

1990 LOMBARD RAC RALLY AN ALTERNATIVE WAY OF WATCHING

It was with some reservations that I agreed to the taskof acting as chaperone to the Lombard Chief Executive and a party of guests who would be attending the Gale Rigg Special Stage on Monday 26th November. One of the few attractions was that I'd be there for the first car and did not have to exit the old bed until perhaps 7.45am quite a civilised hour in rallying terms.

The plan is that we arrive Pickering around 10.00am and depart at 10.30 for Gale Rigg. What's this? - 1st car at 11.30 - the poor marshals have been in position for 3 hours (and the rest!!), but no the schedule's right the Rally timetable does not affect the North York Moors Railway who have kindly constructed a platform especially for us at Yorfalls Wood right alongside the Stage!!

The train departs with the rattling of coffee cups and duly arrives some 20 mins later stageside amid wild panic as Richard Harrison is not present with his 4x4 Trooper to take Lombard C. Exec., Brian Carte, to Cropton for a brief tete-a-tete with RAC MSA hierarchy in their hospitality unit. Hence a young Marshal with a suitably parked Fiesta was "requisitioned" and despatched with his load of "Brass", with a bewildered expression on his face, never to be seen again, as Richard Harrison had by then materialised and did the honours for the return trip!! (I hope this Marshal was duly rewarded for his assistance - ED)

Anyway, I digress, pending the arrival of car 1 the party positioned themselves alongside the track (yes they did venture off the platform) though the more knowledgeable disappeared along the track in search of more interesting vantage points only to miss out on the glass of hot punch, waitress served off a silver tray - yes really!!

So, still awaiting the 1st car and two glasses of punch later, I gave the gathered party a bit of insight into stage rallying with the aid of a Road Book from our Forest Stages Rally and explained the principle of pace notes, etc. "So how fast will they be coming past us then?" asks one. Oh probably 70 or 80 mph. "Oh really", and positions himself nearest the track for a good view. Whistles blow and Penti Arrikala blasts into view in a truly spectacular manner and is gone in the blinking of an eye over the distant yump without lifting once. The guy at the front suddenly appears at the rear of the group wearing a pale complexion and uttering things like - "Bloody dangerous" "Mad" "Where's the punch?". As usual the top dozen or so prove to be fastest (visually at least) and thereafter things settle. After about 40 - 50 cars are through the party starts re-grouping for lunch on the train - one or two agreeing that Penti was by far the fastest and that they had "almost sh*t themselves" as he whistleled past them!

The "Brass" decide they will organise a raffle in aid of a deserving cause - 1st prize a Lombard Rally Jacket - tickets? "How many would you like sir at £5 each?" "Err, Err, anyone else for a half share??" It transpires that 72 bods raise a staggering £435 and the jacket is one by Mr Berghaus whose

response to the original request to make the jackets was, "I don't think we could manufacture down to your level!!"

CAR RALLY RUNS INTO TROUBLE

ANGRY North Yorkshire councillors want better policing of the RAC-Lombard rally in future after scores of complaints about this year's event.

Pickering Town Council is lodging formal protests with the organisers, North Yorkshire County Council and Ryedale District Council, claiming that:

- * The rally caused severe traffic hold-ups;
- * Rally spectators and back-up teams were risking serious accidents;
- * Thousands of spectators in the Dalby and Wykeham forests caused serious disruption to people in the area.

Pickering's mayor, Coun. Mrs Joan Taylor, said: "This year's rally was ten times worse than it has ever been in the past."

Rally spokesman Colin Wilson said the event only affected one day a year.


