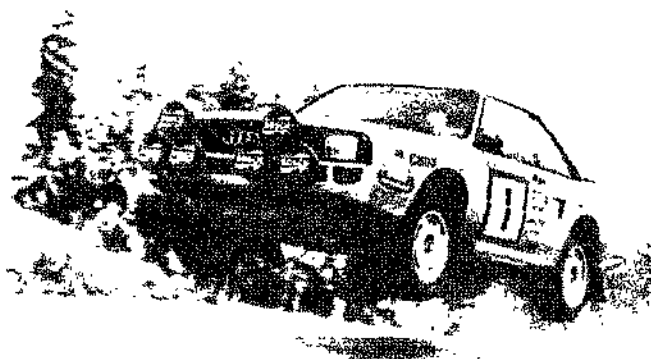

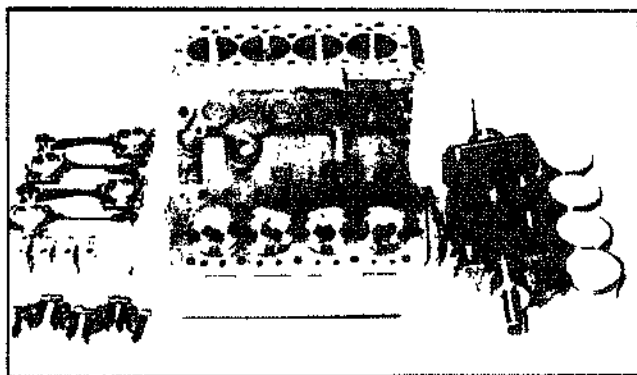

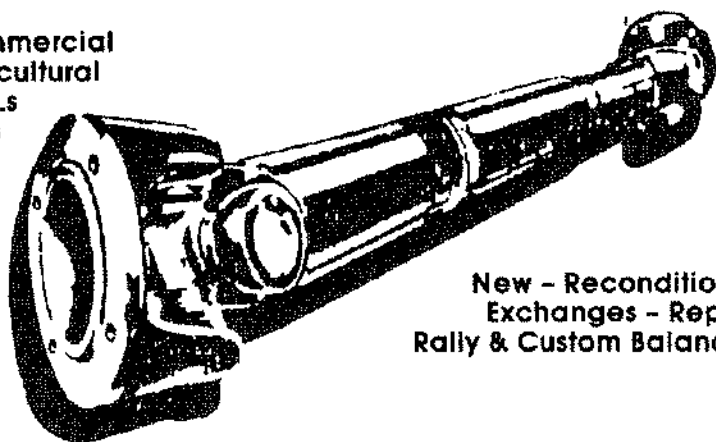

Shell Oils League 1986

For those within the club who know nothing about the League I will explain to you what it is all about. The Shell Oils League is an inter club competition where motor clubs within our region compete to find out which club is the most competitive in the area.

The championship consists of 10 rounds with the top 10 clubs each having the opportunity to stage a round. This in its self assures the club of a full entry on that particular event which can help the clubs finances! Each event is of restricted status and can be any of; a road rally, stage rally, hillclimb, PCT, or autotest. Last years championship consisted of four road rallies, three autotests, two PCTs and one hillclimb giving a good cross section of the sport. All events should be able to be done in a standard car and last years were, all be it a sump guard would be recommended on the rallies.

Each club can enter a team of five crews on each round with the best 3 scoring points toward the championship. Points are scored on a percentage basis so if there are 10 in your class and you win the class then you have beaten 90% of the class so you score 90 points plus 5 points for starting and a further 5 points for finishing; making your total 100 points and so on.

There is a prize fund put up by Shell so the highest placed team can net a nice windfall by the end of the season. The competition is always very enjoyable and there is always a good lighthearted rivalry between clubs and a lot of the same faces can be seen on each round adding to the enjoyment. So this year lets see an upsurge of interest on the competitive side within the club. Events are likely to be much the same; we can usually start well and at one point last year we were second in the championship. However we tend to slip mid season on the hillclimb and PCT, the two easiest events to enter and

least car damaging.

So if anyone is particularly interested in any events which will be in the magazine this month (hopefully - ED) let me have your name and address and I will post you regs for those events. The first is very likely to be Selbys Three Swans, always a very popular event on the 25/26 Jan so get your entry in early.
