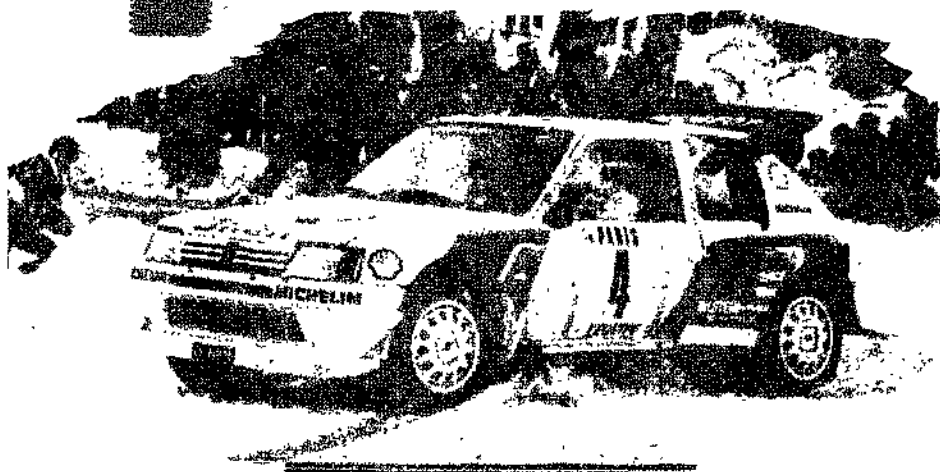

1986 ECONOMY RUN (THE JACKWILL TROPHY)

This years economy run takes place on Tues. 25th July, starting and finishing at the Texaco Filling Station at the junction of Holt Lane and Utley road. Leave 10.00 am on the Lancaster Road. Signing on is between 10pm and 8pm and hopefully all the competitors will meet the result will be decided on the day. (I think it is important to have a sign on at 10pm in the town).

The object of the run is to see how fast you can go on a top gear, no up shift, so you can see how well the engine will be powered by the engine. You will only need the handbrake to stop the car. The organisers need to know the weight of the car (laden weight of vehicle) and the top gear (top gear) and the engine size.

Even though the organisers work in the town, you can go anywhere you want to go. The winner is the driver who improves the result on the day. (I think it is important to have a sign on at 10pm in the town).

Obviously any vehicle can be used (petrol, diesel, gas, etc.) and modified (e.g. 1000cc, 1500cc, etc.) for catered for. Entries available from 10.00 am (e.g. 10.00 am) or John Bean at clubnight, or on the night itself (11.00 am).

WHITE ROSE

A few weeks before the event Tom Whittaker had asked if I was interested, and I was, although I was a bit rusty, my last trip in the hot seat was Mull last year. We started very early from Leeds, arriving at noise before the testers!!! After scraping through at 78 dB we headed into Harrogate for the start venue at Adam Leisure, where scrutineering also took place and we were directed to the car park by two midget marshalls (very efficient).

The once large trackrod turnout dwindled almost before our eyes, 'Scoop' didn't appear, Ken Goodall had engine problems, and worst of all Steve Sanderson/Stuart Bell understandably pulled out when Steve's girlfriend rolled her car after a blowout on the way to the start, but she was fortunately unhurt.

The Shell League team was now Alan Powell/Ronnie Mac, Ion and myself, Jon North/Derek Lee, and Richard Endley/Barry Dove. With an hour and a half to plot the all selective format was very quick to plot, (mistake no.1 - take your time plotting as I found in the second half when a NW approach should have been WNW - losing a couple of minutes).

The event started with a run out to Ferrensby and a short section via Copgrove to Bishop Monkton. The second selective ran from Ripley along the straight to the north where Tom's 5 speed box proved useful, shame about the (publicised) secret check in the middle! This was followed by a police Land Rover sitting with his 'stop' sign on and having no intention of taking any action,

(mistake no.2 - hop out and see what he's playing at before you waste any more time). This section was further ruined by flashing blue lights at 181672, but the Dallow Moor section almost made amends, via Shubbing Farm to finish at Kirby Malzeard (mistake no.3 - make sure your driver realises that those spectators are a control otherwise you have to climb out again and run back). The third selective was a classic (that appears to be how the C of C saw it), it was long and used the north section of Fountains Earth, Fearby white and the Leighton Reservoir road. WE and several others punctured as a result of 'Fountains' and lost about 4 minutes after deciding to stop and change it.

After a short half way at Masham the route headed west onto 98 across West Witton white which (just for a change!!) was very rough, especially in the non-comp section. Much of the second half was then B- road blast heading south towards Kettlewell, with a tricky bit (mentioned earlier) near Lrag, the 5 speed box proving very 'useful' here. The only other interesting bit was a quick hop in the last selective from 98 to 99 to 98 to 104 via the Appletreewick slot at 1850 $\frac{1}{2}$ 600 $\frac{1}{2}$ and along past Barden Bridge to finish at Bolton Abbey.

The results were a further 30 odd miles away so we elected to forget breakfast and go home, even though it was paid for (a dirty trick by the organisers!)

Overall verdict - could do without the police, the whites, and the breakfast!
