Does anyone have a raffle ticket No. 631 from the Xmas Party - its still unclaimed.



ANCC ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS

The ANCC is pleased to announce the resurrection of the ANCC Road Rally Championship.

The Championship will consist of 11 rounds including some of the best road rallies in Yorkshire, Lancashire and Derbyshire. All events are of Restricted status and to be run at night. (Navigational Scatters and 12 cars are not included). Nine of the rallies have road rally permits and 2 have navigational rally permits.

To standardise the Championship navigational methods to be used on each round will be restricted to standard forms - see Championship regulations. Any cryptic methods that might be used on any round must be outlined in the regulations for the event and examples given.

A maximum of 8 scores will count for Championship purposes and aswell as overall awards there will be awards for Beginners ie those contenders who have never finished a road rally before competing on their first championship round.

So swot up on your tulips and herring-bones and register. Registration costs £5 per competitor and contenders are not obliged to remain with the same driver/navigator throughout the championship (each competitor scoring separately in the overall and class).

My first Autotest

I'd done lots of timekeeping on various Autotests and always thought they were great fun. I was charged with enthusiasm when I watched people like Richard Ineson, John Renny and David Haigh throw their cars round as if they were on ice. I thought "that's for me".

Eighteen months later (November '89) at long last, I could afford a car to play with!!

Now, being the proud owner of a wee twelve year old blue mini - I was raring to go. My heart went out to Basil (that's the mini) when I thought of what I was going to put him through - wheelies, bald tyres and a jiggered handbrake to name but a few. My wicked side quickly returned when I thought of all the fun I'd have actually competing in an autotest. Next on the agenda was to equip myself with a knob - I know they're actually called "steering aids" but I think that sounds like a disease. Anyway Alan Larkin (Larkspeed) sells these objects, so I purchased one from him (plug for you Alan - you owe me).

Once I'd acquired and fitted the knob to the steering wheel - I knew I just had to enter the Boxing Day Autotest. However, being totally green, I needed to see if I could actually operate the steering wheel with this funny looking gadget I'd attached.

I found a company car park near Ossett where the Security man agreed to allow me to "borrow" one Sunday as long as I didn't dent the buildings. Anyway, I practised initially with the help of Malcolm Jagger (thanks Malc) then had a go on my own. I ended up with an aching right arm and bruises all over my hand and forearm because the knob kept slipping. This, however, only made me more determined. (no I don't really like pain)! So, armed with three hours experience, I felt ready to sell the mini and take up knitting.

Apart from a tired brain and Basil's bald tyres - I went home with a feeling of achievement and pride. I'd recommend Autotesting to anyone. Its competitive and also great fun - so come on all you "would be's". Who knows, maybe one day I'll be up there with the best!

Sherwoods Christmas Stages 30th December 1989 Car 16 Andrew Womack/Richard Simpson

The Christmas Stages is, along with the Tour of Lincs, probably one of the best and most hotly contended events on the restricted calendar. This years event was no exception with an entry list, which would have done justice to many a National rally. It was therefore with some degree of excitement that I looked forward to the great day especially as the icing on the cake was a run in the immaculate works spec. Manta 400 belonging to Andrew Womack.

We elected to attend scrutineering on the Friday evening so as to make for a leisurely start on Saturday and with the formalities out of the way it was time for a drink in the bar and ponder the event the following day.

The benefits of our scrutineering on the Friday became apparent when we had a relatively late breakfast and drove the short distance from the hotel to the start. This short drive gave me time to acclimatise, which was easily done in a car as well prepared as Andrews.

The opening stage was at Croft rallycross circuit and only 15 minutes from the start. A mixture of tarmac and gravel and as my heart thumped louder the start marshal counted us down. At the call of "GO" the car launched into warp drive "good grief this is quick". This was my first taste of proper group B rallying and apart from the obvious speed I was highly impressed with Andrews control which made it all seem remarkably drama free despite the pace at which we were travelling!

After Croft it was a long road section to two runs round Waith With near Catterick which despite a half spin saw us lying in 12th place.

Andrew was now getting into the swing of things and this was proved as we went into Downholm. The all tarmac stage run by Trackrod, approximately 1.5 miles long, very narrow and with a tight downhill right - into sweeping uphill left - into tight right exit; halfway in.

5. 4. 3. 2. 1. GO! and we did, flat over crest, through the bends flat in 4th, in fact it was flat all the way to stop the clocks on 1 min 16sec. and fastest time!

Both runs over Feldon were taken in similar fashion including two massive yumps on the finish of Feldon 2 being taken flat in 5th!, but again even at these amazing speeds on roads he had not driven before, Andrew gave a demonstration of his skill and control, albeit at the tightening of certain parts of my anatomy.

A steady run back to service in Croft saw us up to 11th place which was improved to 8th after the rerun of SS1 when Andrew improved on his first time by 15seconds, with another fastest stage time, Phew!

Back to Waith With for two more stages on what must be one of the best venues available anywhere. Everything from tarmac hairpins, tight combination corners, fast straights and loose gravel all in around 4 miles - fabulous!

Our first two runs had seemed quick but these two were phenomenal, we beat our previous times by a total of 22 seconds and saw us go into service at Leyburn in 6th place. considering Andrew had never driven over these roads before, unlike most of the other competitors in the top twenty, he was surprising many with his pace.


Darkness was falling as we headed for Stainton, high above Bellerby and the only loose stage on the event. Despite another fast run we were given a dubious time which couldn't check as the finish marshal restarted the watch immediately - Pratt! Another quick run on the reverse of Downholm, still being efficiently run by the Trackrod faithful who hadn't gone home, and two more steady runs around Waith With saw us finish 11th overall. My own personal best ever finish and highly pleasing considering the high quality field and new, to Andrew, terrain.

This was certainly the best days rallying I have ever had, not only had we had a good result but it had been a pleasure to sit beside a driver of immense capability in a fabulous car.

My thanks go to Andrew and his service crew and if I can persuade him again - roll on next time! After this things will never be quite the same again!!
