
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

It is a popular way of taking part in motor sport without incurring a great amount of expenditure and without having to have a special type of car. Anyone with a Mini, Escort, Nova, Golf, Imp, etc can regularly compete in PCT's. The new class arrangements mean that in class 'C' you can even compete in the family saloon such as a Cavalier or Sierra and have a good chance of doing well. All you need to start in pay the £3 entry fee to register for the championship, and get a Clubrens competition licence from the RAC which costs £5. All you have to do then is to enter the events in the championship, the best seven scores to count. The events take place on Sundays and they all take place in Yorks., Lancs., Cheshire or Clwyd.

YORK NATIONAL - NEWTONDALE

Steve Hitchcock and myself turned up at 389 Westondale after all the other marshals had gone in. John Renny who was acting as Stage Commander on this occasion acked us to go to junction 2 to help out a marshal who was on his first stage rally. Junction 2 was nothing special, or so we thought, just an open 45R into T45R. Soon after the cars started coming through we heard a sound somewhere in the forest of a car bottoming out but thought nothing of it. It was only a few cars later when a co-driver was indicative down the trank that we realised something was wrong. We otherted to run back down the track, it was after we had rounded the open 45R that we could see some 100yin further on a Move noce down in a ditch just after a 900 bend. With the assistance of a spectator and the two ores the six of us tried to push the car back onto the track. However the front was toglow for us to get it over ite top of the ditch even with the driver using reverse gear and burning the clutch out. It was decided to sking the car round parallel to the ditch and hope that it would be able to drive out that way. After a number of minutes digging away at the banking using a wheel brace the car was eventually bounced down the ditch. We had only just not tack to our corner when a blue Chevette came round the head theory, the corner and started to accelerate away when it suddenly veered into the ditch, bounce over a few small logs and regained the track; but now with flapping glass fibre wing. This was turning out to be an interesting day. The sound of a heavy thud from down the track caused us to think "Not again". Steve ran back down the track, his shout confirming the worst. Our stage start had to be dug out as well as the stage arrowing, also the marshalls cars had to be dug off the stage. Marshalls cars were getting stuck everywhere and needed pulling out, including John W. in his van twice. In the end the stage was run once, afterwards we were caught in a whiteout as Steve drove me back after leaving the Fox & Rabbit in the early hours of Sunday, hic! It had been very enjoyable and it was nice seeing everybody there especially since the stage was being run

12 hours early in very bad conditions (even I got stuck across the stage afterwards).


