
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

But luck was not on our side and Keith had problems with his car and had to retire without having put in a fast run, hence only scoring 10.00 points. Mr Miller did manage a timed run and finished 4th in class and scored 43.3 points giving us a grand total of 53.3 points finishing last on the day and dropping to 7th overall.

Round 5 was Shipley & D.M.C. White Rose Rally with a new organising team and the promise of a good nights sport. Trackrod had 6 eligible crews out so for the first time in a long while, a team had to be picked. Eventually, I decided to drop Martin Kemp and Neil Du Cros due to the lack of recent experience. My first mistake of the night! The team consisted of Simon Davison brought in by John Millington to gain some useful practice for the Ipres Rally. Myself with Andy Scoop Munnis in the hot seat, and it did get hot! Ken Goodall with regular Mick Tempest. John Rogers/M Wood looked useful as a Semi along with the ever

flamboyant Bob Stoker and Martin Miller complete with special oil catch tank at the start, ie. the wifes' best measuring jug. Jane was not 3 amused. Hopefully, somewhere else within these pages a full report of the rally will be written, but briefly, Bob and Martin retired after the first selective with no power or engine comprehensively destroying and on the way nome.

At half-way things looked quite good, Simon and John in the top 5 with the prospect of better to come. I was knocking about the top 10. Ken and Mick a little way behind having lost 4 or 5 mins drowned out in one of the fords. John Rogers and M Wood were lying well in the Semis. 

AUTOTEST TRAING EVENING

16th July 1985

It is intended to hold this 'lesson' on Wellington St. car park starting at approx 7pm so if you are interested present yourself with a vehicle and pick up some tips on car control from J. Renny and R. Ineson. It is intended to have theory and practical sessions in the basic autotest manoeuvres for both front wheel and rear wheel drive vehicles - yes, the techniques are different - or so they tell me !!

The evening is open to club members <u>ONLY</u> so please go along, particularly if you're considering doing the occasional autotest but also if you have yet to master the art of the handbrake turn, reverse spin. etc.

The noise meter will be in attendance at the autotest for anybody who wishes to make use of this facility before the Lookout Rally.

WHARFEDALE TROPHY HILLCLIMB

Keith Bowen and myself provided the Trackrod entry for the Shell Oils Championship Wharfedale trophy Hillclimb organised by YSCC on 9 June, at Scammenden Dam. We formed part of the large rally car entry. The changeable weather with alternate rain and sunshine must have caused some headaches for those with a tyre choice, - not so myself, having to rely on one set of Colway remoulds!

The up to 1600cc class with Keith B in a 1558 Escort had a very large entry with 13 cars as opposed to 6 in the under 1300 all mini class.

John Brogden from Pool won the Rally 1 class with a time of 33.90s in a 1293S followed by David Sowman in a time of 34.93s. Both were entered under Ilkley. I split the shared car entry of Malcolm McGovern and Dave Taylor of Shipley with a time of 36.6s in a Mini 1000. The final entry in the class was producing the fastest practice times, but mechanical difficulties prevented any timed run.

Unfortunately, Keith Bowen only had one poor timed run of the three available which timed him $\frac{1}{2}$ way up the field.

Not having been to Scammenden before, I was surprised at the severity of the incline; being used to Harewood type gradients 1st gear stuff this - on a 3.6 diff. I did in fact manage to get 2nd on the 60-70 yd relatively shallow straight before having to return to first for the hairpin right and left and the opening 90 right to the finish after 500 yds.
