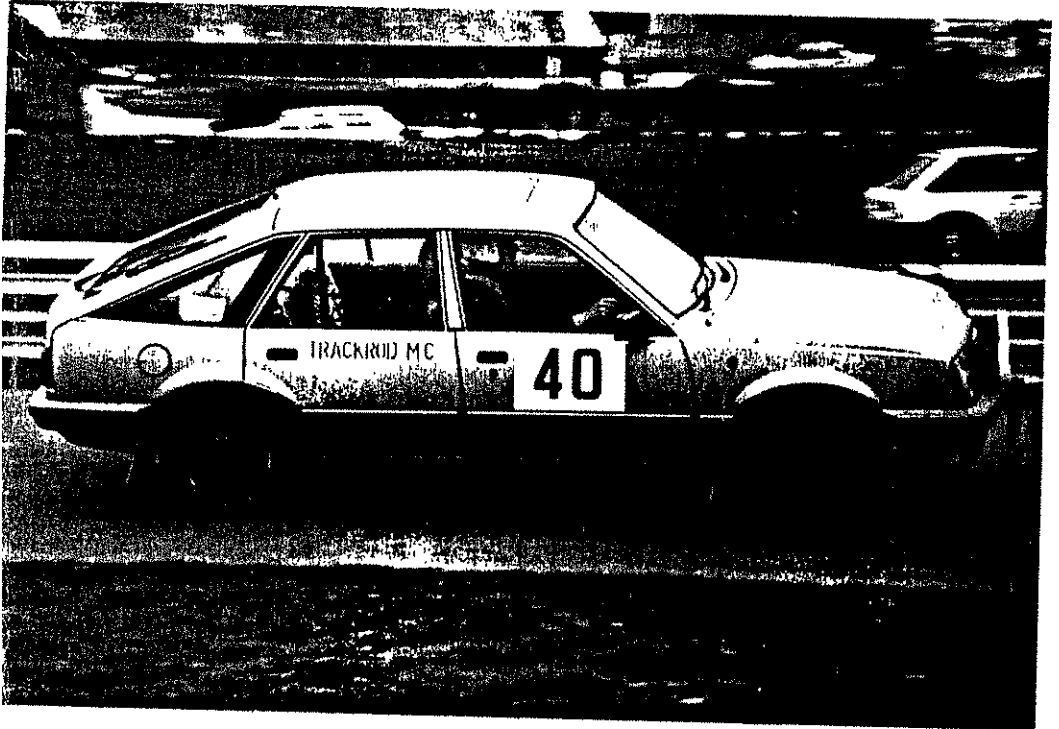

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COLMAN TYRES RALLY - OTLEY MOTOR CLUB

Saturday 29th June saw our intrepid rally team en route to Manby for Otley's first running of the Colman Tyres Stages., My Astra full of tyres (bald ones) and Steve's faithful GTE with the legal set, to be used if the "going got rough". After our magnificent 24th on the Three Swans at Melbourne our hopes were high.

On arrival at Manby, first move, after noise (hello Becky & Barry) and scrutineering, find the "ablutions". Here is a hint for future Manby users:- the bogs on the first floor of the Control Tower are very nice, complete with carpets but the "Trakattack" gent who owns the place gets a bit annoyed if you use them! PLease use the magnificently appointed portabog, complete with bucket at the other side - after all we have only paid £80 to use his facilities!!

Anyway, on receiving final instructions, the stage layout seemed very similar to last year, mostly rough tarmac with a few nice smooth bits, and some farm

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...around the perimeter. Only 42 starters, surprising considering the cancelled event of two weeks before. The recession is certainly hitting hard! Looking at the stage plans, Otley seemed to be changing virtually after every stage, with two complete reversals. A little ambitious we thought, and so it proved to be.

Stage A was very much suck it and see, no problems on the tarmac except very tight gaps between tyres, but with the recent heavy rains we expected the mud tracks to be very slippery and so they were, especially in the corners. We slid off at one 90 right, even using the handbrake the Astra would not turn. Further round a nasty, but normally fast right/left kink, had put somebody in to the trees and the route diverted through the crops, this also proved slippery and resulted in a spin. Nice to see Trackrod marshals here with Tom and Jackie doing a sterling job.

Stage 2 was stage A again, and it soon became clear that Otley were only going to use the first few of their published stages, and not the 9 different varieties originally intended.

Really the rest of the event passed off without any major incidents for us. The car ran as reliable as ever, being pretty nifty on the straights and can pull well over the ton approaching the final chicane, but however, it does have its problems climbing rapidly out of corners! On stage 5 (I think) which was being lapped, we joined just in front of a Cosworth Sierra and Steve was able to hold him off without holding him up - mind you he was sweating quite a bit by the end of the stage and it was our best time of the day! (Must have had 3 Shredded Wheat eh!, well done Steve - ED)

One interesting point, in the service area we were parked next to 2 coppers from London who were doing the Peugeot Challenge, they were slumming it for signatures so they could enter the Manx and RAC. Very pleasant chaps, finished 7th. They turned up with new 205 GTi, trailer, tow truck, additional chase van and 3 full time mechanics, all courtesy of their sponsors, DHL Caners. They had a little badge on their beautiful new Sparco overalls from some computer firm, even he had given them about £10,000 towards their efforts. How the other half live!

By the end we were 29th, and I think we both had hoped to have been better, but the Astra survived to fight another day with only a few extra scuff marks, all on my side I should point out! Well done Otley, a good first try which we thoroughly enjoyed.

