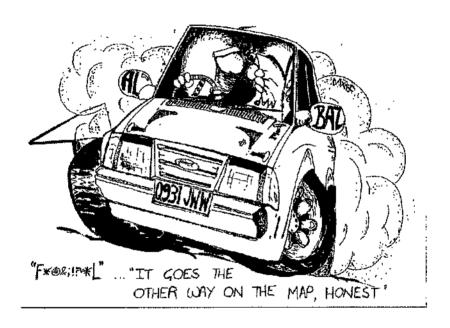

TROPHY POINTS 1992

No real changes this year over last years, as everyone seemed pleased with the 1991 format. An idea has been adopted to change the scoring system which will happen, and that is of moving to the same system as the Yorkshire League or more commonly know as the A.N.C.C. System. This system of scoring will be fair for events with large classes, and should again help "the Trier's" within the club.

Extra points will also be awarded for overall positions in all events as per the regulations. 20pts for 1st overall, 18pts for 2nd overall and so on down to 2pts for 10th overall.

5pts for starting and 5pts for finishing in Restricted Events.

15pts for starting and 15pts for finishing in National Events.

25pts for starting and 25pts for finishing in International Events.

The Marshals Trophy this year will include all Sector Marshals, Timekeeping Crews, Noise Officials, Judges of Fact, etc., but they must sign on with the particular organising club, as checks may happen!!

The Trackrod Trophy now includes 5pts for a write up on an event in the magazine. If more than 1 write up is received for an issue, the Editor will amalgamate the articles, and credit all writers.

Lastly, all points must be claimed by the individual on the official form. No Form - No Points. Forms are available on the notice board and will be put into the magazine this year as a loose sheet. So you have no excuse. Remember the 3 month deadline on claims !!!!

READING READING INTO '92

From Otterburn to Epynt in 2 easy steps.

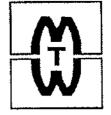
In this chapter we are car 51 on the Budget Cheviot Stages on Otterburn and car 39 on Powys Factors Mewla National.

The two ranges are probably the best 2 tarmac venues in Britain and are normally closed to the public, leading to there being no opportunity to check the pace notes that are to be used. The organisers of the Cheviot provide the notes and they are the only ones to be used whereas on Epynt - anything goes!

Both events have noise and scrutineering the night before necessitating at least one night's accommodation, in the case of Otterburn this was free. There had to be one advantage of being an ex-patriot Geordie, whereas in Epynta bed and breakfast in Howey near Llandrindod Wells fitted the bill nicely.

Our fortunes and experiences differed massively on the two events. Otterburn first, and drama followed drama, firstly on the first stage a rocker broke and the engine lapsed onto 3 cylinders. We had to do the next 8 miler on just 3, then we had ten minutes emergency service time to put it right, no problem and we did not drop any lateness and set off for the next lap, which included a 19 mile stage and 3 five milers. On SS5 a problem with the notes led us to sail off into the undergrowth within sight of the flying finish. Naturally there was only one flying finish marshal but eventually we managed to push the Sunbeam back onto the track and finished the stage.

Again we made it to service where we attempted to get all 4 wheels pointing in the same direction, this we managed (just) within the time but did not have time to re-attach the exhaust. We then had to take a gamble, we booked into the next stage arrival and then set about tying it up with wire etc. This is against the rules as it is servicing out of bounds, but we figured the risk was worth it and we got away with it. (This time tut, tut, tut - ED)

The second part of the event was less dramatic and we got to know the ranges a bit better during the third leg. The fourth leg consisted of only 1 stage but it was 25 miles long (Sounds like Mull - ED), a quarter of the stage mileage so it was not yet time to lose concentration, and in addition it got dark and fog come down as well. The last stage finished with some very fast sections and the car was handling pretty badly leading to some worrying moments over the bumps at about 120mph!Our final result was around 50th O/A and well down in class, however it was a brilliant event and well worth the vote of Best Rally in the National Tarmac Championship.

The new year brought the Mewla Rally on Epynt, the most imfamous venue in Britain, numerous blind brows and jumps have put the ranges into rallying folklore.

The change of date from August Bank Holiday to January 4th meant entries were down to 70 or so but all the top names were there including favourite and winner John Price. 16 stages and 100 miles were the order of the day and we covered these with very little drama, that was the problem really and we struggled to get on the pace all day.

A puncture at an arrival control in the afternoon did us no favours and we dropped around 15 places on the road and we then suffered from catching cars. Even if they pull over you will still lose 10 seconds each time, we actually had to come to a stop on the last stage as someone in a VW Golf who had rolled reversed up the track in front of us and then did a three point turn in front of us!! This and overtaking 3 other slower cars (including a Davrian T90) led us to get a time of 1 min 10 sees slower than the previous time. However we still made it to the finish 35th O/A and 8th in class. Another very slickly organised event and there are very few places as exciting as Devils Leap when you are not quite sure where the road goes on the other side, or when your notes say a crest is flat and when you get there it most certainly is not!! Some people get away with it, we did and were lucky. Lots of black lines disappearing down off the road show that quite a lot did not get away with it,

The next rounds in the Championship are much more local, Cornwall and Salisbury Plain and they are different types of events again.

Will Berics car last Comwall? Will anyone's car last Steeple Ashton? Will Peter Rushforth make it through Imber before cracking up?

RETROSPECTIVE

From the pages of the Trackrod Newsletter of February 1973.

Frank Stuart-Brown resigned from the Committee due to pressures of work and was replaced by Richard Ovenden. Steve Lloyd was expounding theories on our success as a club and put it down to our wide and varied programme of events, much more than any other local club had on offer, does this still apply?? or have others followed our tead??

The Shell League calendar was published, 2 autotests, 2 P.C.T.'s, 2 sprints, an autocross, a stage rally, a road rally and a hillelimb. Richard Jackson was to be our Team Captain.

The Wynn's Nocturnal Rally was run in 8 inches of snow and had to be abandoned at half-way with Richard Jackson/Dennis Dickinson (240Z) retiring from the lead after TC 5 with loss of clutch, Ron White/Mike Abbott (Mini) finished 49th O/A (31st in class). Richard Jackson ventured to Lincolnshire with the 240Z and had a certain Tony Newsum in the hot scat, yes he of Newsum Rally Maps and now of RACMSA fame, bad move really, Newsum's Rally Maps proved to be wrongly "marked" resulting in two fails for WD's!!

The 1973 Mini Miglia was a round of the Escort Mexico Championship and Russell Brookes was out to show the locals a thing or two. The 240Z of Richard Jackson, now sporting Fletcher's of Leeds signwriting, the report, some 3 pages long ended by Bob Bean/ Alan Greenwood being declared winners with Richard Jackson 26th O/A and brother Alex 29th O/A.

New members included John Birch, G.P. Dickinson and N. Liddeli, where are they now?? Ian Wilson (he is still with us) had some 6 x 12" alloy wheels for sale for an Imp/Viva/Midget etc. and A.J. Foster had a fully prepared Mexico for sale (1972) at £1150. Steve Wren was offering a part share in his competition Mini for £130 and the club were offering for a deluxe caravan!!
