#### BEAUJOLAIS RALLY '89 (CAR 21 PETE GREEN & ROBERT WARD)

It was here we spotted the stars of the rally, a crowd of Hurray Henry's driving a Damler Limousine. They all wore dinner jackets and were pouring Champagne down themselves and some young French girls. The place to be was soon the back of the limo, where they did their bit for Anglo-french relations. Robert and I had to be content with front seats in the stalls.

(Beaujolais tip No 2 - Do the event in a car with a bigger back seat than the Cobra)!

At 8.00pm, with a police escort, we drove in convoy to the vine yard where we joined the 'shipper's party'. We had not seen the last of the "Henrys", they appeared at the party, drinking wine by the jug full, having food fights and singing on stage with a local folk band.

At 11:30pm we were loading the wine into the cars, other competitors were taking bets as to which of the "Henrys" was going to drive. The odds were not good as not one of them was conscious.

At Midnight all the drivers started the cars, while the co-drivers waited for the time cards to be drawn out of a hat. The atmosphere was electric as 200 cars leave the vine yard within 20 mins. A once posy Cobra had to sit and wait as every form of expensive sports car set off, at last our card was drawn and we were off.

The first 200 miles was a straight thrash up the auto-route. We only had one incident to report on our way to our first petrol stop. # Trackrod Motor Club Ltd TROPHY POINTS SCORING SYSTEM - REGULATIONS 1990

Claims can only be accepted from full members of TRACKROD MOTOR CLUB Ltd. All claims from competitors must be supported by evidence - eg copy of results. Aditionally, some categories for events not organised by TMC require that you were ENTERED by TRACKROD MOTOR CLUB Ltd - evidence of this is also required (e.g. copy of Entry List).

The Trophy year runs from 1 January to 31 December; all claims must reach the Trophy Points Secretary within three months of publication and in any case before 31 December. (Exceptions can be granted for events running between Christmas and New Year - but only by prior arrangement.)

The most common scoring method is known as the ANCC system and works like this:

Marshals Trophy Every event counts - Rallies, Autotests, PCTs etc. Scoring system: 5 points per event

Service Crew Trophy for stage rally service crew. Servicing on any rally at any level - 5 points per event.

FSB Rally Driver and FSB Rally Navigator donated by Frank Stuart-Brown. All road rallies count; stage rallies except single venue also count. The best 8 scores of the year count, with a maximum of 2 National events or 1 International. Team Trackrod is an alternative to having TMC as entrant.

SPY 44 Trophy for all-round competitor, donated by Mr & Mrs C.R. Jackson. Competitors must show TMC as ENTRANT, or be part of TEAMTRACKROD. Events to count are (driver only) Autotest, Rallycross, Sprint, PCT, Hill Climbs and (driver and navigator) Rallies. Best five results to count, but these must include three different types of event. Scoring system: ANCC

Ladies Award for the Best Lady Competitor, donated by CJ & DW Taylor. All event types to count. Scoring system: ANCC

**Hunters Trophy** for TMC Treasure Hunts and Navigational Scatters. Scoring system: ANCC

Willy Wonker Indoor Rally Champion Trophy for TMC Table-Top Rallies Scoring System: ANCC

Scalextric Trophy for TMC Scalextric Racing events. Scoring System: ANCC

Myers Memorial Trophy, the Best Novice Award. Awarded by Committee decision to the most successful newcomer to motor sport over the year from evidence supplied.

Forster Shell Trophy for the best trier. Awarded by Committee decision from evidence supplied.

Chairman's Trophy. Awarded by the chairman's decision, to an all round Club member but guided by the following outline:

- Compete in at least 50% of the clubs own organised events which could include: Aprilfools Autotest, Costa Stages Rally, Mitchell Fox Hillclimb, Wharfedale PCT and Lookout Stages Rally.
- Compete in at least 3 stage rallies at restricted level of which only one can be a single venue and one must include at least some forest mileage.

The Chairman's Award goes to the recipient of the Trophy, and consists of a free entry on one the Forest Stages Rally.

The last section was to have been a straight run up the auto route but with the return of fog and black ice we decided to slow down and make sure we finished. We arrived in Calais at 7:30am with the car and the wine still in tact. Unfortunately we were not the first car back, a sierra Cosworth had been sat on the dock for over 1 1/2 hours, but we had finished and were by no means last. Derek Bell finishing 2 cars behind us!

These were discussed at some length in the recent Committee Imeeting, as I'm sure SecsPot(is that how you spell it?) will show; the decisions arrived at there will be offered to the next General Meeting for ratification.

The two ANCC trophies have been restricted to Road-rallies only, now that there is an ANCC Road Rally Championship again. There are still plenty of trophies for Stage rally-ers to go for. The need for competitors to be 'entered under Trackrod MC Ltd' was also discussed; this is interpreted as specifying your ENTRANT as TRACKROD MOTOR CLUB Ltd. It is common to see entry lists showing two Entrants for one competitor, so this shouldn't prevent you also displaying a sponsor's name on the Entry List. This requirement will now be applied firmly.

Claims have begun to be handed in - I've received some for marshalling, for Autotests and for Rallying, so there's a fairly wide spread of events covered. Next month I'll prepare a run-down of how the various championships are going. Don't forget that claims must be with me by 3 months after the event (results publication) and that I really need to see the entry list as well as the results.


I am pleased to say there were no problems on the day, apart from one of the locals getting a flying stone through a front window!
