Richard Jackson took his ex-works Imp to the Loton Park hillclimb but blew it's engine on the way there! Then, as if that wasn't enough it holed it's sump just prior to the subsequent Harewood event (one wonders what he must have run over, or what came out from inside !!!). All this travelling was doing wonders for spreading the Trackrod name! Having held a few events there was the first round-up of Trophy Points with Steve Lloyd leading Allrounders; Ken Goodall the Rally Drivers; Jonathon Solk the PCT's ; Richard Ashcroft the Navigators and the Autotests shared between Alex Jackson, Peter Gledhill and R. Ineson.

Wales Rally GB

For 2011, Wales Rally GB returns to North Wales and starts half a day earlier than for the past few years. With a mid afternoon start from Llandudno on Thursday 10th November, the competitors first negotiate two short blasts around the infamous Great Orme stage. From there the cars make their way out to Clocaenog Forest, near Ruthin, where they will tackle the only forest stage of the day. The crews then head back to the coast for a remote service and over-night halt back in Llandudno before heading down to Dyfi forest the following day.

Not used at WRC level since 1996, the World's best crews will once again tackle the stage on which Colin McRae was crowned World Champion back in 1995 after his epic battle with Carlos Sainz. Starting shortly after 4 pm, the Clocaenog stage will run in the dark leading to an electric atmosphere as spotlights arc through the night sky, performance engines reverberate across the hillsides and the cars "dance" past at breathtaking speeds showering sparks and spitting flame as they depart.

Buccaneer Motor Sports Club is proud to have been asked to run the Clocaenog stage. As with any rally stage, in order to run it safely and successfully we will need the help from many volunteers. If you would like to assist with running this iconic stage we would be very pleased to hear from you. Whether you will be with a group of friends or on your own, are an experienced marshal or novice, you will be welcomed all the same.

New Ford rally cars launched

M-Sport revealed two new Ford Fiesta rally cars on Thursday, completing a five-stage ladder from national rallying to the World Rally Championship. The British firm, which designs, builds and runs the Fiesta RS WRC on behalf of Ford in the World Rally Championship, revealed a Fiesta RRC (Regional Rally Car) which fits in with regulations for the FIA's Regional Rally Championships in Europe, Africa, the Middle-East and Asia-Pacific. It also unveiled the Fiesta MS1, an entry-level car running with the same 1.6-litre Zetec engine as the R2 car, but with a production specification engine and gearbox. It will fit into the FIA's R1 class. The Fiesta RRC draws heavily on the design and technology in the World Rally Car, which scored a debut win in Sweden this year. The major differences are that the RRC uses a 300mm turbo restrictor rather than 33mm for the WRC - meaning it has less power. The RRC also uses a slightly different rear spoiler. The car can, however, be converted to World Rally Car specification in under six hours. M-Sport managing director Malcolm Wilson said: "We are delighted to introduce the new Ford Fiesta RRC and the Ford Fiesta MS1 as both cars offer competitors more flexibility to help further their rallying career. "M-Sport has been looking to expand the range of rally cars available to our customers and the latest additions have allowed us to provide two extra rungs to Ford's ladder of opportunity. The Fiesta MS1 offers drivers an introduction to rallying at an affordable level whereas the Fiesta RRC/WRC provides experienced drivers with the highest level of rally car but also includes the necessary components to convert it into a regional rally car. "I look forward to revealing our new cars to the world rallying scene and to monitoring their performance in regional championships across the globe."

Mini cancels Estonia entry

The Mini World Rally Team has withdrawn its entry from this week-end's Rally Estonia after it was found there was more damage to the test car than originally thought following Kris Meeke's accident earlier this week. Meeke had damaged the left-hand side of the WRC test car when he clouted a rock on Monday. The team re-prepared the car in time for the former Intercontinental Rally Challenge winner to return to the wheel later that day - and for his team-mate Dani Sordo to complete two further days of running - but it will not start in Estonia. David Lapworth, technical director of Prodrive - which runs the Mini squad - said: "The team did a great job and we got a lot of testing done this week, but the car's not really pretty enough for us to send it to the start of an event. "Kris found what appears to be Ayers Rock and the impact took the wheels off and damaged the sill on the left side of the car. While we were perfectly happy to get the car running again for the test, we wouldn't want to send it on an event like that [Estonia]. Lapworth added that the team's hectic schedule meant that it made sense to can the Northern Irishman's second competitive start. "Don't forget, we're a small team," he said. "The same guys who are out on the test in Finland have to come back and prepare the [Rally] Finland event cars and build more, plus we've got to get the test car ready for more testing next week. We had to draw a line somewhere and say, 'Enough's enough', and we've done that. Unfortunately it means we won't go to Estonia." Despite missing the event, Meeke still managed to secure time in the car on three different test roads. "We ran Kris on the same road Dani was using when Dani came out of the car," added Lapworth. "One night we were running until 10pm, so we've certainly got through the kilometres with Kris." The two drivers completed more than 450 miles of testing in the three days. Meeke said: "Obviously I'm disappointed to be missing out on competitive event mileage before Rally Finland, but it's the team's decision." Rally Estonia - a traditional warm-up event for the WRC's Rally Finland - has drawn some big names, with five-time world rally winner Markko Martin leading the field away in a 2003-specification Ford Focus. Rally Sweden runner-up Mads Ostberg starts close behind in his Fiesta RS WRC. Rally Estonia starts from Otepää tomorrow afternoon and finishes on Saturday evening after nine stages and 100 miles.

