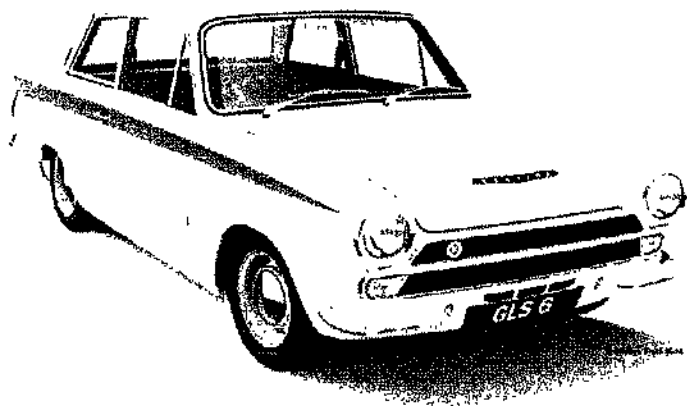

They are running Clipstone South, the stage will be run twice, first car at 10:17 and then again at 14:41 with course closer due at approx 17:43.

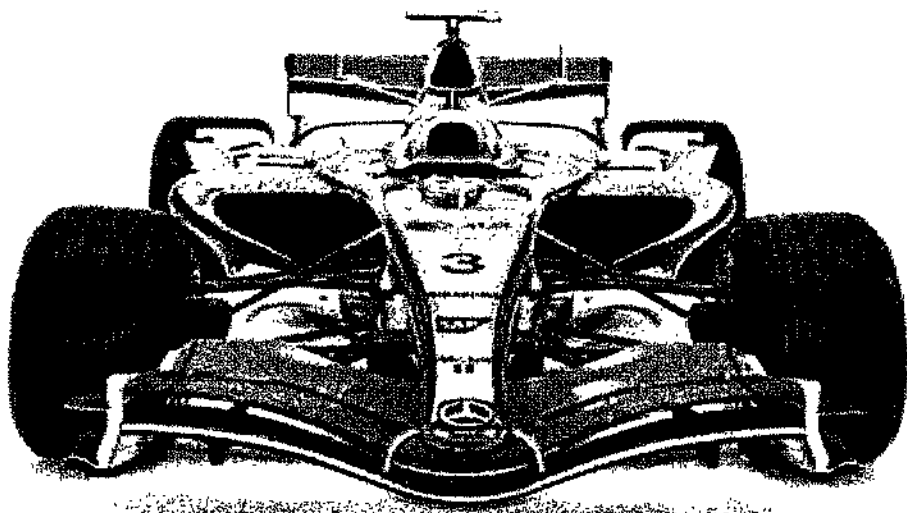

Committee nominations please

The MSA is seeking nominations to fill vacancies on the Specialist Committees which represent the interests of the various disciplines of motor sport. The Specialist Committees, covering Autotest, Cross Country, Historics, Karting, Race, Rallies, Speed Events and Trials, meet two or three times a year, normally at Motor Sports House to discuss and debate new regulations and other issues. The decisions and minutes are communicated via the Committee Chairmen to the next MSA Council meeting for approval.

All applicants must be a member of an MSA-recognised motor club or Regional Association, which must support the application. There are no formal qualifications required other than experience in motor sport. The roles are voluntary, although expenses will be paid to cover travel to meetings at Motor Sports House, and the appointments are normally for a three-year term.

Anyone interested in applying should submit a brief outline of their motor sport involvement and achievements to the sponsoring MSA-registered club or Regional Association, together with name, address, contact details and any relevant qualifications. The club or association will forward the application to Andrea Wren at Motor Sports House, Riverside Park, Colnbrook, SL3 0HG.

As applications are considered for the limited number of positions available each year, the MSA would encourage those who may have applied before but not been successful, to consider reapplying this year.

Applications must be received before the end of June 2010.

