(The following article is based on extracts from an 8 page document on radio communication for rallies, which was issued by the RAC MSA. Copies of the original document are available from RAC MSA.)

THE USE OF RADIOS ON MOTOR RALLIES.

Organisers Choice - Equipment.

Although the use of radios is not currently mandatory, it is considered to be an invaluble aid to organisers. The current Regulations on the choice of radio frequencies are as follows:-

- i. The permitted use of the RAC's own Medical and Safety Frequency.
- ii The permitted use of other properly licensed private frequencies.
- iii An absolute rejection of any legal or illegal 'open channel' or'CB' radio for safety work.

'CB' Radio.

Whether AM or FM this equipment must not be used for safety work, by the mere fact that it is 'open channel' it means that potentially serious messages can be overheard, it also has the capacity to be misused, false messages can be transmitted causing perhaps delays in the running of the event which may work to the advantage of a competitor:

I may be that the organisers see some role for CB in a general .sense, but beware of trusting messages.

Some organisers even prohibit the use of CB by competitors on stage rallies, because of the dangers of interference both on its own frequencies and to automatic timing devices.

Manning.

Radio operators <u>MUST NOT</u> have another job. Radio cars <u>MUST</u> be manned by at least two persons. Radio operators should be chosen forclear speaking voice and common sense. Women make excellant operators. Messages over long distances can be read that much easier if spoken slowly and clearly. The radio <u>MUST</u> be manned at all times. Do not fit equipment to cars containing CB sets, one radio is enough for anyone to distanto, unless the operator is very experienced.

PRODUCTION CAR TRIALS.

Briefly, if those of you who have read the forthcoming events column and are wondering what the club night P.C.T. is, let me enlighten you. For those who are in the dark a <u>production</u> car (one of those ter million tin boxes that clutter up our roads, i.e. the family car) is all you need. A PCT is nothing more than a driver skill test in which you simply see how far up a hill you can get before you stop. Time is not the essence, careful clutch and throttle control is what its all about. So now you know what's involved, why not have a go in your family runaround, theres no way you can damage it, you don't need roll cages, ultra-wide wheels turbochargers, or lim-slip dif, just a bog-standard car.
