POINTS OF INTEREST

Claims for trophy points are absolutely trickling in ! How shall I cope with the amount of time it isn't taking to process all these claims ? Well, one way I've found is to draw the beautiful chart on the centre pages, which explains in an instant which trophies your claim might gain you points towards. Just find the column heading which relates to the activity you've been involved in, then follow the column down to see all the awards you could be gaining points towards - and all with a single claim!

Each trophy has its own set of rules governing exactly what specific conditions must be fulfilled in order to qualify for points - for example: some require the Entrant to be "Trackrod Motor Club Ltd.", some require the Organising Club to be TMC whilst others require that the organising club is not TMC.

Starting next month I'm going to go through each of the championships in detail, explaining the particular conditions and the oddities of the scoring systems.

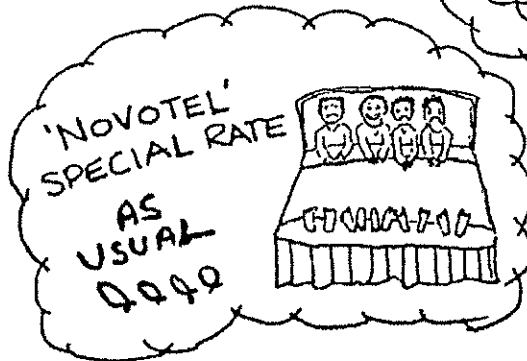
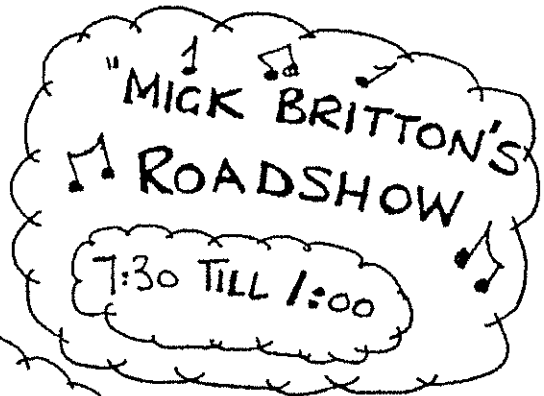

RADIO PROCEDURE

After last years problems in Yorkshire on The RAC Lombard Rally, with radios, I think it is wise to print a few notes now.

Last year the RAC MSA 86Mhz radio net got "blocked" quite a few times, make sure that you know where your microphone is at ALL times. Radio's MUST be manned at ALL times, so two people need to be with each radio. One person can take notes whilst the other operates and so having hold of the mic at all times.

When you are calling another radio, put the callsign of the radio you are CALLING first, followed by your own callsign.

Make sure you use the correct prefix, they are:-

a. RELEVANT - to interrupt, at a break between calls, in order to provide significant information which may materially assist the problem/situation in hand.

b. SAFETY - for messages concerning stage safety e.g. stage arrowing, spectator marshalling problems

c. URGENT - for situations requiring immediate action e.g. car known to be in difficulty, suspected injuries, stopping the stage.

d. EMERGENCY - for CONFIRMED situations involving personal injury where immediate Medical/Rescue services are required.

Use common-sense - do not overrate the urgency of your message unnecessarily.

Think about your message before keying the mike - don't use air time for thinking.

Allways work through Control, it is there to help not hinder.

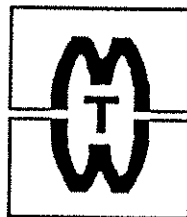

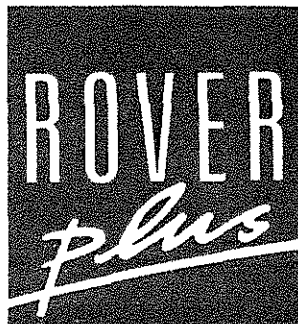