GoMotorsport.tv

The MSA is pleased to announce the creation of GoMotorsport.tv and invites MSA-registered clubs to make use of this exciting new facility.

Designed to bring video footage of UK club motor sport together under one banner, GoMotorsport.tv provides all clubs with the opportunity to have their own dedicated video webpage, on which they can upload footage of their events free of charge. Each page is fully customisable to show the club logo, include introductory text about the club and a link to the club's own website.

"It is similar to having your own YouTube channel," confirms MSA Chief Executive, Colin Hilton, "but the difference lies in the collective power of bringing the clubs together under one banner to showcase club motor sport. The quality will vary between events from amateur to professional post-produced programming, but that will be part of the attraction."

To register for the service, club officials should email tv@msauk.org detailing the club name and their personal contact details to request a username and password. Please note that login details will only be supplied to club officials.

Club Child Protection Officer applications

Since the end of 2009, the method by which the MSA processes Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) Disclosure applications has changed, with the administration of this function now undertaken on its behalf by TMG CRB based in Nottingham. TMG is highly experienced in this area, undertaking in excess of 200,000 checks a year. It provides this service to many other sporting governing bodies (including the Football Association, the England Cricket Board and the Rugby Football Union).

All Club Child Protection Officer applications should continue to be made to the MSA using the standard form. The MSA will verify the request and forward it to TMG for processing. The MSA will then be provided with the results of the disclosure applications and be responsible for taking any actions as may be appropriate. Thanks to the support of the British Motor Sports Training Trust, this service will remain free of charge for volunteer officials.

The MSA will also provide to TMG on a regular basis the names of those MSA Licensed Officials whose existing disclosure is due for renewal. This will take place as previously indicated in a broadly three-year rolling period.

News from the Rally Yorkshire 2010

Press release date: Thursday 15th April 2010

Scarborough hosts Rally Yorkshire

Following enthusiastic support by the Borough Council, the 2010 International Rally Yorkshire will be based in the resort town of Scarborough for the first time in 25 years on Friday 24th and Saturday 25th September.

Bringing an estimated £3m to the local economy over the weekend, Scarborough will host the rally's start, finish, headquarters and service area, from where up to 180 competitors will head into the fabulous Yorkshire forests for a unique experience in British rallying. In addition to the boost to the local businesses, the event will portray the host town and region on television, which will broadcast around the world.

"Scarborough is a very suitable location for an international rally and we wanted to expose rallying to a greater audience by bringing the show into town," said clerk of the course Rod Parkin from Trackrod Motor Club. "There will be a great atmosphere around the town, the service area will be based along Marine Drive and the ceremonial starts and finishes will be on the sea front."

Rally Yorkshire will again be a round of many national and regional championships and will be the final round of the Dulux Trade MSA British Rally Championship. In a new development, contenders in the British Isles' premier rally championship will tackle a 20-mile forest stage on Friday evening (24 September) ahead of the main competition on Saturday.

Running alongside the Dulux Trade BRC contenders will be competitors in the Mitsubishi Ralliart Evolution Challenge, Citroën Racing Trophy UK, Fiesta SportTrophy and Swift Sport Cup as well as the BRC Challenge and Fiesta SportChallenge.

Mark Taylor, DTBRC manager said: "The move is great news for everyone involved and I am delighted that Scarborough and the Council have embraced this world renowned series. Scarborough will provide a unique seaside backdrop for the final round of the Dulux Trade MSA British Rally Championship. This event will provide a major boost for businesses and hoteliers at the end of the holiday season. Discussions are now taking place to secure Scarborough as the host venue beyond this first year and if this comes off, it would be a major coup for the popular resort."

