


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

RAC RALLY 1984

This year the RAC Relly will not be using Beltby stage and, as John Richardson is now an Area Coordinator, I was asked to be Stage Commder for Dalby 2. Dalby as I an sure you will know is a tremandous spectator attraction and, therefore requires a Significant number of marshalls. Add to that the fact that the stage is over 32 miles long and is being run twice then you will hopefully understand the size of the undertaking.

Dalby i is being 'commanded' by Graham Whittaker' but, because the time schedule is very tight there will be no time to close and reopen the stage we have decided to run as a joint venture.

Effectively this means that TMC will run the Start and the next 5 corners, Alwoodley no will run the Finish and preceding few corners. The remainder of the stage (70 corners in total) has been split into sectors and sector commanders have been appointed from several other notor clubs. Corner marshals will be appointed for each corner.

Our entrance is from EDBERSTON village NR 8998301 to GIVENDALE MEAD FARM MR 894876, sign on by 23.00hrs. Monday 26th., earlier for corner marshals. The first car is not until approx. 4,30an. but spectators will be arriving very early and you must be those to meet them. Corner marshals must be in position before this time and will be in position to meet the 'convoy'. The stage will not close that lunchtime Tuesday - so bring plonty of warm clothing/food/drink etc. THERE IS NO CHANCE OF LEAVING THE STAGE ONGE YOU ARE IN. THE STAGE IS 'LIVE' ALL THE TIME.

I could hardly beloive what I had let myself in for. It was my fourth road rally but in all the others I had an experienced navigator, this one I had asked my ex-flatnate if he wanted a go at navigating. He said YES so in went the entry.

Preparation was limited to a change of points and t faulty rear damper, not even an oil change. At the last minute I decided to replace a rusty siloncer, which then blow.

After burbling through scrutineering and noise we reached the start, and nanaged to pick up the route five minutes late. Plotting began very slowly, my navigator had not seem a roner before that evening so with plotting time ticking away. I took the maps and plotted the rest of the route, finishing with minutes to spare.

Once on the competitive sections we began to enjoy the event apart from being passed by half the rally on the first selective (most of whom we later saw in ditchs, hedges, walls and bits). The best quote I heard was the route being alternating dead rabbits and warning triangles.
