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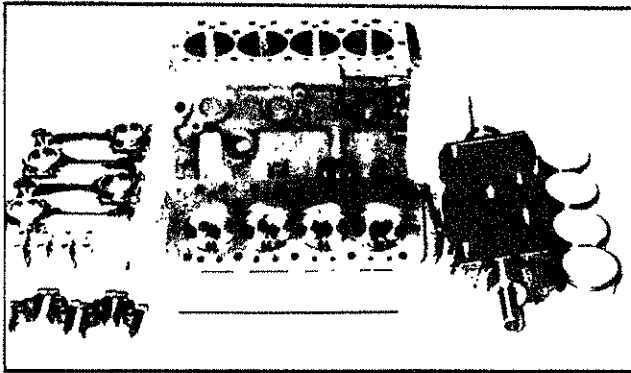


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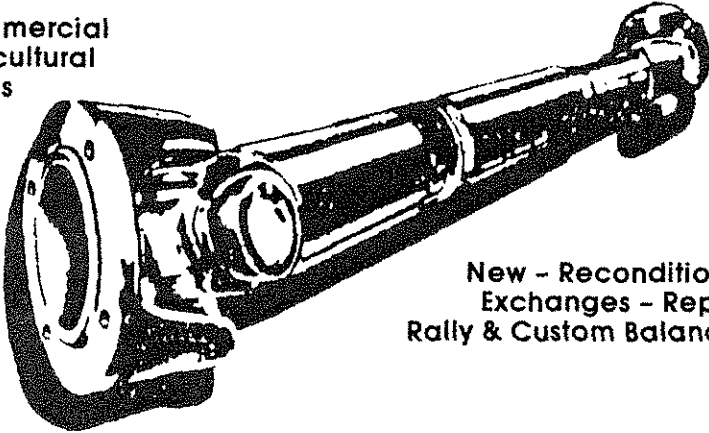

LARKSPEED 85

Following Mull and the South Valley rallies we approached the Larkspeed as second favourites to take the ANCC title behind John Shuffe and Shaun Argent.

Our problems began before the event when our entry was placed on the reserve list and remained so as we set off to the start. John Cope having to travel from his brothers wedding in Wales to the start not knowing if we would get a start! However, we did get a run, at number one, and we set off from Leeming Bar wishing we had a few cars in front to pick out the icy patches!

Sure enough the first selective featured one very bad 90 right on which many left the road but did not catch us out as we picked our way along.

Into first petrol after the clockwise loop east the good news was we were leading by 3 seconds despite a couple of wrong slots and even better news was Mr. Shuffe's alternator was playing up! Our only "moment" in the first half being a huge affair when John interpreted "Straight but yumpy" (leading to Yearsley) as "flat over brows" and took the big one flat in fifth - the first time I've known a driver thereafter to get out and walk!

Second half was even faster than the first as the ice had gone and we headed for an anti-clockwise run west. We again suffered a couple of uncharacteristic wrong slots but the good news was that Mr. Shuffe's Sunbeam had consumed its second alternator and retired.

At the finish we had managed third overall

but first ANCC driver and navigator which meant the ANCC championship went to the final round - the Hall Trophy.

We approached the Hall as follows in the ANCC championship.

Drivers.

J.Cope(Trackrod) 105 from 8 with an 11 to drop

J.Shuffe 102 from 8 with a 4 to drop

Navigators.

S.Argent 101 from 8 with a 7 to drop

J.McNichol(TMC) 100 from 8 with an 8 to drop

The odds were on Shuffe/Argent to win the championship but they had to finish and for the navigator they could not be far away from us.

The event turned out to be a real grueler! The fog was so thick at times we had to stop to see which way to go! The other problem being the flood water which we hit hard and drowned out instantly - yours truly doing the paddling with the WD40 in freezing cold water up to the knees.

Tight timing and a ban on pace notes added to the pressure on competitors, our competition for the ANCC crown obviously putting us under more pressure than Tony Pond on the first stage of the RAC.

At the finish a somewhat bedraggled set of competitors collapsed to await results which showed us 7th and Shuffe/Argent 8th just 30 seconds behind.

So at the end of 12 events in a year John Cope came second driver by 2 points and I finished second navigator by 1 point! I't couldn't have been closer.

Any club member looking for a good years rallying could do no better than contest the ANCC series. WE have not done a bad event all year and learned one hell of a lot. Next year John Cope will be contesting MN events so watch out for this young man, he promises much. Unfortunately due to other commitments I will not be with him - I don't think, when is the illuminations? Just in case!
