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2 BIT RALLY TEAM TOUR OF MULL 1992

Crew: John Cope/Adrian Gladwin

Car: Normally Aspirated 3 Door Sierra Cosworth

Start No: 48

Dave Orrick quotes this rally as the best in the world, well I can only agree with him. After competing on Mull for the fifth time it just seems to get better every year. Not that the island has been very kind to me in the past, since 1985 (when I finished 17th) I haven't managed to get through the first night.

Which leads me to this year's event. I was supposed to do the rally with Allan Whittaker from Motordrive Seats, but due to circumstances beyond his control, he was unable to compete, which left me only two weeks to find a navigator. After numerous phone calls, I was sorted, a chap from London called Adrian Gladwin, who I arranged to pick up on our way up there (he had done the Cheviot Stages that weekend and had caught a train to Carlisle).

All went well and we arrived on the island on the Monday afternoon which gave us three and a bit days to recce the island. Between us we had four sets of pace notes, two in the notational system (ie. Medium right, Flat Left) and two in the number system which I had never used before, so we decided to go down the island on my notes and back up on Adrian's notes and to my amazement, found that his notes were easy to understand and worked better!

On the Tuesday the rally car arrived with Kev and Richy and they set about the odd jobs. On Wednesday we took it out for a run to see how it would handle over the bumps and jumps as this was only the car's second proper outing, the first being a disaster, but that's another story. Anyway we returned with a big smile, the car handled superbly.

Friday came, and a decision as to which tyres to use had to be made. Me, Kev and Richy went up to Tobermory to the 'EARS' tyre van and I was promptly pushed into buying the softest Michelin slicks and Inters available, the idea being buy now - worry about the bill later! Scrutineering was fun, with an argument with one of the officials regarding the compulsory fitment of

Bonnet pins which was resolved in our favour after the 'Blue Book' was produced.

Friday night was a cold but dry night, so we decided to put on new Dunlop slicks which I had bought before going to Mull, but collected a front puncture at the end of the hill road on the first leg. So much for Dunlops! Swapping to Michelins, we were away again and setting quicker and quicker times, lying 17th overall after the first four stages. Everything went well until the start of the last two stages of the night when two spots went out so we dropped a little time to George Hill, but still managed to finish the first night 12th overall.

Saturday's daylight stages were brilliant, starting with the Hairpin road from Tobermory to Dervaig which seemed really quick and managed to set 6th overall fastest. Next was the hill road, once more we collected a puncture but fortunately it was near the finish so we didn't lose a great deal of time. Onto service, which was complete chaos as the organisers tried to put 160 rally cars and service vans into spaces that wouldn't take 50. We just managed to get out and up to the start control before going into lateness time for a repeat of the first two stages but as we started the first stage I noticed smoke bellowing out from under the bonnet on my side. Immediately I thought the engine had blown, but it was still pulling strongly and the oil pressure was good, or the new tyre was catching on the strut, because it seemed to be worse going around left handers, but pressed on regardless. At the beginning of the next stage I got out and had a look at the front strut on my side but to my horror found a slick of oil under the car. Lifting the bonnet and expecting the worst, I found that the oil filler cap had come off and spread it everywhere. A quick check of the dipstick revealed there was none left in the sump, so after begging, stealing and borrowing, we managed to get some and bunged up the filler with tape and rags and managed to complete the next stage in one piece. Even with the problems, by the end of the daylight stages, we had moved up to 10th overall, albeit over six minutes down on the leader, John Price in his Metro 6R4.

The weather for Saturday night didn't look promising, so we went to the start in Tobermory with inters on the front and slicks on the back, but on the way down to the start of the Glen Aros stage, decided to swop back to slicks all round and carry two spare inters, a decision we were to later regret, as it started to rain proper at the start of the first stage.

By the time we got to stage 3 (Griburn Rocks) I had decided enough was enough, it was time to change to inters before we had a big accident. This Stage turned out to be our best of the rally, setting a blistering 2nd overall fastest, just ten seconds off the pace of Price! Stage 4 of the night was Lock Scridain which went well, setting 5th fastest time. As we approached service for the last time, it was apparent that we would be early, so we stopped in a lay-by and chatted to a few crews, but when we tried to set off, the car wouldn't restart so we had to be bump-started. The problem was found to be the fuse box which is going to have a full design change and rebuild.

The four remaining stages passed without incident with us setting top 15 stage times to record a very satisfactory result of 8th overall and 2nd in class C. Deserved winners were a jubilant Mark and Tony Wagstaff who were catching John Price despite having severe gearbox problems, until he retired just four stages from home with a snapped cambelt.

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