Loeb frustrated by team tactics

Sebastien Loeb has admitted he was frustrated with Citroen's handling of his battle with team-mate Sebastien Ogier on the Acropolis Rally. After five years of superiority over previous team-mate Dani Sordo, Loeb has equal number one status with Ogier at Citroen this year and is fighting both his team-mate and Ford's Mikko Hirvonen for the title. In Greece last weekend, Ogier and Loeb moved into first and second on Saturday, but Ogier then backed off on the final stage of the day to put Loeb ahead and ensure the reigning champion ran first on the road for Sunday. Ogier was then able to take advantage of better stage conditions to retake the lead and claim victory. Asked if he was frustrated that his team-mate had been able to use slowing tactics against him, Loeb replied: "I was, [on Saturday] evening. I knew it would be some tactics and I knew it would be no issue for me." Finally, there were no split times [from Ogier] in the last stage. With no splits, the team give him the target time. "So I asked: 'Why do you give him the benefit and not me?' They knew he wouldn't get his five seconds - he wanted 20 to stay ahead." At that moment, I was frustrated; I didn't want to clean the road just in front of him. When you see the team playing tactics nearly against me..." But Loeb admitted that the team had agreed both drivers could use tactics as they wished, even if it meant compromising their team-mate. "It's what we agreed before," he said. "If I had been in the position, it would have been the same for me. We know it's the rule." For me, it's no team orders; each driver plays his tactics when he wants. If you lead the championship you cannot do it, but if you are behind you have the cards and it is okay. He has done it right." Citroen boss Olivier Quesnel said the team was committed to giving Loeb and Ogier equal opportunities, and that the situation only unfolded as it had on Saturday night because Loeb had been ahead of Ogier in the running order so the latter could judge his pace compared to his team-mate's. "The drivers are equal number one so they know they can push," said Quesnel. "What we did for Sebastien Ogier, we would have done exactly the same for Sebastien Loeb. They know the car is the same. We want this to be transparent for everybody, the media and the fans." Ogier's victory in Greece brought him to within five points of second-placed Hirvonen in the standings - but he said catching the Ford driver was of little consequence as his sights were firmly set on leader Loeb, he is 22 points ahead of him. "It's looking, not good, but not so bad. It's better than before we started," said Ogier. "We are 22 behind Seb. Yes, we are closer to Mikko, but Mikko is not the target. We will continue to put the pressure on them." This week's AUTOSPORT magazine - available in shops and in digital form from Thursday 23 June - contains an in-depth analysis of the intra-team tension at Citroen and Loeb's frustration with the situation.

Mike Coughlan joins Williams F1

But.....

The Williams Formula 1 team says it has not received any notice of legal action against it or new chief engineer Mike Coughlan by NASCAR team Michael Waltrip Racing. Coughlan had previously been employed by Waltrip as director of vehicle design, and court documents seen by AUTOSPORT showed that Waltrip was alleging Coughlan had breached his contract by leaving to return to F1 with Williams. A Williams spokesperson said: "Williams F1 is aware of reports that a lawsuit has been filed by Michael Waltrip Racing against the team and Mike Coughlan." "Neither Mike nor the team have received notice of any proceedings, or indeed have had any contact with Michael Waltrip Racing since early June." "Consequently we have no further comment to make on this matter."



Button has faith in McLaren form

Jenson Button is hopeful that McLaren has not lost too much ground compared to main rivals Red Bull Racing and Ferrari in recent races, as he eyes a return to the podium in next weekend's German Grand Prix. McLaren has endured difficult weekends in Valencia and Silverstone, with both drivers and team management all but admitting that their title hopes are over for the year. However, that has not stopped the team setting its sights on star performances in individual races - with Button hoping the Nurburgring will help provide a good opportunity. "Perhaps we've lost a bit of the momentum we'd built up in previous races, but not much," he said. "Although Silverstone was disappointing, our pace has been good this year. Sometimes we've been quickest, sometimes we haven't." Team principal Martin Whitmarsh is happy that the ban on the off-throttle use of blown diffusers has been lifted, as it hurt the outfit's performance at Silverstone, as he eyes a step forward in form this time out. "There has been a degree of uncertainty in recent weeks, with new restrictions placed on off-throttle exhaust blowing, and our entire team has demonstrated enormous passion and commitment as they come to terms with those challenges," explained Whitmarsh. "We missed an opportunity for a podium finish at Silverstone, and that race was a reminder that while we are always pushing to make our car even more competitive, our rivals are doing likewise with their own machinery.

Steel to run turbo BMW

British Touring Car squad Geoff Steel Racing is close to hitting the track with the first turbocharged BMW to run in the series. GSR started the season with a normally-aspirated 320si for Dave Newsham. But the pace of the turbo cars in the series led to Newsham joining the Special Tuning Racing turbo SEAT squad after Donington Park in April. GSR temporarily pulled out of the BTCC, but is now close to finishing converting its second chassis to turbo spec. Steel, who would not confirm the engine supplier, said: "We've got the engine and gearbox and I'm very pleased with the way things are going so far. We're hoping to shake it down in the next couple of weeks. "The hope is to get it sorted over the summer and get it out [to race] before the end of the season." Steel said he had yet to confirm a driver for the race seat and ruled out running more than one car for the time being. "It's a tricky thing because they've been letting the NA cars get closer," he added. "But the writing is on the wall. We want to have a turbo ready for next season."
