

LOOKOUT STAGES RALLY MELBOURNE AIRFIELD, NOVEMBER 5th

It had been over two years since I last entered a rally and the itch to compete had returned. A casual conversation in the pub (you know how it is!) led to Stephen Lancaster offering to navigate on the Lookout.

At this stage I thought it would be wise to look at the car. To my eye all that was needed was a dusting off of the cobwebs and a bit of paint. How wrong can you be? After the last event I now remembered that the brakes were poor so investigated and found the rear calipers to be cream crackered! Rooting in the spares pile revealed a set of 1.9 205 GTi rears that had been donated some years ago and after a small amount of work some brackets were made by my service crew and fellow Sunbeam pilot Mark Winterburn of Saxon Fabrications at Morley.

Brakes done, welding completed, trailer borrowed, MOT passed things are looking good on the car side it's a pity the same can't be said for the driver and navigator. Stephen had "navigated" for me before when we ran a course car on the Costa and to say the least his technique had been varied with calls such as "up hill to the top, levels out then goes down again" and "this road isn't straight", how would it work on a stage rally?

Saturday 4th November dawned early! I set off early to Melbourne where the enthusiastic organisers were still throwing tyres and bales around. Once the car was unloaded the small jobs were completed (heater switch renewed, windows wiped etc.) and we were ready for scrutineering. After a delay we passed both scrutineering and noise and retired to the hotel for a meal.

Sunday dawned, icy and cold, de-ice car and head to venue, de-ice rally car and get nervous. Then the mobile rings, the one man service crew has seized the engine on his Renault 19 Turbo a mile short of the venue, thanks to Ken Goodall for going to collect him.

SS1, we're off, "flat to merge, past ditch, straight to 90 right, I mean left" calls Steve! "pylon, chicane, long straight, flat right, straight, 90 right and straight to left keep out, and through piles of soil" this is fun "hairpin right" oh no under-steer! "flat left and 45 left to 90 right keep right" a quick glance in the mirror and I notice car 57 gaining rapidly "b****y tight chicane" move to the right to let him past, where's he gone? move to the left, there he is as I inadvertently cut him up! "90 left straight to 90 right and straight to double 90 left flat to grandstand" God this is quick! "hairpin right, tight gap, flat to merge" lap one completed lap 2 continues in the same style and we finish with no problems other than a l..o..n..g brake pedal that would get worse during the day no matter what was tried.

SS2 is a repeat of SS1 and we pass a car at the first chicane after the pylon then are passed ourselves by car 57, this time without cutting him up! Then we pick up a puncture crossing the "Grand Canyon" at the 90 right less than a mile or so into the stage. No spare so press on regardless! Loads of oversteer but we finish without having to stop other than to let a car past at a tight junction. One and a half minutes lost along with the tyre although Ken Goodall has returned some of the side-wall to us!

SS3 passes without much drama other than a 2 wheeled moment entering the split on lap two when I hit the tyres. SS4 arrival and Andy Cohen asks if we always run with loose wheels! Getting out to investigate I find the wheel nuts on the end of the threads so ... I tightened them! After the stage an oil leak is found. Crankshaft front seal gone AWOL, no spare, top it up and keep an eye on the pressure!

SS5 passes with no drama and we finish behind Steve Sanderson/Steve Hugill so will start behind them on SS6. Attack, Attack, flat out everywhere, avoiding an Escort on top of some tyres and visibly gaining on Sanderson/Hugill. Brain fade causes a BIG two wheeled moment after hitting some more tyres but we close to within 10 seconds through the dust at the stage finish. The gap has narrowed to 40 seconds but with only 2 stages to go, in the dark, it looks too big a margin to make inroads into. Even worse Stages 7&8 are shortened to 1 lap. We attack all the same and, despite another puncture, end up 11 secs. adrift at the end of the day.

Thanks to all those people who helped us get there and of course to all the marshals and officials who cheered us on in the cold and provided an excellent, if somewhat rough, event, I loved the dark bits! Results show us at 49th O/A and 6th in class and I was pleased to be able to match the stage times of the other 1600 Sunbeams, with 5 speed 'boxes they had an extra gear for the straights. Oh yes, and Steve actually smiled!! Now that I have "un retired" there will be more events next year, all we need is a Lottery win and then we'll show them how (not) to do it!

A TALE OF TWO ASTRAS - 83 & 84 THE 1995 FOREST STAGES RALLY

A few years have passed since the two drivers were last in competition with each other in 1990 - in fact the navigators had now swapped drivers (?) or should that be the other way round (?) Steve Hugill now navigating for Steve Sanderson and Rob Buchan for Stuart Bell.

Stuart approached Jacki Sanderson to ask her to navigate but she declined due to lack of funds - to say nothing of experience (Steve still maintains that Stuart was joking) but she suggested Rob would be happy to come from retirement. Stuart was now set to make his debut in his new 16V Astra.

The week before the rally a slight problem arose for both crews as their joint service crew had to unavoidably give backword. However the problem was supposedly solved when Jacki S. and Tracy hugill agreed to drive the Transit escorted by Rob's son Jonathan, I say supposedly solved as apparently they had their own problems (they say many thanks to Arthur Heaton!!)

SS1 three laps of Olivers Mount - great 41 secs faster than last year - oh dear Stuart and Rob were faster!

A quick service at Flask was followed by the hour long delay at the Maybeck

start of Langdale due to the unfortunate accident that befall Ian Tunney. Once the stage restarted Stuart and Rob overtook us - oh dear, is the whole day going to be like this?

Staindale next and we watched the extra power and better traction play their part - enviously it must be admitted. To make matters worse Stephen Sanderson decided to play football with a stray carton of juice whilst driving round the stage.

SS4 Newclose Rigg a good run and leaving the stage we manage to pass car 84 (they were stopped with Stuart under the bonnet), it transpires that part of the exhaust is missing. We proceed to service where Stuart and Rob mange to eventually join us after fearing that they would have to retire.

Unfortunately Stuart and Rob had to retire on stage 5 and leave at the Woodyard.

The next three stages are uneventful, although in our opinion Cropton was the best stage - or maybe this was the best stage - or maybe this is just because the driver had speeded up!

At the final service in Wombleton we wait for Stuart and Rob to arrive which they do in the road car having left the Rally car at home in Kirby Misperton.

Rob now joins the service crew who are now getting out of their seating (they are offended at being called the motley crew)

The final three stages went OK especially Boltby which was a good stage. We have finished (or so we think)

The car is going fine as we leave the passage control and then suddenly stops. We got restarted and than met the service crew outside Thirsk. They head off home, their ranks increased yet again by Amy Hugill and dog! Rob got a little worried as Jacki went all the way to York, round the outer ring-road unable to reach second gear thanks to Amy's car seat.

We finally reached the finish after having a few more anxious moments when

the car stops again.


