Northallerton Forest Stages Rally.

Sunday 11th December saw Pickering come alive with the sound of Rally cars and followers, for the above event. The rally started and finished in Pickering with rally H.Q. at the Forest & Vale Hotel.

Amongst the 70 entries were a few well known local crews, i.e. Stove Bannister at no.1, Oldfield at 2, Desort at 3, and Piggy Thompson at 6 in his Porshe. There were three Trackrod crows, Keith Bowen / Ronnic (are twisted) Moore in the Music Hiro Group Twin Cam Escort, at 29; Dave Woods / Dave Jupp in at No. 41 in an Escort RS2000 and at No.26 was the ex Jennison Chevette in the hands of Tony Hanson / Tony Holdsworth

At 11.00am the first car set off to stage 1, Dalby 1, starting at the

bottom of Givendale and using just over $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the Dalby complex. This stage saw car 16 off on the first (ice covered) 90 left and No. 8 was off just before the flying finish. With both these cars being dark blue, Keith thought it may have been an onen, so he took the first stage very cautiously.

The next stage, Dalby 2, took in the 'woodyard', where Keith played to the crowd and understeered onto the grass, but nanged to keep going to the end of the three mile stage.

Next there was a pacenote check and shouts of, "I've got one!" I went white and pointed out that the markings on my map were from road rallies, which were nowhere near the stages anyway. (You don't expect US to swallow that as well, do you Ronnie? - Ed.)

After that fright it was into service for a check over by Dave (what's a spanner) Turnbull. Scrvice could be used any time you required, much to the relief of Charlie Payne / Steve Stringwell who spent most of the day fettling a bent front end on the Ascona (on stage one).

Stage 3, Dalby 3, took in 'Mikkola's Bend' (the bad way) so there was lots of shouting from me as Keith went round - the drops were on my side. This stage was $4\frac{1}{2}$ niles long and one of the best regarding road conditions.

Next cane $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of Staindale with plenty of snow, ice, mud and water. There was a heart stopping moment as we came over a brow/45 left, with sheet ice on the other side but like most crews we managed to get round. About three miles in, the Rally leader, Bannister, was off with N/S front suspension trouble, although he somehow managed to get the car out and into service. Back to Dalby fire tower and Dave (now I know what a spanner is) Turnbull - Someone told him. The leader after four stages was Desort in the TR7 V8.

The last two stages were in Wykéham, with Trackrod helping to marshal stage 5, Wykeham North. A $3\frac{1}{2}$ mile stage starting at Troutsdale and taking in 'Buchans Bend' (1980), the tarmac hairpin down hill, with sheet ice at the betten, which took some getting up (ask Keith Eunn).

The last stage was $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles of Wykehan South with snow covered sheet ice giving no traction for most of the stage. This was driven with extreen caution so as to get to the finish without a scratch. We then went back down the λ 170 to the finish at Pickering, with a well deserved pint and results in the Forest and Vale Hotel.

Larkspeed Trophy Rally - 29 / 30th October '83.

For the final round of the Shell League we had 5 crews entered - at 16, G, Waters / J. McNichel (RS2000), C. Miller / M. Miller (mini 1098) at 72, A, Nutter / S. Sanderson (mini 998) at 86, G. Davies / D. Johnson (Escort 1600) at 88 and J. Ronny / J. Millington (Escort 1300) finally getting a run at 25.

From the start at the Wagon and Horses on the A19 there followed a long run out to NTC 1 near Kirby Sigston. From here we headed south to Thirsk, on to Kilburn and up the White Horse Bank (I wish we had a bit nore power) then via Dialstone Farm and Old Byland to HelmsIey and the Cockayne loop. Somewhere here the Miller Bros. in their new Mini, got lost and cut out the loop to make up time, while we took a yunp toe fast and had a very heavy landing. On the 90 right to the dry ford west of Kirbynoorside we overshot (not my fault), but fortunately there was a grass triangle to go round.

Next we went through thedry ford and then north across the white and down to Beadlen, then via Normanby to petrol at Anotherby. There was a long run-cut to the re-start at Barton Hill, off the A64. Next we headed north across Yeasley Moor and through Wass Forest (where an error by me caused an overshoot) and then down to Wass. The white on Raskell Moor was used, the second half of it was very rough (especially in a Mini) and so to the finish at Leoning Bar Motel. The Team results were;
