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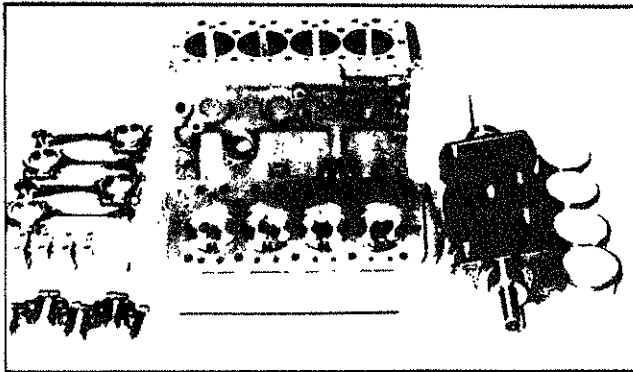


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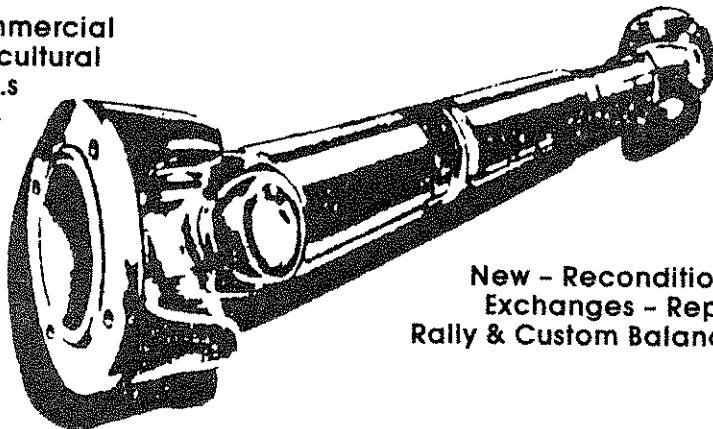

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LIDERSWELL '85'

I decided I would enter my first RTV Trial (Road Taxed Vehicle Trial), after entering a Gynkana up at Grassington. Both events were organised by Pennine Land Rover Club and you had to be a member of Pennine or a member club of the Northern Off Road Club, very similar to normal rallies!

The event was organised over August Bank Holiday weekend, so Saturday morning after getting Rod (navigator) moving we went round to Phil Sykes (Official Photographer) to pick up his caravan and off we went to Derbyshire.

We had to be scrutineered by 2.30pm (4 tyres, brakes Yes, tax disc, passed), competing at 3.0pm. There were ten sections laid out, exactly the same as a PCT but a lot harder; about 30 vehicles were entered mainly SWB Landrovers. These were split into classes, SWB, LWB/Range Rovers, and Specials. We were split into groups of 5/6 and taken off to a section. We started at 9 then 10 then 1 etc. to 8. The ground was very good and we got 6 clears, a 1, a 3, and a 6 (we just clipped the six marker). We only got pulled out once, that was when we got as far as peg 1 going up a one in three slope just after coming out of a dip and ran out of traction. With being classed as a long wheelbase we were allowed a shunt back but this dug our tow bar in so we had to be pulled forward out.

So at the end of the day we had 10pts. against us so we finished 6th O/A, 1st in our class (my first pot!). The official photographer got some good shots so it was



back to the caravan for a Rod tea followed by an evening stroll to the local, a good way of finishing off a very enjoyable day. Sunday morning there was a full trial, this is a lot harder and for 'specials' as well as lightweights. Sunday afternoon it started to pour down. Then at midnight there was a Comp. Safari, very similar to a special stage but the course was set out across a field, and the route made up by putting in stakes and arrows. A very enjoyable weekend and I look forward to my next bit of off road competition.

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COSTA'85

From the start at the Carrefour Superstore in Boro'bridge it was only a mile and a half run out for the start of the first competitive section, a short two miler where Roger Jackson and myself in the Stable Garage RS2 dropped 52secs. The second selective ran onto map 100 then turned south over the very bumpy Pilmoor Cottage white, where the RS2 of Tony Moore and Steve Hitchcock had trouble finding the correct slot, Steve being drafted in at the eleventh hour to navigate on his first ever event. The selective continued via fourteen controls to finish just west of Bulzer.

Roger was getting to grips with the event and we were both hoping that the car wouldn't let us down as it had on the two previous events.

The familiar white at the back of Barton -le-Willows was next and the off-set cross roads at Bossall where a police Granada spent part of the evening spectating. Down onto 106 and through Buttercrambe village, over the bridge and round the loop before heading south to finish at the A166. The organisers were stringing together some nice competitive sections. Other well known roads traversed were Millington Pastures, Thixendale including the village competitively, before finishing just south of Malton. As we came into the final control before halfway we had just caught car 18 in front of us, who then put his car sideways past a line of three early runners parked up, including Mike Watson and Nick Leuchars. At halfway we had dropped 28.08, and Tony Moore/Steve Hitchcock, the only other TMC crew out of six to finish were on 51.44, whilst the eventual winners Mennell and Jarvis were on 20.44.

The second half ran up map 100 to the A170 at Welburn where a PC and SGW were sited on the A road. The PC was unmanned and was subsequently cancelled. After crossing the A road I'd called "GOR at T", but Roger took exception to this and preferred a female spectator on the left at the junction, she certainly scrambled up

the grass banking quickly enough. Next came Cockayne run W to E and fog shrouded in places as usual. Passing through the last string of TC's we somehow went straight through PC H and as a result picked up a fail. So at the finish we were a rather disappointed crew, finishing 42nd O/A, when we could have been 8th without the fail.

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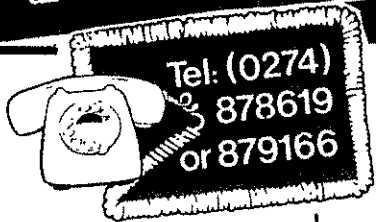









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
