From the pages of Trackrods' Newsletter of June 1971.

A report from the Highwayman Rally from the previous month and Johnathon Solk and Frank Stuart-Brown won the novice award finishing 38th from 77 starters. Team Hewspin were out again at a sprint at Topcliffe but gearbox maladies curtailed their activities after one timed run with the box jammed in 1st gear. Loton Park Hillclimb and Richard Jacksons Imp blew its engine on its way to the event and then holed its sump just prior to the subsequent Harewood event.

Remarks were passed about members travelling far and wide to compete being nothing but good for the club - spreading the name of Trackrod, something which we now gladly continue, as this sort of activity is a proven vehicle for "spreading the gospel".

By now a few events had been held and we had our first roundup of trophy points: Allrounders led by Steve Lloyd; Rally Driver by Ken Goodall - yes it's the same one!; P.C.T. driver led by Johnathon Solk; Autotests by Alex Jackson, Peter Gledhill & Richard Ineson (who's he?) all on equal points and the Navigators being led by Richard Ashcroft.

Cohen aims for title No. 3

After 4 rounds of the 12-round A.N.C.C./Appleyard Leeds Autotest Championship the current title holder, Peter Cohen from Leeds in his Mini 1100 has gained a 70 point lead over his nearest rival putting him on course for a hat trick of titles - the first in the championship's history.

The other classes are currently led by Ron MacKinnon's 1700 Escort, Steve Morten's Midget/XR3 and Richard Ineson's MG Mini Spyder. If Cohen maintains his current form it's difficult to visualise a close battle for anything but classes! There are however, a further 8 rounds to go and only the best 8 scores count.

COMMITTEE POSITIONS/DUTIES

<u>CHAIRMAN</u>: Elected by members at the A.G.M. As the title would suggest he/she (or their nominees) Chairs all committee meetings and generally offers "direction" to the Club - passes on all the crap to the Secretary! Organise a monthly open forum. Oh yes, must stand up and say a few words at the dinner dance!

SECRETARY: Without doubt the most industrious of Committee members! - again elected by members at the A.G.M. and is responsible for maintaining full and accurate minutes of all committee meetings - name and address appears in R.A.C. M.S.A.'s "Blue Book" as the name and address for all formal correspondence to the Club. Also responsible for all official correspondence from the Club and catches all the crap the Chairperson doesn't want to do!

TREASURER: Appointed by the members at the A.G.M. to maintain accurate financial records of the Club's activities and present, with the assistance of the Club's accountant, a balance sheet at the A.G.M. Must also provide monthly statements to Committee on the financial situation of the Club. Is also the custodian and co-signatory to all <u>Club</u> cheques - definitely the person to keep the right side of!

EDITOR: Appointed by the Committee and responsible for the production/distribution of the Clubs monthly magazine, from obtaining articles from members and committee, typing, arranging for photocopying/collation (currently Alphagraphics in Leeds), stapling, handing and posting out (address's supplied by the membership secretary) the finished product - a job definitely not for the faint hearted!!

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY - Appointed by the Committee to maintain comprehensive records of membership including receipt of application/renewal forms, cheques, cash and issuing of membership cards. Produces a monthly membership list for the Editor for magazine distribution. Needs to liase with the Treasure and Editor to ensure their records are current.

EQUIPMENT OFFICER - Appointed by the Committee to maintain and

procure equipment used by the Club and to keep a full and accurate inventory of <u>ALL</u> club equipment. Arrange for the issue of equipment to event organisers and ensure its safe return - recording/reporting breakages/losses to Committee. Keeping equipment/equipment store in a clean and tidy condition. Definitely a practical person's job!

SOCIAL SECRETARY - Appointed by the Committee to arrange social events for the club members throughout the year from coffee mornings to the dinner dance! - needs to be able to chat up landlords for clubnight venues and members to organise table top rallies, training evenings etc. Also responsible for the club's merchandise/regalia i.e. obtaining quotations, ordering correct quantities/sizes as appropriate and marketing of the goods and liaison with the Treasurer concerning the financial proceeds. Plenty of scope here to demonstrate all that flair and imagination in motivating members to cough up for another raffle!

COMPETITION SECRETARY - Appointed by the Committee. Name and address appears in the R.A.C. M.S.A.'s "Blue Book" as the address for event regulations etc. Is responsible for the Club's monthly competition calendar in the magazine and the distribution of details of other club's events to which we have been invited. Usually doubles up as the A.N.C.C. representative and attends meetings accordingly (4 per year). Ensures that all club events have an organiser and assistants as necessary and reports monthly to Committee on events to which Trackrod is invited. Looks after the Club's Noticeboard and sees it gets to all clubnights.

