Tuesday - Chester/Lakes/Kielder/Carlisle.

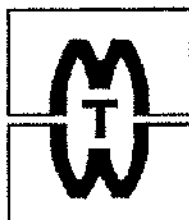
Wednesday - Carlisle/Scotland/Chester.

Bishop Get's Behind Wheel For Appeal

A Festive of Motor Sport due to be held at Croft Circuit on 6th September is to provide the backdrop for the Bishop of Ripon, the Rt. Revd. David Young to get behind the wheel of a sprint car in an effort to boost a £1.2m diocesan appeal that he is heading.

For the first time in ten years, the Croft racing circuit will be the venue for a round of the Cars and Car Conversions/B.A.R.C. Speed Championship, with over a hundred cars taking part in a sprint, racing against the clock over a measured distance.

The Bishop of Ripon who has already completed a London Marathon in aid of his diocesan appeal will undertake a 1600 metre sprint in a modified Peugeot 205 GTI. The aim of the appeal is to raise money for the Church Urban Fund for deprived Inner Cities, Church Schools, and the repair of the Cathedral and Parish Churches. Already over £600,000 has been raised.

Organised by the British Automobile Racing Club Yorkshire Centre and the Darlington and District Motor Club, the festival of motor sport will also include a monster truck, Russell Swift's Montego Display Team, the White Helmets Army Motorcycle Team and the Blue Helmets Army Parachute Team who will be dropping in on the event.

In addition, Army displays will include a tower with aerial slide, mini motor bikes and specialised heavy transport vehicles. There will also be a collection of classic cars, radio controlled miniature racing cars, and many other attractions for all the family.

Admission by Entry Tickets will be £4.00. Teenagers/Students/OAP's £3.00. Accompanied children up to 12years FREE.