Steve may be flying the flag at the Hillclimb, and hopefully be out on the Barkston. I'm afraid he needs a rich navigator for this, as the £300+ entry fee is outside the range of my pocket - unless you want to sponsor an entry!! However I hope to rejoin the crew for the undoubtedly excellent Lookout at Melbourne in November.

Next year is another matter, the alloy rollcage must go and the kill switch must be moved and Steve may have other plans for his vast cash resources by then!

Olivers Mount Sunday 23rd June.

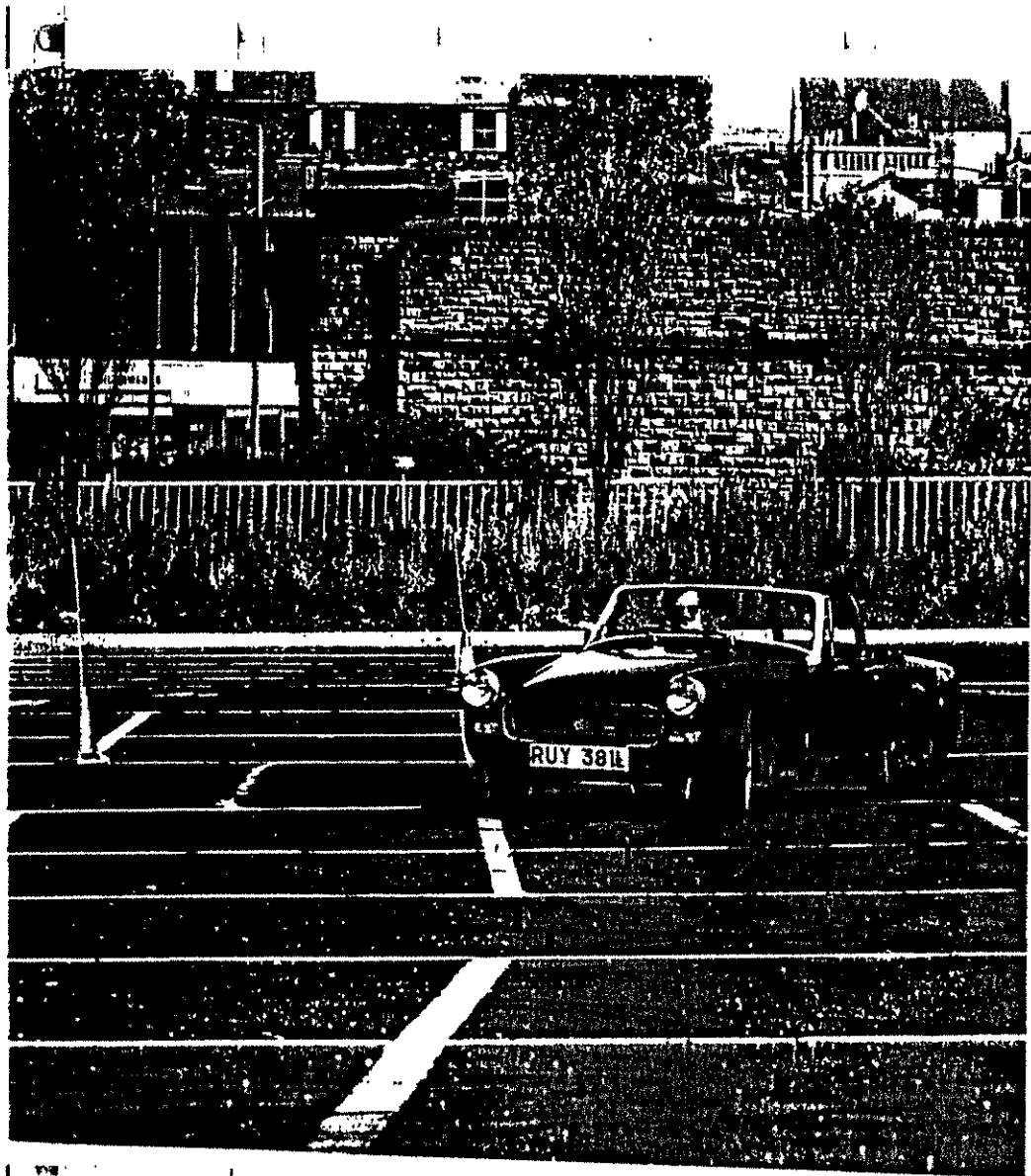

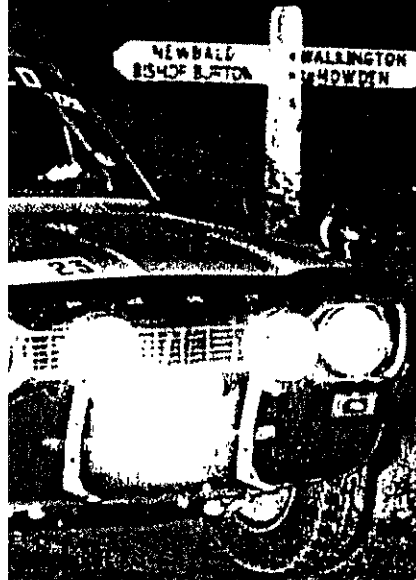

David Taylor reported on the antics of team Hewspin in the Longton & DMC Sprint at Longridge. Apparently Howard's new racing shoes slipped from

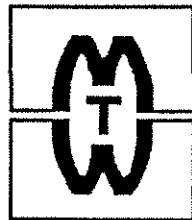
