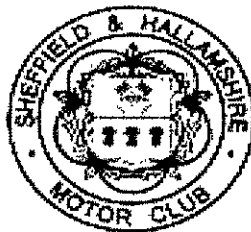

Evans wins Pirelli rally 2010

The sting in the tail of the Pirelli International Rally, the second round of the Dulux Trade MSA British Rally Championship, promoted Gwyndaf Evans and Chris Patterson to the top step of the podium in their JRM-run Mitsubishi Evo X, Evans' first win on the event since 1998 when he was victorious in a two wheel drive Ibiza.

The final stage of event proved disastrous for the reigning champions Keith Cronin and Barry McNulty who stopped 200 yards from the end of the finish boards, having led the event from the first stage on Friday. The Pirelli TEG Sport car ground to a halt as a result of damage to the wiring loom caused by a flailing puncture.

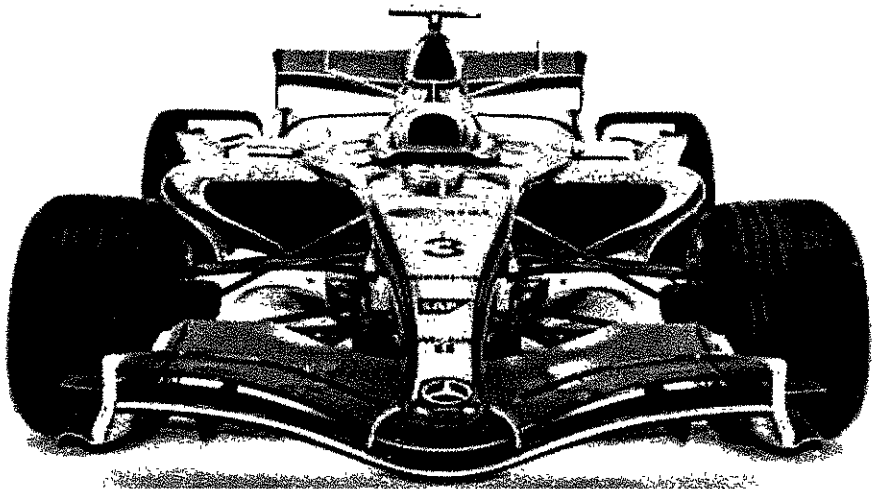
Craig Breen and Gareth Roberts also dropped time in the final stage with a puncture on their Fiesta S2000, having taken a string of fastest stage times and closed to within 4.7 seconds of Evans. The Irishman dropped over two and a half minutes, but maintained a podium place, albeit third behind the astonished Jonny Greer and Dai Roberts.

Greer's event has been pretty uneventful apart from losing a tooth from fifth gear on Friday night, proving that a consistent and tidy approach pays dividends in the end. With the gearbox replaced the young Northern Irish driver's approach not only gave him his best ever BRC result, but also puts him at the top of the Dulux Trade MSA British Rally Championship and as an added bonus also heads the Mitsubishi Ralliart Evolution Challenge UK.

An excellent fourth place by Daniel Sigurðarson and sister Ásta Sigurðardóttir means that JR Motorsports leapfrog both Pirelli TEG Sport and Ramsport to lead the Dulux Trade MSA British Teams' Rally Championship

Button Criticises Ferrari orders

Jenson Button has joined the growing chorus of criticism regarding team orders that may yet result in severe sanctions being taken against Ferrari.

The famous Maranello marque were yesterday punished for fixing the German Grand Prix by stewards who fined them 100,000 US dollars. The matter, however, has been referred to the World Motor Sport Council who, if they choose to pursue the case, have unlimited powers of punishment at their disposal.

Speaking to Press Association Sport, Button said: "Personally I think team orders in Formula One are wrong, in any motor sport category, although sometimes they are inevitable. We all want to win, and every team wants to win, both the constructors' and drivers' championships. But they have to give both drivers the same opportunity to do so."

The incident that saw coded messages being passed to Felipe Massa that eventually resulted in him slowing to allow team-mate Fernando Alonso to pass and claim victory left a bitter taste in the mouth and infuriated millions of Formula One fans worldwide.

Button added: "This was very early in the season. How early is it going to start in the future?"

