

Redale and Darlington, and finished at Ripon.





FIRE EXTINGUISHER CABLES

It has been noted that an increasing number of extinguisher operating cables have shown signs of corrosion and partial seizing. To ensure correct operation, please ensure that all such cables are regularly cleaned and lubricated.

MOT CERTIFICATES FOR PCTs

It has been agreed by the British Motor Sports Council that MoT Certificates must be produced to the Event Scrutineer at all Production Car Trials for all Production Cars. This will take effect from January 1, 1990.

CRASH HELMETS - follow up from Augusts Mag

Crash Helmets bearing an RAC Approval Sticker must be worn at all times during training, practice and competition. The user must ensure that the helmet is to a standard specified in the current RAC year-book, that it fits properly, is secured properly and that it is in a serviceable condition. It is strongly recommended that a fire resistant balaclava, helmet bib or face mask also be worn.

The competitor is reminded of the following essential criteria when buying or using his/her helmet:- Standard, Fit, Security, Condition.


Part of the approval procedure is to affix an RAC sticker to the outside of the helmet in the approximate location of the driver's right ear. Stickers may only be affixed by selected scrutineers, or through the MSA at Motor Sports House, or by selected manufacturers, after the helmet has been checked for conformity with the standard required and is considered to be in a satisfactory condition. RAC approval stickers as

shown, for which a fee is charged, are printed on silver foil, and once individually affixed, cannot be reapplied.

HELMET FIT AND SECURITY.


To ensure satisfactory fit and security of your helmet, proceed as follows:

- 1. Obtain the correct size by measuring the crown of your head
- 2. Check that there is no side-to-side movement; a helmet should be as closely fitting as possible consistent with comfort.
- 3. Tighten straps securely the chin strap must be under tension at all times; ensure therefore that the strap cannot slip. Chin cups are prohibited.
- 4. With head forward attempt to pull up the back of the helmet, as shown in the diagram, to ensure the helmet CANNOT be removed in this way.



- 5. Ensure you can see clearly over each shoulder.
- 6. Make sure nothing impedes your breathing in the helmet and never cover your nose or mouth other than with a fire resistant balaclava or face mask. Helmets with life-support attachments must only be worn if they are connected to a life-support system.
- 7. Never wear a scarf, tie, or other clothing which could come loose and possibly cause an accident.
- 8. Ensure that the visor can be opened with one gloved hand.
- 9. Satisfy yourself that the back of the helmet provides protection for your neck.
- 10. Do not buy from mail order unless you can satisfactorily carry out the above checks; return a helmet unused if it does not fit.

RETROSPECTIVE

We hear a lot about retrospective events, historic rallies and the like, so we now feature a column for these events from the annals of Trackrod Motor Club which published its first magazine in October 1970 so we are just 19 years old and we'll be resurrecting names from the past and the antics of our members - yes its been done before but - here we go again.

December 1970 Magazine

On 7/8th November, Leeds University MC had 110 entries for their Northern Lights Rally with 77 finishers. Howard Frank finishing 6th Novice and a Mr Alkinon and John Lee 3rd in the same class in a G.T. (what is not specified!) Paul Siddall and Ken Parker finished 16th Novice. Leeds University also ran an autotest on Woodhouse Moor on 22nd November with 40 entries. Howard White, David Taylor and Barry Spink represented Trackrod. For those who are not familiar with our roots - Trackrod was actually a splinter group from the then Alwoodley Community Association Motor Club formed by six members:- Ray Dickinson, Steve Lloyd, John Wilson, Howard White, Peter Gledhill and Brian Schofield. The first meeting in September 1970 at the Wharfedale, Arthington had the requisite number of 50 members present so R.A.C. affiliation was sought immediately and some of those original 50 members are still with us today - their names will appear in this column in due course.

POINTS OF INTEREST

The most important point this month is that THE END OF THE YEAR IS NIGH. Repent, repent, and get your claims in before next year starts. Although for most of the year you've got three months to get claims in, everything stops on December 31st. It has to, 'cos the trophies are handed out at the Dinner Dance on 26th January. The only exceptions are for events running over the Christmas Holidays, when I can allow 'till January 5th.

Don't forget you can post your claims to me at home if you can't find me at clubnights (or if I don't appear...)

There aren't any changes to the positions in any of the championships since last month; the only claims I've received have simply extended the leads of those already in front.

This month I'm going to go through the first championship in detail. It's the Off-Road Events Trophy. Events counting for this Trophy are PCT's, Hill Climbs, Sprints and Rallycross. Only events organised by clubs other than Trackrod will count.

Scoring is on a percentage-of-class-beaten basis (known as the ANCC Formula), like this:

For all finishers:

Number in your class who you beat x 100 Number in your class

So no finishers get less than 5 points. And you can get over 100 points, if you win your class! Non-finishers get 3 points.

TALKLAND LOOKOUT STAGES RALLY 5TH NOVEMBER 1989

for many years Trackrod Motor Club have promoted three "full blown" rallies annually, each with its own organising team, and each event being aimed at a separate level of competition. This has enabled us, as a club, to have a great reserve of capable organisers, and the ability to "do the job right" whenever called upon. The changes in rules and attitudes towards Road Rallies, however, resulted in the demise of the junior event, the Lookout Novice Road Rally, for a while at least... In view of the traditions of the club, not to mention a spare set of trophies, a few members not connected with the established Forest Stages Rally, or the Costa, decided to investigate the resurrection of the Lookout Rally and after several months of searching unearthed the venue of Melbourne Airfield, also known as York Dragway.

In the early planning stages a major problem arose when the venue was used by another club, who went against the advice of the land owner and Drag Racing Promoter. The result was a fresh set of conditions, which, if not fully met, would mean rallying would be very short-lived indeed at this venue. The initial effect was to reduce available roads, and to prevent any type of "lapping" of the airfield.

Several site visits and late night meetings followed, and the event took shape. The Club Committee allowed the event to be Trackrods Shell League Event, which guaranteed a full entry, and the logistics of actually preparing the airfield for a rally were investigated. Several lorry loads of drums and tyres later, all was set.

The full entry, with all the local, well known names, appeared three weeks before the event. The actual day of the event dawned frosty, with thick fog. The fog caused many problems, delaying both competitors and marshals and causing the start to be delayed by half an hour. However, Chief Timekeeper, Derrick Lee soon put the event back on schedule without any inconvenience and the rest of the day ran like clockwork.

One or two of the competitors criticised the tightness of the several chicanes, which with very slippery tracks caused many hairy moments, but if they were wide enough for a 17 foot limousine, then tough!! The final two stages ran in darkness, again a deliberate ploy to make the event a test of driver skill rather than an out and out power game.

The outcome of the event is now widely known, the main results being in last months magazine. There were several valiant performances by Trackrod crews, resulting in us being 2nd O/A Shell League team on the day.

Reports from all concerned were very complementary about the way the event was run, especially the land owner and local residents, and it is hoped that the use of Melbourne Airfield is secure for Trackrod Motor Club in future years.

On a personal note, I would like to pass on my thanks for all who have assisted on the event, not all jobs being "action packed", but nevertheless vital to the smooth running of the rally.
