

Juha Kankkunen thought he had it but on the San Remo he hit a rock damaging the transmission so that put him out. Lancia still went on to win the event though with Didier Auriol driving, but vital points for Kankkunen were lost. The big question is who will win the RAC Rally, with Lancia and Toyota having the experience it seems almost certain that one of their cars should win. But Mitsubishi have won before and the little Nissan won the Audi Sport recently. Personally I think Ford will struggle with poor reliability with differentials, which they still have not cured and a team who are as miserable as pie. Subaru are strong

with McRae, Vatanen and Alen in the team, a very impressive line up but the car needs a stronger engine. As you all know anything can happen on the RAC so I am not placing any bets, but I would like to see Vatanen or McRae win


