Left home at 7.00 for Noise and Scrutineering in Sheffield at 8.15. Quickly through Noise @ 102dba then to a long queue at Scrutineering, passed ok though apart from a tight extinguisher cable.

Speedily through Documentation and then on to plot the route. The Service route to Vince Fletcher while Mark and Darren checked the car over, not forgetting food and drinks from Becky.

09.39 we left the start following the Road Book, mistake number one!!! Second roundabout turn right!?! What they neglected to tell everyone was the first roundabout was a white spot in the road, so we accrued 14 mins road penalties. We could not afford any more time losses now.

Stage A, Rother Country Park. Having looked at the Stage tulip I noted that one 90 right had water on the outside so we duly sprayed WD40 all over the engine and electrics. The Stage start was alright sweeping 90 left to narrow gates, left again to some bales scattered around to a tight chicane - sweep left and left again slight uphill to 90 right. Stay close to apex, water on left, OH YES plenty of water, fresh air, 90 right to LAKE!!!

Stage B, a repeat, then to the Forest!! Woods would be a better description. Service, first change to Colway M & S and quick check.

Stage 1 Harlow Wood, set a top twenty time but very short 1 min 44 secs. Stage 2, Blidworth then Stage 3, "big delay Watchwood". Car 1 had rolled and car 2 clipped it so the stage was cancelled and we all got a non competitive run through making notes as we went. Stage 4

Samson Wood, bogey time of 50 seconds!!! On to Thieves Wood and then a real Forest, 7 miles of logs, fast straight and brows. The bogey time 7.00 mins, at the finish we clocked 6.53. The first good stage and we and several others beat the bogey time. Clipstone 2, good Stage but short, then on to service. We considered tactics over coffee and a bite to eat. Alan said the car wouldn't go any faster but we were in a better mood after my early cock up and 2 good Stages.

Off again for a repeat of the morning Stages, this time with a little more menace. After a couple of 2 wheel antics and hard landings we beat all the morning times easily.

Last time into Clipstone South and the welly is down hard to the floor. At the finish we are 13 seconds faster than the morning and we are pleased. On to the last Stage and Alan declares at the arrival control "This Stage we take no prisoners" Gulp!! This meant a serious bit of calling. ...Straight off the line and we mean business, several 90's and fast sweeping bends to straight. 400 yards to crest, flight and down to logs (big logs). 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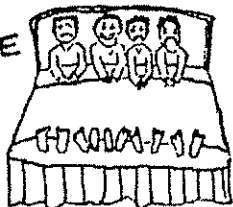
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ALL ROUNDERS QUALIFYING ROUND 3

CRASH HELMETS

RAC MOTOR SPORT ASSOCIATION OFFICIAL BULLETIN

A report was made on 8th June to the Council pertaining the introduction of a revised sticker which would permit the full four-year helmet life but it was thought more appropriate to review the helmet lifing policy itself, it having been conceived some ten years ago.

A figure of four years was chosen by the RAC MSA because if one is seeking to life a critical component so as to prevent an unacceptable failure, one lifes at a point less than that at which failures are known to occur. The four-year figure chosen was, in fact, a best guess to take some account of possible ageing, wear and tear, and possible abuse.

The main helmet criteria which needed to be considered were:

- Helmet standard
- Fit
- Security
- Condition

If these criteria were properly taken account of, it was recommended that the current mandatory three-to-four year be removed. It was emphasised that an element of lifing would always remain in that, as standards were updated, previous standars would cease to be acceptable.

Furthermore, any helmet which had been subject to significant damage would, having served its purpose, need to be replaced. The co-operation of all would be necessary to enable scrutineers to enforce this.

This recommendation was accepted by the Council, and a suitable amendment has been prepared for the 1990 RAC MSA Motor Sports Year Book.

HAIGH BY THE SEA

The Chequered Flag Autotest, held at Bridlington on the 10th Sept run by North Humberside Motor Club was a qualifying event in the RACMSA; ANCC and ANEMMC autotest championships. The remote location late in the season may have deterred many of the National Championship contenders but several did make the trip in an effort to gain last minute points. One regular who didn't have to travel too far was David Haigh who put on a fine display for the keen crowd of spectators to take yet another FTD.

The Leisure World car park is not large by any standard so the parking of 25 competing cars; ancillary tow - cars and setting out 3 test sites put manovering space at a premium, both in the paddock and on the tests. After some initial apprehension it was clear that these were tests to make the drivers think and work hard all day, resulting in some fine driving and keen competition throughout the field - all the right ingredients for an enjoyable day of sport.