As well as the final round of the Dulux Trade BRC, the rally will also form the final rounds of the Dunlop/WONAGO.com MSA British Historic, MSA English and MSA Gravel Rally Championships. The range of individual events will vary from 45-stage mile rallies for the historic and clubmans contenders, to over 90 miles of action for the DTBRC competitors. The historic event will include rounds of the Motoscope HRCR Northern Historic Rally Championship, HRCR Historic Stage Rally Challenge, HRCR Mini Cup and the Association of North Western Car Clubs Historic Stage Rally Championship.

Brian Bennett, Head of Tourism and Culture said: "Scarborough Borough Council is very pleased to be hosting the Yorkshire round of the British Rally Championship. This two-day rally is a superb addition to our diverse events programme and will look spectacular based on Marine Drive with its stunning backdrop. It will be great for Scarborough, as it will attract several thousand spectators and over 1000 drivers, crew, organisers and officials. We are now attracting a lot of exciting and varied sporting and cultural events to the area which demonstrates the value of the recent Urban Renaissance inward investment."

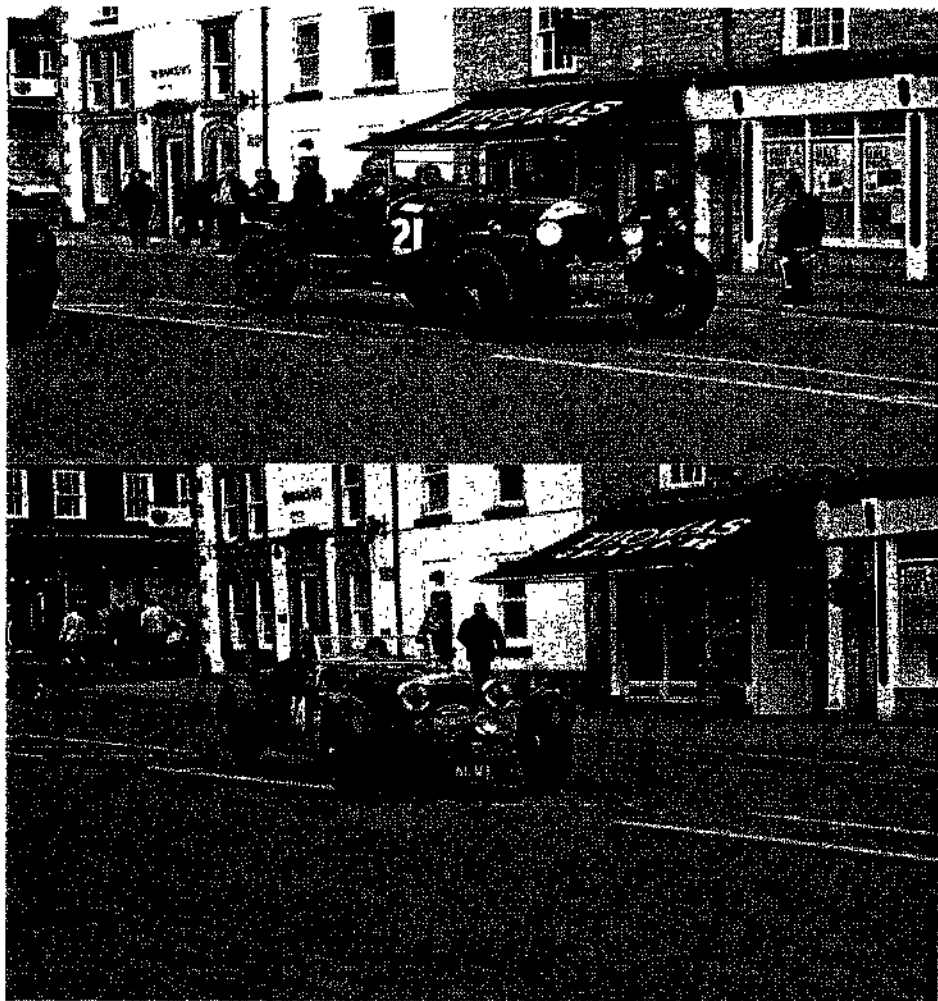
