What a start we have had to the running of our event! We were asked to help Bolton le Moors on their event, The Neil Howard Memorial Stages.

As part of the agreement we had with the landowner at Melbourne, prior to running any further events a permanent barrier around the pig pens was to be erected. When we got there on the Saturday there was no such barrier. We worked all day Saturday setting up the rally and they used hay bales to line the pig pens.

On Sunday the day of the event Mr Rowbottom (the landowner) came and inspected the barrier (half an hour before the first car was due to start) he decided the barrier was not adequate protection for his pig pens so the rally could not run past there.

It was then all hands on deck to rearrange the stages to avoid that area. Some stages were shortened significantly, but with the help of the MSA steward (Nigel Drayton) and the rest of the team the event did actually run.

It was all a bit of a farce but that's what happens when you don't keep to agreements! So to run our event we have to make sure this barrier is complete. We have acquired some used Armco from Tom Whitaker at Morley Waste Traders. Andy Turnbull, Derek Lee and myself went to collect a few lengths on Saturday 30th so we took 4 sections over to Melbourne airfield to measure up and plan joins, posts etc.

All 3 clubs that run an event at Melbourne have put money into the venue, which went towards new tarmac on the barn road. So we now need to ensure we continue events.

Through the next few years we will be putting a lot of work into the venue and we will need a lot of manpower to make this possible, all help will be appreciated.

COOKSON UNVEILS TWO-YEAR PLAN TO WIN BRITISH RALLY CHAMPI-ONSHIP

Saltash IT Director Alan Cookson and co driver Julian Wilkinson from Tunbridge Wells are planning to contest the MSA British Rally Championship for the first time in 2010 in their newly acquired ex-Nasser Al-Attiyah Subaru N15.

Cookson and Wilkinson have a two-year plan to contest the BRC series, after securing extra backing from long-term sponsors Wiseman Dairies, Kick Energy and SPAR, who all felt the BRC offered the perfect stage and increased exposure for their brands. The pair has also secured other extra help from long-term backers Cuisine de France, Olverelectrical.com, Uno Retail Solutions, and they have also secured help from TEG Sport team backers, Speedline Wheels, Schroth and Cobra Seats to ensure the budget is in place to contest the complete series.

They will run as a satellite team for TEG Sport, the current British Rally Team Champions, in their now familiar 'cow liveried' car, alongside the other two TEG Sport run and Pirelli-backed Subaru N15s, which will be piloted by current British Raily Champion and Pirelli Star driver winner, Keith Cronin, and Euan Thorburn, who had a fantastic first year on the BRC in 2009. Alan said: "This is the biggest opportunity we have ever had in rallying and to be able to get involved with such a great team that is run so professionally as a third car, is just fantastic for both Julian and I, and we really can't wait for the season to get underway in March in Wales on the Bulldog International, Our first event will be the Malcolm Wilson Rally in early March where we will run alongside the other two Pirelli-backed cars to ensure everyone is happy with how the team will work. We don't have any illusions that we can go out and match the pace of our team-mates, firstly we have a left hand drive rally car now to get used to, and secondly, they are very experienced at this level, and it's certainly very different to what we have been used to for the last two years rallying a WRC Subaru on the ANCRO series."

Alan continued: "We are confident that we can learn from drivers like Keith and Euan this year, in terms of both set up and pace noting etc, as they clearly have the pace and experience at this level and I'm sure with TEG Sport running the car it will be a reliable package so hopefully we can be consistent and repay the team's faith in asking us to join them. We also hope to net them some top ten results along the way in what is shaping up to be a very competitive year on the BRC, before a maximum attack next year when we have familiarised ourselves to the events in the series."

The pair are also hoping to contest an IRC event in Europe if the budget can be raised over the next few months as negotiations are ongoing with potential sponsors.


RETROSPECTIVE