Class 1 and Class 2 saw two great battles between Peter Cohen and Steve Johnson, and Mike Sones and Richard Ineson respectively. Steve gave Peter a good start by collecting 2 penalties on the first test but with some spirited driving Steve did get ahead of Peter Cohen, who wasn't exactly hanging about! only to throw it all away again and let Peter run out the class winner on 700.3 Steve trailing by 16.6 seconds.

Class 2 contained another intense contest, this pair were left much to their own devices as they urged each other to quicker times as they pulled well clear of the other two class members. Initially Ineson held a 7 second advantage but lost it all and a bit more with a penalty and a shunt! the pursuit of an on - form Sones followed but alas some fumbled gearchanges meant Sones took the class by a margin of 12.2 seconds (663.4 to 675.6). The strain of three "energetic" tests in quick succession had these two visibly gasping - must be something to do with age!!

Class 3 was, literally a one horse race with Dave Cooke having a day long tussle with himself to win(?) Similar was that of the sports car class with just 3 entries. Size seemed to be a handicap but the agility of the Midget together with a power advantage let Steve Morten take command of the class despite having to replace a bottom hose after coming off test 3 in a cloud of steam! Mortens 18 test total of 723.2 was some 80 seconds ahead of Andrew Cohen.

Class 6, the specials, looked set for a classic battle in the early stages of the event with Glen Simpson (Mini Special) holding a slender 2 seconds advantage after 6 tests over David Haigh (Haigh Special) (FTD 565.2 seconds). When these two are on this form its difficult to say who slowed down or who speeded up but the "master" was soon in control easing away from Simpson who then made some forced errors in his attempt to redress the situation, making matters progressively worse. David Sowman turned up the wick after a stall on the test to overtake both Reid and Wood to finish a remote 2nd in class on 657.7. 4th in class was Chris Shepherd who had the misfortune to break the differential of his Jola special on test six after reweining its internals in the previous week! More fortunate in the retirement stakes was the C6 special of John Pick whose diferential also cried enough on the final test when almost within freewheeling distance of the finish line.

An excellent event despite early apprehensions, held in very pleasant surroundings that allowed a paddle in the sea in the lunch break! and a contest that had local residents turn into spectators after early threats of action against excessive noise!

The membership hasn't changed since last month.

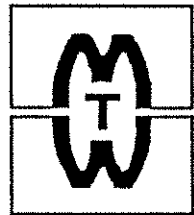

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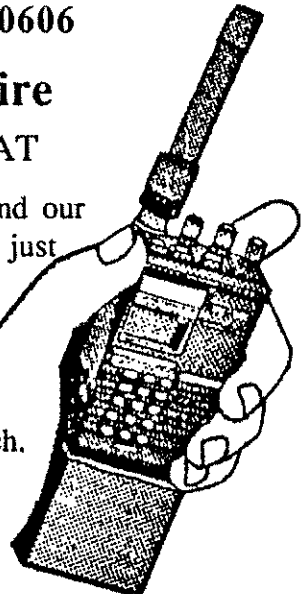
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Words from the Trophy Points Person.

I'm pleased to say that the second word isn't "off". Is there a Trophy for the most-easily-coerced committee member? It didn't even cost our Chairman a pint (well, not at the time, anyway. Maybe later in the year..)

I've received a pair of ring-binders and a box of trophies as my badge of office - I'll attempt to wear one of the ring-binders at club nights, so that anybody who wants to can see the latest positions (points positions, I mean).

Amongst the contents of the ring-binders, is a couple of sets of trophy rules (they do not match, of course, but who said the world was perfect?) Did you know there are at least 18 trophies up for grabs each year? Points towards the trophies can be claimed for almost anything that involves stepping outside your front door - Marshaling, Organising, Competing and Servicing on any sort of event, organised by any club. Next month I'm planning on publishing a chart, or a table, showing the various trophies and what activities count towards each one. The points claim form may come in for a little re-organisation eventually as I hope to computerise the calculation of points.

There's only two things to remember about claiming points:-

1 You have to write on the little ticket and give it to me or any committee member. I won't award points unless you ask me to. (I'm also the sort who doesn't sign for codeboards unless you ask me to) and 2 Make your claim within 3 months of the event. I suppose there is a third rule - if the claim is for participating in an event, I need to see documentary evidence - not only of the results, but also of the level of competition (C,CS,R,N,I),the type of event and which club organised it. The easiest way to do this is by showing me the Regs, entry list, and results otherwise I might miss out some points you would have been entitled to.

Right then - lets see some filled in claim forms!
