

ARMSTRONG MASSEY

VIKING TOUR 7th JULY, 1996

CAR 18

Sundaymorning 5am, a rather bleary eyed run out to Beverly for scrutineering at Armstrong Massey Rover Garage, signing on and backto the carto look through the road book, the road book showed 3 new stages, one at Holme on

Spalding Moore and two at Escrick near York, plus theusual blast around the superb Elvington air field.

09:18amputi up to the main time control (MTC1) and head of to SS1 Beacon Hill, a 2.7 miler round a farmtrack, into ATC1 helmets on pull up to the start..... 5 4.3.2.1 GO flat 500 to tight "K" left and immediate 90 left, 500 90 right over dyke 400 big bump and 400 90 right over dyke flat 500 caution over bumps to 90 left and 50 to 90 left caution building on exit! 400 90 left 200 90 right over bump 200 up hill fast "K" right and long "K" left, caution telegraph pole on exit, 400 very tight 90 right and 90 left to finish...... No problems to report on SS1 but it was very dusty and the marshals deserved a medal for their efforts.

SS2Hollcars, 28 junctions in 3.75 miles of very narrow and slippy woodland just of the A19 at Escrick no problems except being over cautious on the narrow bits. SS3 Escrick, 1.6 miles in the grounds of a private school on good quality gravel and tarmac, again no problems except junction 5 when we had a bit of a moment on the incredibly tight hairpin right, Service was at Elvinoton before SS4/SS5 two identical stages 6.4 miles in tength run backto back. A tidy run around sawus catchand pass two cars, backto service remove slicks and refit gravel tyres for SS6/SS7 Hollcars 2 and Escrick 2, again no problems and thintenm results showed us just outside the top tensowe must have been doing some thing right.

Backto Elvington for second service, where the carwas given a quick spanner check and some veryworn looking races were litted, the heat and those long fast Elvington comers were taking their toll on the brakes and tyres. SS8/SS9 two 8.1 milers around Elvington, after about 5 minutes the brakes were beginning to fade quite bactly making the chicanes interesting, after SS9 back to service and a look at the brakes which revealed that the bleed nipple caps had melted and run down the calipers (no wonder the brakes were fading).

Off to SS10 BeaconHill 2we were now running 7th on the road as the pressures of the day saw off many a competitor, SS10 was a reversal of the morning stage and was drama free so a steady run to the finish at Brantingham Park for a welcome drink and the results which showed us 12th overall and only 30 seconds off the top 10!!!!!!.

Thanks to Jim and Jason for the servicing and also doing the chase car, well done to Beverly and Buccaneer Motor Club for putting on an extremely well run and imaginative event "We'll be backnext year"