For any driver given the message 'your team-mate is faster', as was the case on Sunday to Massa from his race engineer Rob Smedley, the natural reaction is speed up, not slow down.

"If I was told my team-mate is faster, I would think my team-mate is faster, so I would keep driving and hope he doesn't overtake me," added Button.

Echoing his team-mate's sentiments, championship leader Lewis Hamilton said: "My reaction would be to go faster, that I need to find the time.

"For me if my engineer came across the radio, and just because I know how things are in our team, the message would be 'Jenson's faster, you've got to find time in the first and second sector'.

"As simple as that, which means pick up the pace if you can. It's encouraging rather than telling you. It's a lot different."

VCC DIAMOND JUBILEE EVENT – 60 GLORIOUS YEARS
1ST – 5TH AUGUST 2010

Dear Veteran Car Club member,

You are invited to join us for this really special event to celebrate 60 years of the North Eastern Division. We have a packed programme for you with one or two special items to make this event even more interesting.

The event is based at the Old Swan Hotel in Harrogate, this will be the rally headquarters. The Old Swan has recently undergone a £3.5 million refurbishment, it is conveniently situated and close to the shops, the Turkish Baths and the Royal Hall which has also recently been refurbished to the tune of £20 million.

On Wednesday 4th August we will be having a special Black Tie Gala dinner with dancing to 50s and 60s style music, with a first class band to mark this special event. Any non residents may attend tickets will be £25.00 per person.

The Old Swan Hotel has been the spiritual home of the VCC and was used for the rally 60 years ago in 1950; we hope to have as many cars as possible to attend this Jubilee event that attended way back in 1950.

Day One 1st August, arrive in your own time, why not take a stroll in the peaceful private gardens of the Hotel in the heart of Harrogate. Our event coincides with the historic commercial vehicle run known as the Transpennine held annually and runs from Manchester to the Oatlands Stray in Harrogate. Vehicles start arriving from midday and finishing at 4.45 pm. Why not have a ride onto the famous Harrogate Stray to watch this event.

Day Two 2nd August. Our first day of motoring takes us through historic stone villages with the route carefully prepared for the smaller cars and a route for the larger cars. After the team-mate collisions and confusion of Turkey and the Red Bull wing row at Silverstone, another intra-team controversy dominated the German Grand Prix weekend, as Felipe Massa moved aside to let his Ferrari team-mate Fernando Alonso take victory. Such an exchange was logical given their championship positions, but with all forms of team orders technically banned, the incident sparked a furore and a fine and FIA referral from the stewards. That at least moved the spotlight on from Red Bull, whose Silverstone spat remained a big talking point at Hockenheim until Ferrari handily provided something new to talk about. Both teams were then involved in the latest technical intrigue, with question marks over potentially flexible front wings. There was controversy in IndyCar as well, with Helio Castroneves abruptly stripped of Edmonton victory when he was adjudged to have blocked Will Power, which meant the win went to Scott Dixon, whose Ganassi team was already celebrating a Brickyard 400 NASCAR win with Jamie McMurray.



Round 4 - The Pro-Art Signs Swansea Bay Rally - Saturday 17th
July 2010

SWANSEA BAY RALLY POSTPONED

The Pro-Art Signs Swansea Bay Rally, which was due to take place on 17th July in the forests around Resolven and Rhondda in South Wales, has been postponed.

Part of the route that is traditionally followed by competitors in this annual event goes through Welsh Assembly Government woodlands that are affected by the recent outbreak of the tree disease caused by the *Phytophthora ramorum* (*P. ramorum*) infection.

P. ramorum can be spread by tree needles and soil clinging to people or vehicles and, as the cars would travel between infected woodlands and uninfected areas several times during the course of the rally, there would be a high risk of spreading the disease.

Forestry Commission Wales met with the rally organisers, Port Talbot Motor Club, last week to try to identify an alternative route away from the woodlands affected by *P. ramorum*.

As the organisers were not able to find roads in the area that meet the standard required for the 2010 MSA Gravel Rally Championship that the rally forms part of, they have taken the decision to postpone the event.

