by the first two gatherings, had attracted 50 members. The membership fee was 25/-. Our first event was called a Table Top Rally and was entered by no less than 40 members, (things have certainly changed). The Club then progressed to organize various other events, one of these being the first Autotest at Acaster, in which 75% of the Club entered (not one or two like now).

Generally speaking all members (ladies included) were keen to either take part in, or organise (or both) motor sport at a level commensurate with a new club.

We were obviously keen to impress upon more established clubs that Trackrod was here to stay and was more than capable of organising a quality event and fielding worthy competitors in other clubs' events.

The club, originally did not have an abundance of "older generation members" (it still hasn't!) to guide it and provide the steadying hand and it is to the club's credit that it acted in a totally competent and professional manner - being very keen on the image projected.

Regular competitive events ensured a healthy growth in membership and it was with a great sense of achievement that the club obtained "restricted" status for a P.C.T. and an autotest after perhaps only one to two years.

Instigation of Shell League provided the platform for our competitors and organisers to prove themselves worthy of the task and those were the days when our Shell League Team Captain had to pick a team from our total club entry!!

Motivation for events always came from the Committee and any event always had one Committee Member as either Secretary of Meeting or Clerk of Course. Obviously, the days of delegation had not then dawned and the old adage of "if yer want owt dooin do it yersen!" still ruled.

A great deal of effort went into getting the Costa Di Pienti off the ground and practically every member was involved in some aspect - those that weren't going to be competing anyway!! - How many members now take part in our rallies these days? and I mean regular members, or any other event for that matter!

After the success of the Costa, attentions turned towards a stages event and after a fairly long gestation period it happened first in 1976 and was the forerunner of today's Forest Stages Rally.

What about Noggins every week? - do we all see too much of each other? better to compete once a month or drive a bar stool four times a month?? Take your choice!

For the early years the Committee had great ambition and perhaps that has been its downfall. Maybe success came too quickly, leaving present successive committees little to achieve - it's all been done- how about having the ambition to restore a competitive nature to our membership - and NOT FOOTBALL OR KNITTING RACES!!

National events, particularly rallies, take an enormous amount of organising energy and perhaps the time is ripe to divert some of this energy back to the club competitions. It's all been said before but don't

complain - do something about it and that is the problem - everyone is complaining about the apathy and lethargy amongst the ranks and this applies to Committee members as well as the rank and file member - but NONE of them want to do anything about it!

Then we went through the "It's a waste of my time doing that if so-and-so's doing it, I can't beat him" period. Where would we be if we'd thought that about Argentina?? If you don't try, you don't succeed. Anyway, then so-and-so stops doing club events because of aforesaid whingers and what happens - nobody turns up to compete after weeks of searching for an organiser, who quite justifiably is fed up with the lack of support for his/her event vowing "never again" - hence where we are now.

How about a forum to stir up the muck, with the writers of this article being the panel to receive your questions and tell you what they really think because we've done our bit and are perhaps more qualified than any members to point the finger - but don't disappear for years or for ever when the finger has been pointed at you - chances are nobody will turn up anyway!! It seems to be a case of "apathy rules - so what"!!

The answer lies with the Committee and yourselves - firstly, the Committee to set the example by not delegating everything - they were elected to do it - well most of it, and secondly, the membership to follow their Committee's example of enthusiasm.

It's interesting that clubs who have a very active and competing membership run no major national rallies and those that do - do little else - witness De Lacy and Trackrod amongst others.

Okay, so we've said plenty and come up with little in the way of solutions to our present problems and to be truthful, many clubs are experiencing similar problems to Trackrod's. To be honest, we don't want to see the members pull the plug on the club, but by the same token commitments overtake us all and we don't feel that we can devote the time to a rescue attempt as we are both basically competitors (one just returned and one just entering a temporary withdrawal!) As it is all we can do at present is to keep the old Trackrod flag flying on at least one or two events, and hope that others will some day do likewise. Don't get us wrong - we know a handful of members do compete but they are by no means enough from a membership of perhaps 100. Good grief - it's not long since we considered limiting the membership to 300 as we couldn't cope with 250+!!

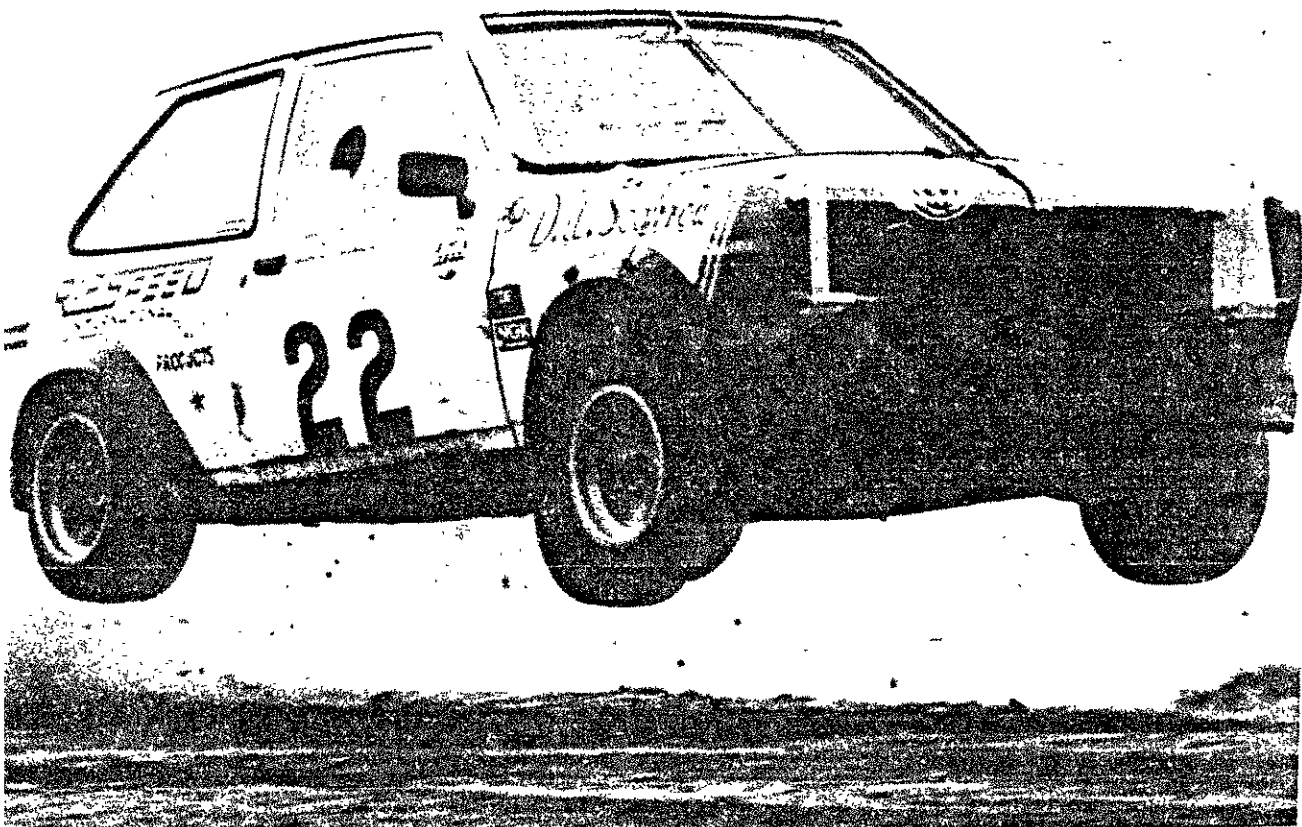