<u>CHIEF MARSHAL</u> - Appointed by the Committee to respond to requests from other clubs for marshalling assistance on their events and ensuring that such assistance, once agreed upon, is forthcoming from the members. Produce an article each month for the magazine with all the marshalling commitments.

TROPHY POINTS SECRETARY - Appointed by the Committee to receive trophy points claim forms from members (within 3 months of the event), keep an up to date list of members claimed trophy points, publish a monthly up to date list of trophy points. On a regular basis inform members how the system works. At the dinner dance he/she presents the years trophies.

BIF Circuit of Ireland Rally Escapades from across the water

"Need to think about it"?

"You must be joking"! was my reply to an ill sounding Ian Canavans telephone question, when he was hospitalised over Easter and the Rally period.

Julie Murry and the MM Oils Rally Team with their Peugeot group A 205 was left with out a co-ordinator/chase car navigator, so with one arm up my back for this all expenses paid trip around Ireland, including flying (a first time for me) I said yes, why not.

After Ian's good organisation the schedule had been done and only required a few finishing touches. With Julie Murry and Ron Roughead flying across the water on a Saturday my first task was to check the Toyota estate hire car was ready for their collection and use.

Catastrophe no 1 "sorry sir, no Irish Shooting brakes" (not a very apt word for their estate cars) "but we can offer you a nine seater mini bus"!!!

After many polite English phone calls and various contraptions, Julie and Ron were to be provided with a brand new Toyota shooting brake.

Off they flew to Dublin for five days of route recce with a rendezvous in Northern Ireland at the Chimney Corner Hotel. (It sounded like a bit of a tall story to me)

Anyway, dawn Thursday morning(ish) I was flagging over the old IDMC HQ (that's after a heroic journey as a passenger from Norwood to Yeadon with my mother at the wheel of a Land Rover. Don't ask me how we arrived at the airport in one piece as I gave up looking and started praying!!) With fine clear weather, a window seat and a cruising speed of 9000 feet everything seemed like little speeks. The flight was highly enjoyable apart from the hostess saying we should read the life jacket instructions before she demonstrated them - and no she didn't jump out.

On arrival I was met by Noel Orr who had helped put together the schedule, and coming from Northern Ireland had a good local knowledge, even if the accent takes some getting used to.

Noel and I were due to be meet the service barge and rally car at Larne which was not a real problem apart from the large bang as we went through Belfast, making Noel turn white and go through a red light as I casually said "oh was that a bomb"

We arrived at Lame in time to meet Paul Thackrey who brought the service barge and rally car over - even though he was the chase car driver. He was also the only real mechanic in the team! Mind you it was a good job he was a mechanic as the service barge had broken down four times on the way to the ferry apparently with a blockage to the fuel tank which meant that it had to be kept 3/4 full all the time. We had most of the scrutineering day to sort it out so it should be no problem!

The Chimney Corner Hotel was actually quite good, in fact if it's good enough for team Peugeot then it is OK for us. Noel and Paul went off to check the rally car while I sorted through the maps to find out when and where we were going. That's not too bad on the Northern Ireland maps but southern Ireland maps are 1" to the map and are very hard work. By 7p.m. Paul and I had made the bar and after a couple of beers were joined by Noel and the service barge driver Peter Brown. We had a couple more beers before being joined by Julie and Ron. This being the first time all the team had been together we all swapped stories and backgrounds over dinner which concluded with a list of jobs to be done on the rally car and service barge.

To help the team to get to know each other we were booked into a new computerised bowling centre from 9.30 to 10.30. It's quite incredible what these computers can do, as it automatically scored and replayed your last shot telling you the speed, skittle numbers hit, listing improvements to be made in your next shot but never told me to let go of the ball!! So back to the Chimney Corner to round off the evening in the disco with a few more beers.

Scrutineering started at 9.30 the following morning and running at car No 74 we should have been going through approx. 4.30 but a few strings had been pulled and the car was due their at 10.05 am.

Tyres were changed, light pads bolted on etc. before it disappeared and we turned our attention to the service barge. Catastrophe No 2 twenty minutes later the car is back and it has failed with an oil leak on the newly fitted 6 speed gear box, and unattached hand brake cables -even though it's a hydraulic hand brake.

Order of the morning was now panic as we had test session at Nutts Corner (aptly named) race circuit at 2.00p.m. and had to come up with some solutions and quick spanner work.

Will they get through scrutineering, do they make nutts corner!!