Forestry Commission Wales District Forest Manager Dai Jones said, ***"We are treating the outbreak of Phytophthora ramorum in South Wales very seriously and we are determined to minimise the impacts of this disease on woodlands. We are disappointed that the Pro-Art Signs Swansea Bay Rally has been postponed but the risk of allowing a large number of cars to travel between areas that are infected by this serious tree disease, and those that are not, is too great. We hoped that, by working with the rally organisers, we could identify an alternative route but, as this has not been possible at this time, we look forward to welcoming the event back in future."***

P. ramorum is a fungus-like pathogen that kills many of the trees that it infects. It was found on Japanese larch trees in South West England last year, and in woodland managed by Forestry Commission Wales on behalf of the Welsh Assembly Government in the Afan Valley, near Port Talbot, Dulais Valley near Crynant and Garw Valley, near Bridgend in June. The outbreak in South Wales is the first time *P. ramorum* has been found on Japanese larch trees outside of South West England.

However, the situation is changing rapidly as surveys are undertaken and it is likely that the infection has spread more widely. Forestry Commission Wales is holding discussions with other rally organisers to consider options for the events that are due to take place later this year.

The public woodlands remain open and signs at forest entrances ask visitors to observe some simple bio security precautions to minimise the spread of infection.

Ferrari drivers defend actions

Ferrari drivers Fernando Alonso and Felipe Massa both claimed to be team players after the furor of their contrived one-two finish in Sunday's German Grand Prix.

The duo had faced a grilling from the media in the post-race press conference. Massa claimed the decision to allow Alonso by was made of his own volition, and nothing to do with a seemingly coded radio message from his race engineer Rob Smedley.

"I'm very professional and I've showed throughout my career how professional I am," said Massa. "You are professional as well, you work for a company. I believe you are doing what you have to do, so I'm professional and here I showed how professional I am. That's it." The two drivers had already departed Hockenheim when the race stewards hit Ferrari with a 100,000 US dollar (£64,800) fine for implementing team orders, which are outlawed under F1 rules. The matter has also been referred to the World Motor Sport Council and may yet result in further sanctions being imposed.

"Okay, so, Fernando is faster than you," Smedley said on lap 47, which led to Massa opening the door for Alonso to pass two laps later when he slowed out of the hairpin. Smedley then told Massa: "Good lad. Just stick with it now. Sorry."

It all smacked of the 2002 Austrian Grand Prix when Ferrari ordered Rubens Barrichello to let Michael Schumacher pass for him to claim the win. It is a decision Barrichello regrets to this day as it tarnished his reputation among the Brazilian public, but Massa refuted suggestions the same could happen to him.

Massa added: "Absolutely not. For sure, you always want to win. That's always what we're working for. We don't have team orders, so you just need to do the race that you can and if you cannot do that you need to think about the team. I think that's the most important thing." As for Alonso, he was asked whether he felt embarrassed to claim such a win, whether it was a "dirty" victory, and if it was "up there" with his triumph in the 2008 Singapore Grand Prix that was later overshadowed by the 'crash-gate' scandal.

The double world champion refused to bite on any of the questions, instead at one point responding: "We tried to do our race, as good as we can. We are professional drivers, we try to work in a team and to do the best we can every day. We had a strong Sunday with a strong result. I think we are happy with this."



Kankkunen eyes top 10 on return

Four-time World Rally champion Juha Kankkunen has confirmed he will make a one-off return with Stobart Ford in Finland - and is eyeing a battle with Kimi Raikkonen. Making his first World Rally Championship start in almost eight years, Kankkunen will drive a Stobart VK M-Sport Ford Focus RS WRC in Jyvaskyla next week, teaming up with his former co-driver Juha Repo. The 51-year-old has set his sights on a top 10 finish. "It's going to be great to drive again and I'm very excited to attend the jubilee event as a part of the Stobart M-Sport Ford Rally Team," said Kankkunen. "It is also a fantastic opportunity to enjoy a World Rally Car, especially after knowing they'll disappear from the series after this season." "I haven't spent much time in the latest generation cars and I know there's been a lot of changes, but I don't foresee any undue surprises. My target is a place in the top 10 and to battle with Kimi Raikkonen. Juha [Repo] last competed in this rally in 2003 where he finished 11th so he also eager to finish inside the top 10." Ford team boss Malcolm Wilson reckons Kankkunen will be one of the biggest draws on the event. "He is an idol to thousands in the rallying world and it is fantastic news that he will be joining the team in Finland next week," said Wilson. Goodwood Festival of Speed 2010

The Festival of Speed is an event that has always been on our list of things to go and see but have never got round to doing for various reasons. This year was different!

