With the past history I was quite relieved to reach Ravenscar, having finished running the engine in on the drive over from Leeds. Scrutinering caused no problems, apart from me realising just how tatty the Nova is compared to Dave Metcalfe's. All we had to do now was make it through MTC 1 and we had won the Best Trackrod Crew (well the only Trackrod) Award.

Having navigated, sat next to Steve, for the last 2 1/2 years, it was strange being back in the driving seat. After being told to go for a finish (last place again!) the stages before first service were treated gently. At first service the nearside ball joint and strut mount were both very loose, but with no spares at all they would have to last.

We started enjoying it a bit more from then on and were amazed to find that after 5 stages we were 2nd in class, well behind the Nova of Mark Lawn/Martin Dixon. Having rolled and punctured, Tim Johnson regained 2nd in class in his Nova on the next stage, which left us in quite a safe 3rd in class.

Despite complete brain fade on Olivers Mount, which resulted in our slowest ever circuit of the stage and two very worried photographers at the mountside hairpin, we made it to the finish
59th overall and 3rd in class.

Having driven the car home again after the rally, I apologise to Ian at Minitech for doubting his engine which went very well all day. The addition of the GM Bonus Money for 3rd in class was a nice ending to an enjoyable day's motorsport.

Thanks to all involved for an excellent event as usual. DRIVER/ENTRANT LICENCES

The RAC British Motor Sports Council have approved a decision by the Judicial Committee that the Regulations should be clarified to make it clear that a Driver/Entrant Licence only permits the holder to enter himself or herself in an event. The RAC MSA will therefore draft modifications to W2.2 and K1.6.2/3/4, with an additional Regulation in respect of the Entrant.

If a Driver/Entrant wishes to change the driver of an already accepted entry, this can only be done by withdrawing that entry and thus permitting a reserve or late entry to take its place.

RALLY CAR WHEEL WIDTHS

After considerable research by the RAC MSA and in the best interests of competitors, the Rallies Committee have decided not to recommend the implementation of the regulation which requires rally car wheel widths to comply with FISA limits from 1 January 1991 (QH18.13 in the 1990 Motor Sports Yearbook0.

Instead, the existing regulations (printed below) will continue to apply to all cars complying with RAC MSA Vehicle Regulations, and taking part in

rallies up to and including national status. Where a rally or class caters for vehicles complying with FISA Appendix J, those cars must continue to comply fully with FISA regulations.

This proposal was confirmed by the RAC British Motor Sports Council at their meeting on 20 September. The 1991 Motor Sports Yearbook will therefore retain the existing regulation - currently listed as QH14 Wheels and Tyres;

Existing Regulation

14.3 Have COMPLETE WHEELS (complete wheel = flange + rim + tyre) free providing that they can be housed within the original bodywork (including wing extensions) and do not exceed the widths in the following capacity classes:

Homologated FIA Appendix J diameters may be increased by up to a maximum of 2in.

NOTES: Wheel widths relate to the capacity of the vehicle , not the class division.

The complete wheel shall be measured with the tyre at normal running pressure. The measurement of the width will be taken at the widest point of the complete wheel, above hub level.

Steve Mills's exhaust dropped off and time was lost whilst it was secured to the boot lid - unfortunately a flat rear tyre went unnoticed until they set off again - yes - undo the exhaust, change wheel, do up exhaust for a second time (no service crews on these events!).

Chairman Ray Dickinson reported ecstatically on the Tour of Mull Rally (since when we've had a presence just about every year!) and the Dewsbury M.C. rally was cancelled due to lack of entries, maybe it was a production car trial being held at night! 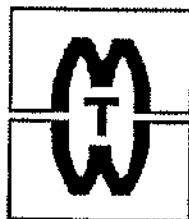