Simon Wallis who I have been doing some of the historic stage events with has been building a Mk1 Lotus Cortina since selling his Escort after the engine blew up on consecutive rallies approx 200 yards apart in the same forest. As with all things this has turned to be a bigger job taking much longer. A rolling shell was purchased from Ireland with the intention of buying an engine to drop in and off we go. No such luck, no suitable engine could be found so plan B was to get one built but again finding the parts took time as did the build. In the meantime he started work on the shell and the more he did the more he found needed doing and we began to wonder how anyone had ever rallied the car. Finding parts for the Cortina is a lot more difficult than an Escort and time moved on. Many events we planned to do came and went.

However just when we were beginning to wonder if we would do a rally this year inspiration came to finish the job in the form of an invite to compete at the Festival of Speed the first weekend in July. They were looking for older rally cars to take part in the Birth of Stage Rallying class. Simon was invited to take the Cortina and Ian Beveridge, who I did the Red Kite Stages with, his Volvo PV544.

Like me Simon had always been going to go to Goodwood but had never got there so we jumped at the chance. If nothing else we got free tickets for the weekend which normally cost £107. It would also give us an opportunity to test the car before we actually entered a rally.

A few logistics were overcome in that we were on holiday in Cornwall the week before and Simon was going to France to the Le Mans Classic on the Sunday night with his family.

The event is held on Friday Saturday and Sunday and all cars have to be in place on the Thursday so Simon took the car down on Wednesday with Al our service crew followed by his family and we drove across from Cornwall on Friday.

The format was three runs each morning and afternoon but you could miss one session if you wished to have look round the rest of the event. There was a lot to see.

It is primarily a racing event but on the rally stage other cars included Fiat 131s, Lancia Fulvia, Delta S4, 037 and Stratos. Peugeot 205 T16, half a dozen Audi Quattros including the Pikes Peak from the Audi museum, as well as Mantas, Minis, Escorts, Sunbeam, Chevette, RS200s, TR8 etc most of them with history. Drivers included Rauno Aaltonen, Paddy Hopkirk, Bjorn Waldegard, Markko Martin Jean Ragnotti and Miki Biasion with James Martin the chef for the ladies. Modern cars and drivers include Chris Meeke with his Peugeot, Freddy Lox in the Skoda S2000 and Ken Block in the Focus WRC. The main Ford and Citroen teams were missing as they were on their way to Bulgaria.

On the Friday we nudged a bank and bent the suspension and steering so missed a couple of runs sorting this and got a best time of 2 mins 54 secs. There is a lot more going on the actual hill with runs from many of the Formula One teams again either with modern cars or ones with history and cars from just about every racing type and era. Mark Webber won the prize for the best donuts with 3 one way and 4 the other all in the car's own length. Then there are motor bikes as well and with competitor's passes we could get up very close as the holding paddock at the top of the hill is next to the stage start and finish. Then there is the social side a big dinner on Saturday night and whilst we were competing on the Sunday afternoon Carol was down on the lawn at a champagne reception talking to Stirling Moss, Murray Walker and Lewis Hamilton. She also convinced a young motor bike racer to pose for a picture with her.

The opportunity to test the car was proving useful as the master cable started to short out on the second run on Saturday much better to find this out than in the middle of Dalby! This was easily fixed but later problems with the starter motor meant a strip down (must find a spare) and a few mixed runs. We didn't manage to improve our time as the course started to cut up. Sunday was a bit cooler the first two days had been glorious and we got the three runs in before lunch getting our time down to 2 mins 51 secs . Lunch time included a flight past by the Vulcan which was great to see, The Red Arrows had been performing on Friday and Saturday. After lunch I called it a day and let Al have a ride in the car rather than lying underneath it. All in all it was a fantastic weekend end and I can recommend it for anyone no matter what your interest in motor sport is. After all it's not often you are in the queue for a stage start with Markko Martin in front of you in Carlos Sainz's Impreza L555REP and Miki Biasion behind you in a Stratos.
